

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month Throughout the Gospel, Christ calls upon His followers to care for the most vulnerable among us, especially children. Mandated Reporters in the Diocese of Erie are people who hold positions of trust in our schools, parishes, agencies, and institutions and are mandated by Pennsylvania law and the diocesan Policy for the Protection of Children to report suspected abuse of a minor. All employees and volunteers working/serving for the Diocese of Erie, in our parishes, schools, or agencies are mandated reporters, both legally and morally obligated to report any reasonable suspected or known child abuse to ChildLine, the local police, or other appropriate agency. Visit www.eriercd.org/childprotection/ to learn the specific reporting procedures required by the diocese.

Church Hearing Assistance Devices – The church has four devices to help those parishioners who are not able to hear as clearly as they would like, in the church. These earpieces are similar to a single headphone which sits against the outside of the ear. The earpiece is held in place by a hook that goes around/over the top of the ear. It has a volume control that enables the user to set it to his/her particular hearing need and is connected to a receiver by a wire.

If you would like to use one of these devices, you may pick it up in the priest's sacristy before Mass. Following Mass, we ask that you return it to the priest's sacristy so that the piece that goes over the ear may be cleaned and be ready for the next person who would like to use it. These receivers operate on batteries, so be sure to tell someone if the batteries fail during your use of the item.

St. Faustina Kowalska: The Apostle of Divine Mercy - St. Faustina was a Polish nun who received mystical revelations in which Jesus showed her his heart, *the source of mercy*, and expressed his wish that this feast was celebrated. Therefore, she was known as the messenger of Divine Mercy.

Pope Saint John Paul II was very passionate about the mission of revealing the mercy of Jesus to the world. In the year 2000, at the canonization Mass for St. Faustina, he announced that the Second Sunday of Easter would now be known as **Divine Mercy Sunday**. It must be made clear that this was not done in order to establish a way of honoring St. Faustina, but to emphasize the meaning of the Resurrection and the depths of God's great mercy and love that is made available to all of His creation. Divine Mercy Sunday is not a new feast day because the Second Sunday of Easter has always been a solemnity known as the Octave Day of Easter. The richness of the mercy of God comes to us not only through St. Faustina's revelations, but also through scripture and the history and tradition of the Catholic Church.

Jesus has promised to pour out extraordinary graces to those who come to Him on this day focused on His Mercy. He has promised complete forgiveness of sins and punishment for those who take part by doing what He has instructed.


