

From Father George's Desk... Two years ago, at the dawn of this decade, I was celebrating my first Christmastide as pastor of St. Regis. In this space that weekend I wrote hopefully of the year ahead and of our parish assembly that was coming up at the end of the month. Just a few months later, our world was turned upside down by the pandemic. Last year, as we bid farewell to the strange and difficult year of 2020, we looked forward in hope to a time of renewal of life in our families, our community, and our parish in 2021. While we made some strides toward a more normal life over the past twelve months, we are still grappling with illness, death, and disruption caused by covid. Now as we begin 2022, we look forward in hope to continued progress toward "normal". In the life our parish, we give thanks for the many new families who have become part of our parish family and we look forward to growing together in the year to come. We are grateful that we have been able to resume many of the normal activities of our parish's life and we look forward to resurrecting the parish festival this summer as a part of that parish life. We can also be assured that there will be many blessings and challenges in the year ahead that we cannot anticipate today. Through it all the Lord is with us. So for bringing us through the challenges of 2021—and for the blessings, too—let us give thanks to God. And for all that lies ahead as we begin 2022 let us pray that with the Father's providential care, nourished by Christ, and directed by the Holy Spirit we may continue to do the work of the Church: being Christ to one another and building the Kingdom one day at a time.

Today's **Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord** continues our celebration of the Christmas Season. In some cultures Epiphany is observed with even greater fanfare than Christmas as we celebrate the visit of the Magi to the Christ child manifesting the glory of God to the nations. "The [Christmas] season has been moving steadily toward this moment of great revelation and epiphany. Today we acknowledge and celebrate that the child born in a lowly manger in the darkness of night is revealed as the *manifestation* of God (the literal meaning of *Epiphany*). Throughout the liturgies of the season, Christ has been revealed in many ways: as Lord, King; the one in whom God is present and acts. All manifestations of God are "lights" that shine through Christ, illuminating and revealing a deeper understanding of his identity." [2008 Sourcebook for Sundays and Seasons, pp. 58f]



Next Saturday 12 of our young parishioners will be celebrating the **Sacrament of Reconciliation for the very first time**. They are in this year's sacramental preparation program and will be receiving first Holy Communion in the spring. Please keep these young members of our parish family and their families in your prayers this week as they prepare to take the next step on their journeys of faith.

Next weekend's feast of the Baptism of the Lord will bring our celebration of the Christmas Season to a close. 
