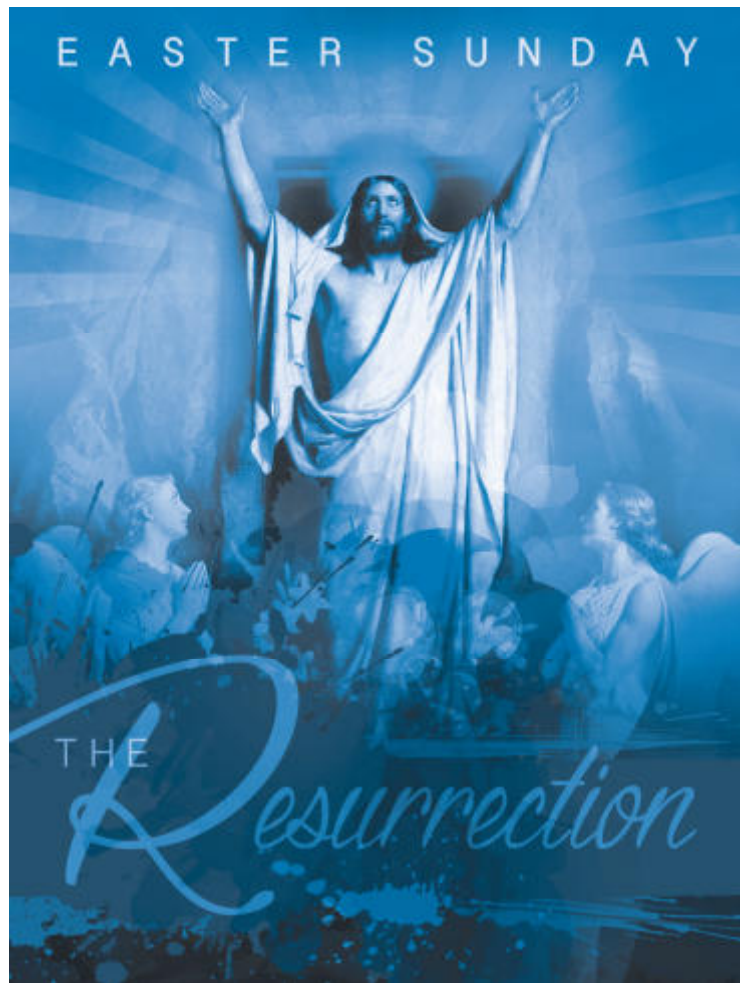

† WORDS FOR THE WEEKRescuer or Redeemer

The single greatest hurdle in our Christian spiritual life may be described as overcoming the assumption that Jesus is the “divine rescuer,” and this is a fortunate mistake. Let me explain.

When we are born, we are received by parents whose nurturing instincts and choices are switched on. They surround their child daily with hundreds expressions of love. The child tends to learn that “the Others” [our parents] are quite reliable in their care of them. They feel secure and happy that their needs are met with such profound affection. Mom and dad are the tour guides through the kingdom of happiness.

As the child grows and begins to walk and talk, they also start to encounter the rough patches of life. They may bump their head by walking into a table or fight with a sibling. As the child continues to grow, the spectrum of joyful and painful experiences expands. They fall off of their bike, encounter the neighborhood bully, and discover that not all dogs are friendly. The parents lovingly clean the physical, emotional, or spiritual wounds, put on the appropriate band-aid and, as much as possible, hug the child back to wholeness. The child learns that their parents and love are a team powerful enough to restore the wounded to the kingdom of the living. Alleluia!

The teen age years usually involve the startling discovery by the teenager that their parents are just big, old humans who are prone to make mistakes, misunderstand, get fat and be short tempered. The all-wise-and-agile teen knows that they’re as smart as their parents. Rarely does the teen quickly grasp that their parent’s love has been the context of their origin. Even so, it is a fortunate mistake that the young adult enters life under a roof different than their parent’s in the belief that “love conquers all.” It has done that so far for them in their life.

With time, the young adult gets older and learns about finitude and contingency. They learn that mortal life comes with an expiration date and that heroic virtue has more to do with the ordinary being done over the long term in a graceful way than in a moment of glory. Champions are not made in a moment, they’re merely recognized there.

All of the preceding is true also of our relationship with God. Before you protest and assert that God is not limited like our parents, remember that God respects the individual’s right to self-determination. God does not withdraw the free will he gives each person. He will let us bail out, bow out, or tune out of the relationship that causes us to be. He will let us turn our back and walk away. Almost invariably, we fight the lesson of love – that God is our Redeemer.

Our insistence that God be our Rescuer instead of redeemer means he cannot be recognized as our Redeemer, the one who has come into the world so that we may have life and have it to the full (John 10: 10). We will likely pout and turn away when God doesn’t seem interested in rescuing us. In this part of God’s Kingdom, redemptive love bridges the entire scope of human experience and makes it eternally meaningful and not just momentarily pleasant as a Rescuer might. Without first making the fortunate mistake (oh, happy fault!) of believing that love rescues, we would not ever grasp that love redeems.

Eternal love is the Easter mystery.  
 Happy Easter. Alleluia!

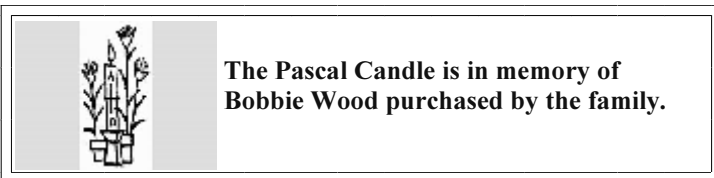

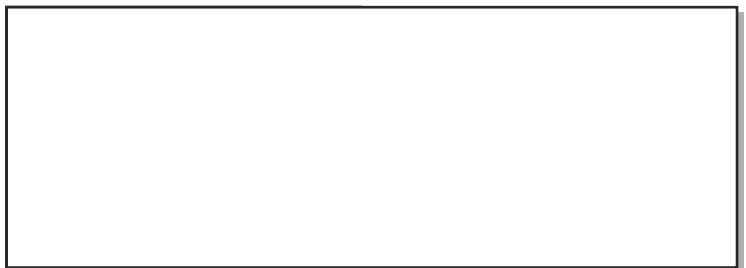
