



#### SACRAMENT INFORMATION

**Baptism** – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must pre-register for the session. Baptisms are celebrated during Mass, following the last Mass on Sunday, or by special arrangement. Please schedule by calling the Parish Office.

**First Reconciliation/Eucharist** – Children entering the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> grades and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including St. Gregory Parish School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions. Sacraments are celebrated in late winter and spring.

**Confirmation** – High School youth who are entering the 11<sup>th</sup> grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation program. Sessions begin in the fall and Confirmation is celebrated in the spring.

**Matrimony** — Call the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the anticipated wedding date. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

**Anointing of the Sick** – The Sacrament is available to all those who are seriously ill or advanced in age. Please call the Parish Office to request a visit by the priest.

**Reconciliation** — The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:00-4:30 PM, or by request. There are two multi-parish celebrations during Advent and Lent.

Dear Members and Friends of the St. Gregory Parish Family,

You may recall that on Saturday, August 1, 2020, we were honored to welcome Bishop Persico for the celebration of the Rite of Candidacy for three of our seminarians for the Diocese of Erie. Despite the covid restrictions in place, it was a wonderful event and a great opportunity for all of us to pray for vocations for service to our Church.

This weekend, friends, those same three seminarians have been ordained as Deacons during a Mass held at St. Mark Catholic Center in Erie. I join all of you in congratulating the Rev. Mr. Benjamin Daghir, the Rev. Mr. Nicholas Fratus, and the Rev. Mr. Christopher Wheeler, as they commit themselves to Christ and continue their formation in preparation for ordination to the priesthood next year. Now, as Deacons of the Church, they are able to proclaim the Gospel, preach, share in the joy of celebrating the Sacraments of Baptism and Matrimony, assist with the Rites of Christian Burial, and participate more fully in the charitable works of the Church.

One of the things that gets rather confusing at times is the fact that we are blessed to have two kinds of Deacons in service to the Church. There are the "transitional Deacons," like the three ordained this weekend; and the "permanent Deacons," like our own Deacon Rick. Those who are ordained to the transitional diaconate have the ultimate goal of becoming priests. Those who are ordained to the permanent diaconate have the intention of remaining in the diaconal ministry as their gift of service to the Church. While the duration of service for each is different, the goal of generous service in the name of Christ remains the same!

We first hear about the ministry of the diaconate in the Bible as we open it up to the Acts of the Apostles. In Chapter 6, we learn that there is both joy and challenge in meeting the needs of the early Christian Community. The "joy" comes from the fact that many people are opening their minds and hearts to God's Word and being baptized. The "challenge" is for the disciples to meet the many needs of these people, particularly through works of charity. So, the following clearly describes



the action that is taken to help solve this dilemma: "The Twelve called together the community of the disciples and said, 'It is not right for us to neglect the Word of God to serve at table. Brothers, select from among you seven reputable men, filled with the Spirit and wisdom, whom we shall appoint to this task, whereas we shall devote ourselves to prayer and to the ministry of the Word." (Acts 6,2-3) These seven, friends, are considered to be the first Deacons of the Church and model the fundamental expectation that the diaconate is primarily a ministry of charitable service.

As we rejoice in the commitment of those newly ordained to diaconate this weekend, we give thanks to God for all of our Deacons who reflect the love of Jesus in service to nursing homes, hospitals, prisons, schools, and a variety of charitable efforts. They are all so generous in our common goal to serve Christ and His Church, particularly during some of life's more challenging circumstances. I join you in applauding their faith and commitment!



I also join you in congratulating all of our young people who will be sharing in the great gift of the Holy Eucharist this Sunday afternoon. They are all very excited to receive Jesus for the first time and we are equally proud of them and happy for them. Their "First Holy Communion" is a great reminder of God's hope that we will all do our best to live in a great "communion" of love and service, caring for one another, each sharing his or her particular gifts for the good of all. May God bless all of us as we do our best to respond with an enthusiastic "Yes" to whatever our God is asking of us!




