No gift is too small, but please give as generously as you can. A MESSAGE FROM FATHER MONTY – This Sunday was once referred to as Sexagesima Sunday, marking 60 days to Easter. Then, the liturgy had a Lenten feel—purple vestments, changes in the prayers at Mass—well before Ash Wednesday. If you have ever done the math, you know the "Lent = 40 days" formula does not add up! US Catholic online (www.uscatholic.org) offers an explanation: "'The 40 days of Lent' has always been more of a metaphor than a literal count. Over the course of history the season of preparation for Easter Sunday has ranged from one day (in the first century) to 44 (today in the Latin Rite). Officially since 1970, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sunset on Holy Thursday."

DEVOTIONS, *Explained!* Fasting

Fasting was practiced by righteous men and women of the Old Testament and later by Christ himself. It remains an important part of the Christian devotional life today, being most strongly associated with the penitential season of Lent.

THE SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME





The 7th aspect or characteristic of Jubilee 2025 is the **INDULGENCES.** In the Catholic Church, an indulgence is a way to reduce or remove punishment for sin

The Jubilee Indulgence is a concrete manifestation of God's mercy, which goes

beyond and transforms the boundaries of human justice. This treasury of grace entered human history in the witness of Jesus and the saints, and by living in communion with them our hope for our own forgiveness is strengthened and becomes a certainty. The Jubilee indulgence allows us to free our hearts from the weight of sin because the reparation due for our sins is given freely and abundantly.

In practical terms, the experience of God's mercy involves some spiritual acts indicated by the Pope. Those who cannot make the Jubilee pilgrimage due to illness or other circumstances are nonetheless invited to take part in the spiritual movement that accompanies the Jubilee year, offering up the sufferings of their daily lives, and participating in the Eucharistic celebration.
