





THOUGHTS BY REV KEV

Sunday before Lent

The Lenten Season of praying and journey of our personal conversion begins with the outward signing of the cross of ashes on Wednesday. We are each invited to "Turn away from Sin and be faithful to the Gospel." We will hear the prophet Joel writing for each of us to "Rend our Hearts" by opening our hearts and eyes to those in need, becoming aware of our energy to be compassionate. Through the grace of God may we find the infinite love of our Merciful Father as we listen to His only Son Jesus as he clearly invites us to embraced the discipline for Lent - Prayer, Almsgiving and Fasting.

The ashes used on our forehead began as the palms that helped us welcome the triumphant entrance of Jesus into Jerusalem where he would make the ultimate sacrifice on the cross. As symbols of triumph on that Palm Sunday have now become reminders of death, let these ashes inspire us to repent for our sins. Secondly, let these ashes remind us that death is not an end as we find the hope in God's promise of new life through the Passion. Death and Resurrection of Jesus.

Greetings from: Fr. Joe

Are you ready yet? This week we begin the holy season of Lent. The season is marked by a special penitential character to help us "await the sacred paschal feasts with the joy of minds made pure." Our liturgy too takes on a special character that make us "more eagerly intent on prayer and on the works of charity." For it is by "participating in the mysteries by which [we] have been reborn, [we] may be led to the fullness of grace that [God] bestows on [his] sons and daughters." (Quotes from the first Preface of Lent, *Roman Missal*)

As explained in the article from our parish Music Ministry Team in this week's bulletin, there will be some noticeable changes to our communal celebration of Holy Mass. I would like to bring your attention to some physical changes that will take place at our Donora site. Beginning Ash Wednesday, the Presider's and Deacons' chairs will be moved to the opposite side of the sanctuary. Currently on the side of both the ambo and Tabernacle, this change is being made for the following reasons:

The Eucharist, first and foremost. Given the Tabernacle is a prominent feature in the sanctuary, this change gives the clergy and the congregation a fuller view of the altar, ambo and Tabernacle, all signs of Christ's presence in the liturgy.

Consistency for our liturgical ministers. We would like to hold a consistent form for our altar servers, Extraordinary ministers, and lectors. This switch allows for our ministers to serve consistently throughout the three sanctuaries in our parish.

Liturgical form. In more solemn celebration where a procession for the Gospel could take place, with the use of incense and candles, this change allows for more fluid movement from the Presider's chair to the ambo.

As we continue to grow and form our identity as one, unite parish under St. Andrew our patron, your clergy team hopes these small changes will foster a visible sign of where God's Holy Spirit is leading us as the Body of Christ.

With the Season of Lent upon us, St. Andrew's Parish wants to enter this time with the Lord in a spirit of prayerful reflection and reverence. During Lent, St. Andrew's Music Ministry will help us mark the special character of this season during the celebration of Mass. Beginning on the First Sunday of Lent, you may notice there are small shifts made to the music settings that support our worship. These seasonal changes are meant to bring about an introspective and penitent atmosphere. Here are some ways you may experience these shifts:

- The Kyrie (Lord, have mercy) will be chanted by the Celebrant or cantor and the congregation responds in kind with chant.
- The Gloria is omitted during the days in Lent but will return on Holy Thursday and during the Easter Season
- The Mass parts (Holy, Holy, Memorial Acclamation, Great Amen, Lamb of God) will change to a simple chant Mass. The Mass parts will continue to be accompanied by the organist to support congregational singing.
- However, the Great Amen is not accompanied; the Celebrant will chant the Doxology (Through him, with him, and in him...") and the congregation will respond with a simple "Amen" led by the cantor.
- Lastly, once the closing hymn is finished, the organist will not play a postlude (instrumental music after the closing hymn) to foster a quiet and reflective atmosphere for prayer and meditation following Mass.

We hope these simple changes will help lead everyone to experience Lent with a renewed intentionality and a focus on returning to the Lord with one's whole heart. God Bless! St. Andrew's Music Ministry team

The COLOR'S of Lent

This year, as has been out tradition at Saint Andrews, beginning on Ash Wednesday we'll have available the pocket crosses. There will be the different color crosses along with plain wood. The color of the cross you select may help you reflect on certain areas in your life, or opportunities that God brings you to focus on during your Lenten Journey. The meaning of the colors are as follows:

Red – The Blood Jesus shed for our sins, offering Salvation to all: 1 John 1:7-9

Orange – Represents Fire, for our God is an all-consuming God: Hebrews 12:29

Yellow – Represents the Light of God, in Him there is no Darkness: 1 John 1:5-7

Green – Represents eternal life in Jesus: John 3:16

Blue – Represents the Living Water: John 4:14

Purple – Represents the Royalty of the King of Kings and the Crown of Life: James 1:12

Wooden – Represents the Weight of the Cross, the weight of our sins: Romans 3:23

Seminarian Thoughts

Saint Walburga

Feast Day: February 25

Patronage: Eichstatt, Germany, Benedictine Nuns, Sick

Born in England as the daughter of St. Richard the Pilgrim and St. Wuna of Wessex, niece of St. Boniface, St. Walburga had two older brothers Winibald and Willibald who were also saints! Her father was a saxon underking. When she was 11, her father and brothers set out on a pilgrimage to Rome. Before leaving St. Richard entrusted her to the Benedictine abbess of Wimborne Abbey where she would be cared for and educated. After being there about a year, Walburga received word that her father had died. Her brothers completed the pilgrimage but both became incredibly ill. After recovering Winibald stayed in Rome for further studies while Willibald went on pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Eventually Willibald returned to Rome where he became a monk of Monte Cassino (the 1st Benedictine monastery, established by Benedict himself) and Winibald joined him. All the while Walburga is being taught and formed by the Benedictine nuns, and eventually took vows. In 737 her uncle St. Boniface went to Rome to recruit his nephews to assist him in evangelizing Germany which was still pagan. With the help of St. Boniface, her brothers founded a double monastery (both men and women). Walburga traveled to see her brothers and joined the monastic foundation there. When her brother died in 760 Walburga was named his successor becoming abbess. Walburga died in 777 after being abbess of the double monastery for 17 years. In 870 her remains were moved to Eichstatt, Bavaria where she rests today. Many miracles have been attributed to St. Walburga. Since her death a mysterious oil has dripped from her tomb, and it is known for its healing power. Because of this she is often depicted as an abbess with a vial of oil. At St. Emma's monastery there is a beautiful stained glass shrine dedicated to this saint. The nuns at St. Emma's came to St. Vincent in 1931 from Eichstatt on February 25, St. Walburga's day and have a deep devotion to the saint who many, many years ago would have been their abbess.

FROM THE OFFICE OF THE BISHOP

As we continue to find our way through the challenges and the frustrations of the COVID-19 pandemic. I write today to make you aware of updates to our diocesan policy that are to be implemented in our parishes and our schools.

The number of new cases of COVID has been steadily dropping in our area, and positive cases have declined in diocesan parishes and schools. Waiting until the end of February to implement these changes allows time for cases to decline further, for hospital staffing levels to improve, and for more people to receive vaccinations.

As the dynamics continue to change given new information about the virus, we are now in a position to take preliminary steps to ease COVID restrictions in parishes and schools while remaining committed to protecting everyone's health and safety. I know that some of you will be pleased with this news, and others will be concerned about how to talk with parishioners or school families who continue to push for increased mandates. The Holy Spirit can and will fill us with the words and the wisdom needed to offer peace, calm, and support for the faithful.

Please note the following update on COVID protocols for our parishes and schools will be effective on Saturday, February 26.

- Priests, deacons and liturgical ministers in the sanctuary as well as ushers and greeters will no longer be obligated to wear masks at Mass.
- Parishioners will again be invited to share the Sign of Peace.
- Laity can present the gifts of bread and wine used for consecration.
- The distribution of Precious Blood from the cup remains suspended at this time.
- All parish events outside of Mass may be held in-person. Livestream options for Mass and activities will continue for those who are unable to attend in person.

This update applies to all clergy and parishioners during Mass and other parish activities, to all students and staff in diocesan elementary schools and high schools, and to everyone involved in diocesan faith formation programs.

As always, if the number of positive cases surges in a specific county—or within a specific parish or school—mitigation measures, including mandatory masking, may be reinstated.

I continue to urge everyone who is eligible to get COVID vaccines and booster shots as an act of love for all people, especially the most vulnerable.

Family Connection

Gather as a family and spend some time discussing ideas about what it means to be a good disciple. What do we need to learn? How are we to act? How do we treat others? Read aloud today's Gospel, Luke 6:39–45. Discuss what Jesus means when he asks, "Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own?" Talk about how we might be tempted to focus on one another's shortcomings without noticing our own and how this might lead to conflict. Point out that part of being a good disciple is focusing on our own behavior. As a family, share ideas for responding as a disciple when you are upset with another family member's words or actions. (For example, taking a cooling off break before talking to the person or praying for help to see if our actions contributed to the conflict and we need to apologize.) Pray that you will grow together in your discipleship and then pray the Lord's Prayer.
