PARISH LIFE

FROM THE PASTOR

On this feast of Corpus Christi, we are invited to recall that the Mass is where we come together around the Lord's table to do what Jesus asked us to do in memory of him. We talk about the mass as a memorial banquet, it connects us to the events of the Last Supper and the sacrifice of Good Friday, which brings the promise of the Easter resurrection and new life. At Mass, our memorial banquet connects us in a real way to the saving events of Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection, which calls forth our participation in a spirit of thanksgiving for the many blessings that God has given us. We are called into this mystery of God's love and nourishment by the body and blood of Christ as food for the journey of life. The Mass sends us out to create active memories of God's love as it is present in our world today.

As we think about these times, there are also the daily opportunities to make memories as an expression of our thanksgiving for the ways we have all been blessed. This might include summer gatherings of friends for an evening barbecue, or time spent with family at a lake camping, or fishing. These are opportunities to create good memories that reflect something of the presence of God with us in our journey of life, and for each of us to live out our baptismal calling of being instruments of God's love, and peace to one another and our world. We also can't lose sight of the daily opportunities to create memories within our communities as we express something of God's care and compassion for our neighbors, and work together toward justice and the common good of our society.

With all the activities in June and the summer season ahead, we can't forget

the Sunday Mass as a time and place of memory that connects us to one another and to God's love as a vine to the branches. At mass we recall God's presence with us in our past, God's presence with us now, and the promise of God's presence with us in the new life to come.

It's no accident that the loss of faith in the real presence goes hand in hand with the alienation of the contemporary man from his human embodiment. Taking seriously that *even God* wanted to be a part of our enfleshed humanity, the central love theme that starts at Christmas, and runs through his true physical suffering in the Paschal Triduum, and continues in transfigured human flesh at Easter and is taken into heaven through this very moment that concludes with us by the Body, Soul, Divinity, Humanity, and in the Eucharist where we again join him as a communion of people.

So, while June celebrates many different themes, they come together under the rubric of life giving love. It's that love that's embodied in the Sacred Heart, in the Trinity, in the Eucharist, in marriage, and parenthood.


Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end.



Do you know why Catholics start their prayers with the sign of the cross? When you begin your prayers, do you cross yourself with reverence? Or do you often just mindlessly make the sign of the cross without considering its significance? Catholics, especially cradle Catholics, learn how to make the sign of the cross from very early on in life, but we aren't necessarily taught *why*. By the time we reach the age of reason, the gesture is ingrained in us but we aren't fully cognizant of all that goes into this symbolic action.

The sign of the cross finds its roots in the earliest centuries of the church and is used today by millions of Christians worldwide. But, it is all too easy to make this sign in a routine and in a superficial way at the beginning and end of a prayer, failing to recognize its true significance. Learn more about it with Ghezzi's inspiring book, *The Sign of the Cross*, and develop the habit of signing yourself with greater reverence and faith.




The Donora Knights of Columbus wish to thank all who attended their recent bingo, as well as the individuals who worked so hard to make this endeavor a success.

The Solemnity of Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is celebrated Friday, June 7. It is always celebrated during the octave of Corpus Christi or 19 days after Pentecost Sunday. The Sacred Heart of Jesus represents his divine love for humanity, demonstrated most tangibly by the sacrifice of his life for our sins.

Over the past few weeks, we have published our Purpose and Vision for Saint Andrew Parish. I would invite everyone to take a moment and read our three Priorities and the goals to achieve these priorities!



First Priority Improve parish communication

Goal 1

Grow group attendance at liturgies, small groups, and parish-wide events by 20% from 2023 to 2026.

Goal 2

Increase PDS data (individual's mobile number and email) by 25% each year from 2024 to 2026.



Third Priority

Welcome all to share their time, talent, and treasure in current and new volunteer opportunities.

Goal 1

Add 50 new volunteers in total for all ministries and fundraising events by Advent 2026.

Goal 2

At least one person in each ministry or event who is a new volunteer each year should make the volunteer commitment based on a personal invitation.



Second Priority

Develop and implement additional Catholic Faith formation opportunities for all ages, so people can become better disciples of Christ.

Goal 1

Grow current and inactive parishioners' spiritual life, so that the number of active parishioners grows by 10% from 2023 to 2026.




FAITH FORMATION

Family Connection

In the beginning of today's Gospel, Jesus instructs his disciples to make preparations for the Passover meal. Like most meals, the Passover meal required planning and preparation. Our celebration of the Sunday Eucharist also requires planning and preparation. Certainly the ministers at the Eucharist prepare for their roles: the person presiding prays and prepares the homily; the prayers of petition are written; the music ministers prayerfully select music and practice it before Mass; Eucharistic ministers, lectors and altar servers prepare carefully for their roles. As the worshiping assembly, we can also prepare for the Mass through our prayer during the week, by reading the Scripture before Mass, and by making ourselves present to the Eucharistic celebration.

As you gather as a family, talk about some of the things that are required to prepare for your family meals. Plan together a special Sunday meal by choosing the menu, preparing the shopping list, and assigning duties for cooking, setting the table, preparing decorations, leading the prayers, and cleaning. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 14:12-16,22-26. Notice how Jesus instructed his disciples to prepare for their Passover meal. All meals require some kind of planning and preparation; so, too, our Sunday Eucharist requires planning. What might we do as a family to better prepare for our celebration of the Eucharist? Choose one or more ideas to begin to implement together as a family. Pray together that God will help your family make your celebration of the Eucharist the highlight of your week.


