



SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must pre-register for the session. Baptisms are celebrated during Mass, following the last Mass on Sunday, or by special arrangement. Please schedule by calling the Parish Office.

First Reconciliation/Eucharist – Children entering the 2nd & 3rd grades and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including St. Gregory Parish School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions. Sacraments are celebrated in late winter and spring.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation program. Sessions begin in the fall and Confirmation is celebrated in the spring.

Matrimony — Call the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the anticipated wedding date. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

Anointing of the Sick – The Sacrament is available to all those who are seriously ill or advanced in age. Please call the Parish Office to request a visit by the priest.

Reconciliation — The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:00-4:30 PM, or by request. There are two multi-parish celebrations during Advent and Lent.

Dear Members and Friends of the St. Gregory Parish Family,

One of my favorite stories, relative to this festive season, comes to us from the renowned author, Willa Cather. The story is called, "The Burglar's Christmas," and was originally published in 1896 under the pseudonym of Elizabeth L. Seymour. It centers on a young man named William who had moved away from his family to Chicago. Will wanted to be "free," independent, out on his own in the world. Well, friends, Will quickly discovered the hard reality of that experience. And, eventually, he finds himself alone with no money, no food, and no place to stay. In that sad state, he thinks back to his childhood, how he indulged in "gingerbread and frosted cakes," "the splendid birthday parties his mother used to give him," and how he would "eat and eat and then go to bed and dream of Santa Claus." Life was so good back then, with people who loved and cared for him!

As Christmas Eve approaches, Will becomes really desperate! He's freezing out in the cold, he's literally starving, and no one is making any effort to help him. So, he decides to do the one thing he has never done before – he's going to steal. Not feeling like he has any other option, he picks out a target and breaks into the house. Now, friends, here is the ironic twist: he breaks into his own parents' home! That's right, they have moved to Chicago and catch their own son burglarizing their home. Can you even begin to imagine that awkward moment?! What would you say? What would you do?

As Will prepares to make a hasty departure, his parents assure him, "Stay – we'll make things right." With that, Will looks at his mom with a hesitant, pained and embarrassed expression on his face and asks: "I wonder if you know how much you pardon?" Looking back at her son with great affection she says: "O my poor boy, much or little, what does it matter? Have you wandered so far and paid such a bitter price for knowledge and not yet learned that love has nothing to do with pardon or forgiveness, that it only loves, and loves, and loves?"

During our journey together through Advent, my friends, we have considered the themes of "Hope," "Peace," and "Joy." Today, on this Fourth Sunday of Advent, you can clearly see, from the banner displayed in church, that the prevailing theme is "Love." It's simply the perfect message as we anticipate the celebration of Christmas and "Love" being born into the world. Isn't that what God reveals to us, that His only begotten Son is a "Love-Gift" to and for all of us? Consider, please, one of the most well known and cherished verses from Sacred Scripture. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life." (John 3,16) Yes, God is like that generous parent whose benevolence knows no bounds! Having given us the gift of life, the magnificent creation that surrounds us, the good company of family and friends – God can't wait to give us even more! He offers us the gift of Himself – "Love" born into the world. "Love" to be with us, and to bless us, and to guide us from this world to the next!

As we look forward to Christmas, only a few days away, I can only pray that you are prepared to welcome "Love" into your hearts, into your lives. When we do, then we are eager, we actually feel compelled, to share that great gift with others. No, most of the gifts that "Love" provides cannot be wrapped and placed under the tree, but they are true reflections of our understanding and sharing in the mystery of the Incarnation – Jesus born in us! The gifts that "Love" supplies include a warm welcome to all, forgiveness, a new beginning, gracious words of support and encouragement, a warm smile, a true respect that comes from accepting the fact that we are all the sons and daughters of an amazing God who shows no partiality. That understanding of Christmas provides the potential for a wonderful "gift-exchange," doesn't

it? God gives to us – we give to others!

Isn't that what Jesus really asks of us, as we approach Christmas, celebrate the Christmas Season, enter the New Year 2022, and always? We take our cue from yet another passage from the Gospel of St. John. "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13,34-35) God's Word reveals to us a truly wonderful formula for life, doesn't it? Accept God as "Love," embrace "Love," and do your best to share that awesome Gift each and every day. Do that, and you cannot fail in your discipleship!



I join together with the entire parish staff, my friends, in wishing you a most happy and blessed Christmas on the way! And, I leave you with the reminder that comes to us from St. Paul who finally came to realize the importance of "Love" in his own life: "Love never fails!" (1Corinthians 13,8)




Our Knights of Columbus Council is having a sports calendar raffle. There are 2500 calendars available
