

- Exposition And Benediction Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will follow the 8:30 a.m. Mass on March 1, the first Friday of the month. Adoration will continue all morning and conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at 12:10 p.m. The focus of our prayer is the Pope's World Wide Prayer Network Intention for March, 2024: "FOR THE MARTYRS OF OUR DAY, WITNESSES TO CHRIST - Let us pray that those who risk their lives for the Gospel in various parts of the world might imbue the Church with their courage and missionary drive"
- **Rice Bowl** During Lent, we are invited to deepen our relationship and unite our hearts more fully with God and with one another in an intentional way through the Catholic tradition of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. This Lent fast in solidarity with those of our neighbors who are hungry and who struggle to meet basic needs. A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MONTY -

The Lectionary for the Sundays of Lent follows a particular pattern. The first two Sundays focus on events in the life of Jesus — the Temptation (Mark 1:12-15) and the Transfiguration (9:2-10). The third through fifth Sundays in Year B emphasize key moments in salvation history highlighting God's Covenant relationship with His people, Israel. The Sunday Gospel readings recount key covenant-related moments in Jesus' ministry from the Gospel of John: the cleansing of the Temple (John 2:13-25); his nighttime meeting with Nicodemus (John 3:14-21); and his "unless a grain of wheat falls/hour of glory" parable (John 12:20-33). Each passage offers us an invitation for deeper communion with Christ in this Lenten season.

With its twin themes of conversion and Covenant faithfulness, the Scriptures of Lent 2024 guide us to reflect on repentance and the renewal of our baptismal promises on Easter.

In his Lenten message for 2024, Pope Francis writes, "To the extent that this Lent becomes a time of conversion, will an anxious humanity notice a burst of creativity, a flash of new hope? Allow me to repeat what I told the young people whom I met in Lisbon last summer: "Keep seeking and be ready to take risks. At this moment in time, we face enormous risks; we hear the painful plea of so many people. Indeed, we are experiencing a third world war fought piecemeal. Yet let us find the courage to see our world, not as being in its death throes but in a process of giving birth, not at the end but at the beginning of a great new chapter of history. We need courage to think like this" (Address to University Students, 3 August 2023, for World Youth Day). Such is the courage of conversion...For faith and charity take hope, this small child, by the hand. They teach her to walk, and at the same time, she leads them forward."


