Out of the Gate

In his play *Julius Caesar* William Shakespeare talks about the tragedy of missed opportunities. Act 4 of the play has Caesar say:

*“There is a tide in the affairs of men
Which, be taken at the flood,
Leads on to fortune;
Omitted, all the voyages of their life
Is bound in shallows and in miseries.”*



Like Shakespeare’s quote above, we have been given by the Providence of God, the opportunity for shaping and achieving: unity together, renewed vibrancy in faith, a sense of mission and purpose as one parish to serve one another and others in our surrounding neighborhoods and most of all the glad work of identifying where the Kingdom of God is already in our midst and supporting it wherever we recognize it.

So, what does this monumental step of being one parish really mean? Certainly, all the regular activities even, in the midst, of the pandemic continue: liturgy, formation and catechesis, some small social activities and certainly outreach into the community. At a recent meeting of the Pastoral Council, all the members expressed great concern that one of the first priorities as we move out of the gate is to find better ways of connecting to our parishioners who feel separated from the parish family. We can and will do that as a primary initiative. But again, I ask what else will it mean to be members of a new parish?

To answer the question, I want to refer to one of my favorite quotes from Vatican II when the Council charged all the baptized to renew the Church, ***“In every age, the Church carries the responsibility of reading the signs of the times and of interpreting them in light of the Gospel, if it is to carry out its task.”*** (The Church in the Modern World, paragraph 4).

As a pastor, I have always found the best way to read the signs of the times is the way St. Paulinus of Nola described it centuries ago, *“Let us listen to what all the faithful say, because in every one of them the Spirit of God breathes.”* The answer of what being a new parish really means lies within each of you! Therefore the top priority of the next several months is once again prayerfully, reflectively and respectfully listening to you, collecting all of your ideas and then discerning together our priorities of who we want to be as a new, vibrant and holy parish. I do not know any other way to be a parish. The answer is in our reading together the signs of our time and interpreting them together in the light of the Gospel. What this truly means is up to us all.

Obviously, I will be telling you more about how I plan to invite you into this vision and its accomplishment. I will rely principally on my clergy team, the pastoral staff, pastoral council, and finance council members to lead the way with me. Ultimately, however, how we use the opportunities that God gives us is up to you and me together.

In the meantime, I ask us to enter to deep prayer together. I am very confident, as St. Paul said to the Philippians 2: 6: *“...that, the one who began this good in you will continue to complete it until the day of Christ Jesus.”*

THE MOST PRECIOUS GIFT



The answer is **BAPTISM**. The question: What is the most meaningful **GIFT** you will ever give to your child? Why? In Baptism your child walks through the doorway into the Church, the Body of Christ. In Baptism, your child is welcomed into the Father's house, has original sin removed, and is given access to the other sacraments. Just as God gave your child the gift of **LIFE**, God gives your child the gift of **FAITH** in Baptism. No gift is more meaningful because **FAITH** allows a belief in God, a personal relationship with him, and the hope of eternal life. **WHAT COULD BE BETTER?** From the fifth century to the present, the Church continues the practice of infant baptism. **BUT CIRCUMSTANCES DO OCCUR WHICH PREVENT CHILDREN FROM BEING BAPTIZED AS INFANTS. WHAT TO DO??** If you have a child who was never baptized, don't be discouraged. Rather dedicate yourself to celebrating that child's baptism through a process of formation, the RCIC (RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF CHILDREN). We will meet you in your current circumstances and help you to prepare your child for sacramental life. Additionally, if you have an older child who was baptized, but for some reason, has not yet celebrated the sacraments of Reconciliation (Confession) and Holy Eucharist, once again, don't delay, but consider the RCIC process. Life is filled with invitations. Sometimes these can lead to totally unexpected experiences. The RCIC process offers an invitation to a life united with Christ. 


SEVEN SISTERS APOSTOLATE



PREPARE FOR A HOLY CHRISTMAS

An Advent Small Faith Group – Parishes everywhere are initiating small discussion groups as a key component in effectively revitalizing the faith. Father Joe and Nino Castellano will co-facilitate a **four-week pilot group** this Advent, focusing on the up-coming Sunday Mass Scripture readings. Hopefully our newly established parish will work towards the goal of adding thirty small groups in the first three years. Our first group will consist of 8 members and the facilitators and will meet in person every Monday evening, from 7:00 – 8:30 PM, beginning November 23, 2020. Details of how this group will conduct each evening are available in the bulletin.

An Advent Afternoon of Recollection – Come on the First Sunday of Advent to a reflective mini-retreat from 4:00 – 6:00 PM to assist you towards entering the true spirit of Advent-tide. Father John and Nino Castellano will lead this beautiful spiritual exercise which will include an opening conference, prayer, quiet time, group discussion and sacred music.

Wednesday Evenings of Advent – Advent is a holy time of yearning for the Lord. What yearning truly means in the life of a Christian will be the theme of each Wednesday evening in our parish grouping during Advent. The evening will open with Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Mass and homily delivered by a dynamic visiting priest and a brief reflection immediately following Mass with time for Q and A presented in church by an outstanding lay speaker. Both the priest and the speaker will coordinate their preaching to compliment a consistent theme of yearning.

Prepare your hearts to receive Christ anew this Christmas by praying the **St. Andrew's Chaplet Novena!** This novena begins on November 30th (The Feast of St. Andrew) and ends on Christmas Eve. It consists of praying the following prayer to the infant Christ 15 times each day during the novena. "Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born at midnight in Bethlehem in the piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe I beseech thee O my God to hear my prayer and grant my desires through the merits of our savior Jesus Christ and of his blessed mother."

Lessons and Carols – This lovely pre-Christmas ceremony in the warmth by candlelight remains one of the most popular Advent traditions. Although our wonderful choirs are unable to lead this year (due to COVID restrictions), Father Joe, JR Daniels, Darlene Kiniry, and several of our liturgical readers will conduct this incredibly beautiful service. Three of our own parishioners will offer brief witness talks as part of the Lessons. The favorite Carols of this holy season will be included as instrumentals or solos.

An Interfaith Evening at Rodef Shalom Congregation– There will be a description coming

Please join us for the "**Rorate Caeli**" Mass Friday December 18th at 7am in Sacred Heart Church. This is a special Candlelight Mass in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary traditionally celebrated during the last nine days of Advent. The name comes from the first lines of the introit "Rorate Caeli Desuper" which means "Drop down, you heavens, from above".

Nativity Stations – Back by popular demand ... These Stations reflect upon the beautiful mysteries of the Lord's Incarnation and Birth at Bethlehem, providing the faithful with moving meditations explaining why Jesus was sent as Savior of the world.

Advent Study Program – Incarnation is a 4 week Advent Program rediscovering together the true meaning of Christmas.

THE TIME HAS COME...WE NEED YOUR EXTRA HELP!


The mission and ministry of our parish grouping has never been more needed than now. People need hope! Many are suffering, afraid, isolated, bored, and discouraged. Many are out of work or feeling lonely. They need us and the Good News we provide them.

AND YET.... As you can imagine the financial woes caused by COVID-19 have finally caught up to our own parishes. Although we are extremely grateful to everyone regularly contributing to Sunday collections, we want you to understand that our weekend offertory has been drastically devastated overall the past several months that the pandemic continues. You know that attendance at Masses has slowly risen but we still report only 25% of our normal Mass count. (Please remember that only 25 % percent of our overall membership were attending Mass even before COVID, so 25 % of that figure is who we are seeing at Mass now). We know that people are trying to be as generous as they can!

This weekend I must inform all parishioners that we need your extra help, especially as you plan your end of the year giving and your special Christmas gift to our church. Collections have been fluctuating around 30% less than usual (averaging roughly over \$40,000 per month less income than expenses).

We need help from everyone. We want to come out of the pandemic in a position where we can provide our flourishing mission and ministries to our community. Please trust us that we will be good stewards of every donation you give us. If you have any questions about the way we manage and spend the money we collect, always feel free to contact the Business Office or me personally. You have every right to do so.

The generosity of people at Sacred Heart and Saint Raphael has always been a hallmark of our lived faith and a testament to it. Thank you for reading this lengthy appeal. God bless you for your consideration of it.
