SACRAMENTS

Sacrament of Reconciliation

Confessions are heard daily Monday through Friday from 4:30 until 5:00 pm; Saturdays following the 8:00 am Mass and 3:00 until 3:45pm. The sacrament is also available after all the Sunday Masses and by request.

Sacrament of Baptism

Sacrament of Matrimony

Following Diocesan guidelines, Catholic parties must contact the Cathedral and have their first meeting with the Priest at least six months before the wedding to allow time for evaluation and sacramental preparation.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

Anointing and Holy Communion are available to the elderly and infirm upon request. Families are asked to notify the Rectory to arrange a visit.

Sacrament of Holy Orders

Holy Orders is the sacrament through which the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the Church until the end of time. Some men fulfill God's call to holiness by serving as priests or permanent deacons. Men, high school age or older, who feel a call to Holy Orders should contact one of the parish priests.

From the Rector's Desk....

Next Sunday, January 30, Saint Peter Cathedral will be providing food for **Sunday Supper** at the Church of the Covenant. Please see the post in today's bulletin about what is needed for the dinner. Prior to COVID we usually had people sign up in the back of church to provide us with 2 lb. meatloaves, desserts, salads, monetary donations, and prayers, even though we are not signing up, we still need all these items. **I am pleading with you to help in this endeavor.** Any help you can give to this dinner is greatly appreciated.

Thank you very much to everyone who has been scheduling their **Mass intentions online**. It is so easy to do! You can make your \$10.00 donation by using your credit card or by dropping a check in the offertory basket or by mailing it to the office. When you go into the Mass intention program from the parish website you can see the Masses that are already scheduled and those Mass times that are still available. We have many 6:30 am and 8:00 am weekday Masses available. I would encourage you to consider having a Mass said for a deceased relative or friend. As I have said before we are very blessed here at the Cathedral to have four weekday Masses and four opportunities to pray for our deceased relatives and friends. The Finance Office sends word that any parishioner who contributed \$300 or more will be mailed a year-end statement this week. If you do not receive a statement and want one, please call the parish office to request one (814-453-6677).

As you can see work inside the Cathedral is progressing nicely. The next couple weeks will be quite busy here in the Cathedral. Around the second week of February the workers will be in to redo the floors on the 10th St. side of the Cathedral. It will probably take two weeks for them to complete that project. As they are redoing the floors we will probably begin to remove some of the pews on the 9th St. side of the Cathedral. After the floors on the 10th St. side are refinished then the refurbished pews will be put in. We are trying to keep everything moving so we can start putting the scaffolding back up on the 9th St. side. It is going to be tight, but we still think that everything should be completed by Christmas 2022.

Please watch the bulletin in the next few weeks in regards to **weddings here at the Cathedral in 2023**. We are trying to get everything updated so couples who are interested in getting married here at the Cathedral can do a lot of the initial planning online. In the past, couples would call the Cathedral and we would take information down by hand and look at dates with them in the book. In a few weeks we are hoping to have all that online. They will be able to fill out information online, look at dates that are available and then submit their paperwork to me. I will then call them with all the information in front of me and finalize their plans.

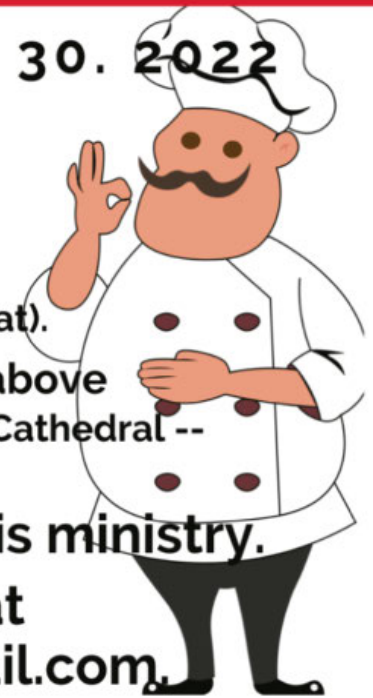

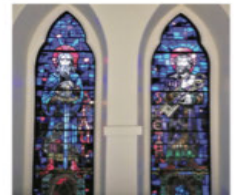
