Father Brian's Desk

This past summer I had the pleasure of meeting Dominican Friar, Fr. Joseph Martin Hagan, O.P., son of Martin and Sue Hagan, who was home for a while, a priestly vocation from our parish. I am aware of several young men currently expressing an interest in the priesthood from our parish, who have either spoken with priests of our parish or with Father Marlovits, our diocesan Director for the Office of Priestly Formation. Currently as well, we have two seminarians from our parish family: John Kist, a diocesan seminarian, now assigned for his pastoral year at Saint Katherine Drexel Parish in Washington County, and also Brother Matthew Broeren, C.S.S.P, studying for the Spiritan Fathers. Recently I had a chance to catch up with Jonathan at his pastoral assignment, and also Brother Matthew, who is at his family home for a few weeks after completing an assignment in Trinidad, and on his way to a new assignment in Brazil. Since we as parishioners do not often have the opportunity to meet and talk with Brother Matthew, I asked him to write something for our bulletin so that we can appreciate his vocational call, get to know him a bit, and also pray for him and Jonathan, and any other vocations that may be growing in our parish, whether men to the Holy Priesthood, or women to the Consecrated Life.

For those who do not know me, my name is Br. Matthew Broeren CSSp. I am a seminarian with the Congregation of the Holy Spirit (a/k/a Spiritans or Holy Ghost Fathers). We are a missionary congregation, founded in 1703 in Paris. In Pittsburgh, we operate Duquesne University. Our charism is evangelical availability, and our spirituality is described as Practical Union, i.e. attuning oneself to the appearance of God in their everyday experience and work. I have been in formation for about 5 years now and, most recently, was in Trinidad for two years to study theology and do some pastoral work. As with anywhere, Trinidad is different from Pittsburgh. The island is about 7 miles off the coast of Venezuela, is about two and a half times the size of Allegheny County, and has approximately 1 million people. Each island and country in the Caribbean has its own unique history and culture, and Trinidad is no exception to that. Indeed, it is a place with an incredible amount of diversity that, to me, serves as evidence of the dynamism of the inner life of the Trinity in Whose Image we are created.

As may be apparent, I did really enjoy my time there. Granted, it cannot necessarily be limited to one key aspect of the experience, such as people, place, academics, pastoral, etc. It is in its totality, in everything taken together, that I was truly impacted and formed. But, in this whole, what occurred was not my personal attempt to impose a vision of Gospel, march forward with it, and learn what is efficacious. Rather, it is about one's quest for the living God, to seek and to try to find, only to realize that God has equally sought us and continuously finds us. Being welcomed into homes to share meals, celebrating together in the joy of liturgy, listening to and singing local music, and finding time to contemplate creation served as profound signs of God's grace in our midst. If there is anything I learned from the people, it is the important lesson that, in order to evangelize, you must first be evangelized. La Divina Pastora, a local Marian devotion for all religions on the island (especially by Hindus and Catholics, who constitute the two largest religious groupings in Trinidad), teaches us this lesson constantly. Shepherding is not a top-down imposition of authority in a Church building, but a journey where, starting from our current positions, we learn to walk together in love as pilgrims seeking the Kingdom.

However, it was not an easy time by any means. With the economic issues, political divisions, problems since the Coup attempt in 1990, the drug trade, racism, and increasing secularization, Trinidad is by no means the Garden of Eden, and nor is anywhere else. But in moving between the agony and the ecstasy, the tragedy and the victory, one can find a certain amount of joy and life in the Spirit. Both Christmas time and Carnival in Trinidad express this greatly. In the first (Christmas time), we remember God's entrance into the very ebbs and flows in human history and, then, in Old Years' mass, we call for God to bless the new year. By gathering at homes before COVID (and figuring out alternative means of gathering during COVID) and in singing Parang music (Christmas music traditionally sung in Spanish), we learn how the Lord has already been with us and prepare to journey with the Lord of Life once more, despite all the hardships we may face. In the second (Carnival), Archbishop Jason Gordon of Port-of-Spain pointed out that it is a moment given to us to discern a society without division, where celebration can be shared universally. For some days, we put down what we previously thought of one another and can authentically share our joy with one another.

In the missionary call, it is important to recall the words of St. Bernard of Clairvaux: *We drink from our own wells*. For a story for reflection, I can remember one early morning. Just before dawn, I had to let our goats out to graze. Once they had gotten out and were able to be left for the day, I turned and caught the first glimpse of the sunrise on the dew of the grass and on the mountains just to the north of our parish and formation house. Together with the cool breeze and quiet atmosphere of the morning, a moment of contemplation struck me: *This is the land God has made, and how beautiful it is!* In missionary life, it is always necessary to find the experience of God within one's daily life. It is the ultimate source of life, from which the rest of one's life must flow.

Of course, there is one important fact to keep in mind with all of this: *we are all called to be missionaries*. It is not necessarily about going somewhere, carrying a Bible and Catechism wherever you go, or preaching on street corners. In taking up the Apostolic Tradition in our times, we first must let down the barriers we've put up in our communities, our minds, and our souls to allow the God who stands as its source to reach out to us and guide us towards the Kingdom. Only then can we discern what it means to proclaim the Gospel in word and action, gather as a community bound in the Spirit, serve the poorest amongst us with love, and celebrate the liturgy as the summation of our communion and life with God and each another.

For my next phase of formation, I will be moving to São Paulo, Brazil to do full time pastoral work for two years. Please pray for me, for all Spiritans in formation, and for an increase in vocations to the Spiritans (and in general). But, at the same time, do not be afraid to respond to the missionary call yourself. To be the sign and sacrament of the Kingdom, the Church needs everyone to witness to the Good News. Yes, the Spirit will continue to call persons to share the Gospel, but do not be afraid when it is your turn to do so. Nonetheless, it is my hope that we can meet in person one day. But, if not, let us hope that we can meet in the Kingdom to come. Until that time, the community of St. Michael the Archangel will be in my prayers as well.






