Finally, the postlude Canzon duidecimi toni by Giovanni Gabrielli, first performed at St. Mark's in Venice with two brass choirs, has been adapted for brass and organ in a call and response that invites us to respond to the call of Christ and his teachings throughout our lives. SAFE ENVIRONMENT AT SMA
