



### SACRAMENT INFORMATION

**Baptism** – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must pre-register for the session. Baptisms are celebrated during Mass, following the last Mass on Sunday, or by special arrangement. Please schedule by calling the Parish Office.

**First Reconciliation/Eucharist** – Children entering the 2<sup>nd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> grades and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including St. Gregory Parish School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions. Sacraments are celebrated in late winter and spring.

**Confirmation** – High School youth who are entering the 11<sup>th</sup> grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation program. Sessions begin in the fall and Confirmation is celebrated in the spring.

**Matrimony** — Call the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the anticipated wedding date. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

**Anointing of the Sick** – The Sacrament is available to all those who are seriously ill or advanced in age. Please call the Parish Office to request a visit by the priest.

**Reconciliation** — The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:00-4:30 PM, or by request. There are two multi-parish celebrations during Advent and Lent.

Dear Members and Friends of the St. Gregory Parish Family,

Even though the Christmas Season officially concludes today, as we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, I'd like to turn the calendar back to Christmas Eve for just a moment. It was then, at the Mass, that we heard how the angels announced the glad tidings of Jesus' birth into the world. Can you imagine being one of those shepherds, out tending your flock, when the angel appeared and said to them: "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2,10-11) What an amazing revelation! That Jesus, born into this world is none other than "Christ and Lord," the "anointed One" who is destined to save all people from sin and death! It's no wonder that the shepherds were both "fearful," and yet bound and determined to go to Bethlehem to witness this incredible event!

Again, friends, today we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. It's speculated that thirty years have now passed since Jesus' birth, and that He is about to enter into His public ministry. The connection between this episode in Jesus' life and His birth is yet another proclamation! This time, however, it's not from the angels, it's the very voice of God! The heavens open, the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus, and a voice from heaven announces: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." (Luke 3,22) Today, you see, is not only a celebration of a singular event in Jesus' life; it is a reminder of His identity! That Jesus was born into the world to redeem the world, to save us all from sin and death! Jesus was born, baptized, lived, suffered, died and rose to offer us both a pattern for our own lives and the promise of eternal life

with Him in the Kingdom!

As we consider the beauty of the Christmas Season, and today's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we are clearly invited to consider our own births and baptisms as well. Most of us know exactly when our birthday will be and anticipate it as a day of celebrating another year of life here with family and friends. How many of us, do you think, know the date of our "rebirth" in Christ, our baptism, with the same exactitude? Yet that is the special day that we were freed from original sin, pronounced "a child of God," and welcomed into the Family of Faith as another "brother or sister in Christ," and heir with Jesus to the Kingdom of God!



This description of our new identity is really made clear to us, friends, in the anointing with the Sacred Chrism that takes place as part of the baptismal ritual. Applying the oil on the child's forehead, in the sign of the cross, the celebrant says: "God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin, given you a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and welcomed you into His holy people. He now anoints you with the Chrism of salvation. As Christ was anointed Priest, Prophet, and King, so may you live always as a member of His body, sharing everlasting life. Amen." (The Baptismal Ritual) Yes, the day of our baptism is truly a great time to be recalled as that special occasion when we were promised life beyond this life, no matter how many years we happen to be given here.

That being said, the words of the ritual also remind us that along with "a promise," there is "an obligation" attached to the Sacrament of Baptism as well – that we will do our best to live in imitation of Christ! Yes, that we will make every effort to take on those sacred responsibilities that are attached to the signing with the Sacred Chrism. To be "Priest," doing our best to live a good and holy life. To be "Prophet," sharing the Good News with our sisters and brothers. To be "King," sharing our gifts of time, talent and treasure in generous service.

Yes, my friends, the Christmas Season has come to an end and, by the late afternoon of today, the church environment will be transformed to reflect the weeks of "Ordinary Time" ahead until Ash Wednesday and our entry into Lent. I join you in thanking Cindy Riefstahl for the many weeks of planning and preparation that went into making our Christmas Season so very beautiful, as well all those who assisted in any way. That certainly includes all of those who will help to pack, move and store all of the Christmas items today. While the décor will change, it's important that we hold on to the underlying message that the beauty of the Christmas Season is meant to reflect! The revelation of the feasts we've been celebrating, including the Baptism of the Lord, is that Christmas is to be kept alive in our hearts. As I mentioned on New Year's Day, that's why Mary is such a perfect model for all of us – because she "kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." (Luke 2,19) Yes, the environment may change, the seasons as well, but the spirit of Christmas lives on in those who recognize, accept and embrace Jesus as their Savior and do their best to share His love all the year long.

Peace, joy and God's blessing as you do your best to live out the spirit of Christmas and your baptismal commitment now and always!
