

MASS INTENTIONS FOR 2025

Requests for Masses for 2025 are now being accepted. Requests may be made by mail, email and mass request envelopes found in the lobby of the church. Requests are limited to **two (2)** per person you are requesting masses for. For the year following the death of a loved one, we can schedule three additional masses: a birthday or wedding anniversary and the first anniversary of the death. For all other requests only one Saturday/Sunday mass may be scheduled. Masses for the following occasions are not available: "Birthday Memorials", Christmas Eve and Day, Easter Sunday, Mother's Day and Father's Day. Keep in mind that you can remember your loved ones with a mass broadcast on Radio Station AM 1300 and FM 94.1. The suggested donation for a mass is \$10.00. The cost of a radio broadcast is \$45.00.

YEAR END GIFTS TO OUR PARISH - Will you consider a special gift to Immaculate Conception Parish or School? Gifts can be deducted from your 2024 income tax form. Remember—in order for gifts to qualify for 2024, they must:

- Be delivered to the parish office no later than **Noon**, **December 31, 2024** or
- Postmarked December 31, 2024.

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MONTY – Where Do You Place Your Hope?

In his homily on December 8, Deacon Joe Glover offered this observation:

"Many of us are anxious and afraid. We look at the news on TV or on our phones and can be overwhelmed by the difficulties around us. In a divided nation, people continue to wonder what the new administration will do and how it will affect their lives. What challenges will be faced by the poor, the marginalized, the underprivileged, the unemployed? How will those who are looked on as the least of our brothers and sisters fair? The sick, the mentally unstable, the immigrant, the trafficked, the aged?"

His words spoke to my fear, but his focus was on hope:



Where do you place your hope?

In announcing **Jubilee 2025** — **Pilgrims of Hope**, Pope Francis wrote: "We must fan the flame of hope that has been given us and help everyone to gain new strength and certainty by looking to the future with an open spirit, a trusting heart and far-sighted vision."

I place my hope in the words the archangel Gabriel spoke to Mary over 2025 years ago, "...for nothing will be impossible for God" (Luke 1:37).

I place my hope in the words I am privileged to proclaim every Christmas morning, "And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth ... From His fullness we have all received grace upon grace... (John 1:14, 16; Christmas Mass During the Day).

I place my hope in you and your family and in the crucial role you play in our parish mission: Inviting people to Christ ~ Uniting People with Christ ~ Igniting people for Christ. Your faithfulness to Sunday Mass and the sacraments, your generosity to the parish and school, your willingness to volunteer for parish and community organizations and events all enrich my hope.

As we prepare to celebrate the Eucharist on Christmas—and welcome visitors from out of town or other parishes, college students and other young adults—let us fan the flame of hope, gaining new strength from the Eucharist and entrusting our hearts to the Holy Spirit.


