**SACRAMENTS**

**Sacrament of Reconciliation**

Confessions are heard daily Monday through Friday from 4:30 until 5:00 pm; Saturdays following the 8:00 am Mass and 3:00 until 3:45pm. The sacrament is also available after all the Sunday Masses and by request.

**Sacrament of Baptism**

Please click this link <https://stpetercathedral.com/sacraments/baptism/> to access the planning form at our website. The form will facilitate both the preparation and scheduling of your child's baptismal ceremony. Baptisms are usually held after the 11:00 am Sunday Mass.

**Sacrament of Matrimony**

Following Diocesan guidelines, Catholic parties must contact the Cathedral and have their first meeting with the Priest at least six months before the wedding to allow time for evaluation and sacramental preparation.

**Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick**

Anointing and Holy Communion are available to the elderly and infirm upon request. Families are asked to notify the Rectory to arrange a visit.

**Sacrament of Holy Orders**

Holy Orders is the sacrament through which the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the Church until the end of time. Some men fulfill God's call to holiness by serving as priests or permanent deacons. Men, high school age or older, who feel a call to Holy Orders should contact one of the parish priests.
