



SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must pre-register for the session. Baptisms are celebrated during Mass, following the last Mass on Sunday, or by special arrangement. Please schedule by calling the Parish Office.

First Reconciliation/Eucharist – Children entering the $2^{nd} \& 3^{rd}$ grades and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including St. Gregory Parish School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions. Sacraments are celebrated in late winter and spring.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation program. Sessions begin in the fall and Confirmation is celebrated in the spring.

Matrimony – Call the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the anticipated wedding date. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

Anointing of the Sick – The Sacrament is available to all those who are seriously ill or advanced in age. Please call the Parish Office to request a visit by the priest.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:00 - 4:30 PM, or by request. There are two multi-parish celebrations during Advent and Lent.

Dear Members and Friends of the St. Gregory Parish Family,

Each and every weekday, I invite everyone present to conclude the celebration of Mass by joining together in song. These songs are selected from the "*Breaking Bread*" Hymnal that daily Mass attendees have been welcomed to take as their own and bring with them whenever they attend. My goal is always to select a song that is both familiar and relates to the scripture passages of the day or the particular liturgical season we are in. This proved to be a relatively easy process over the last couple of weeks as we celebrated Christmas and the accompanying Christmas Season. There are many Christmas Hymns that are familiar to us and that we all enjoy singing!

That being said, this past Monday we entered into the Season we refer to as "Ordinary Time," and the hymn that I selected to conclude the Mass was titled, "The Servant Song." The first verse of the song clearly reflected the call to discipleship taken from the Gospel of St. Mark. "Will you let me be your servant, let me be as Christ to you; pray that I may have the grace to let me be your servant, too." The words of the second verse actually spoke to me about something else I've had on my mind; the forthcoming Synod on Synodality. "We are pil-grims on a journey, we are trav'lers on the road; we are here to help each other walk the mile and bear the road."

I'm really not certain how many of you have actually heard much about, or read much about, the "Synod on Synodality" called for by Pope Francis. A "Synod," as such, is a gathering of bishops from throughout the world to discuss topics of significance and to offer advice to the Holy Father. The first of the Synod of Bishops was established in 1965 by St. Pope Paul VI. The word "Synodality" literally mean "walking together." The word was more completely defined by the International Theological Commission as: "the action of the Spirit in the communion of the Body of Christ and in the missionary journey of the People of God." In both its simplest and broadest of definitions, Pope Francis clearly recognizes that we are, all of us, "pilgrims on a journey," and would like to hear from as many people as possible prior to the Bishops' gathering in Rome.

To that end, all parishes, including St. Gregory, will be hosting *"listening sessions"* to assist in this monumental effort to help us move forward as God's Church in the world today. I'm most grateful to Deacon Rick who will be helping to coordinate this effort in our parish, and to Sue McElhinny and Greg Beardsley who will be facilitating our gatherings. I'm confident that the open and honest discussions that take place will not only assist in our Diocesan effort, but will help us right here at St. Gregory as we look to the future and deal with the issues and realities of our time and place.

There are some important words and concepts involved in this process. The first is "*Holy Spirit*." The Holy Spirit has been with and will always lead the Church. We need to be open to and place our trust in the Spirit's presence and look to the Spirit for guidance. The second is "*listening*." As brothers and sisters in Christ, we need to be attentive to what others are saying; their hopes, and dreams, and their vision of what "*Church*" is and should be. The third is the word "*Synodality*" itself. We are all God's "*Church*." We're all in this together. We all have the same end-goal - eternal life in the Kingdom!

Following the training session scheduled for this weekend, our dedicated facilitators will be extending invitations to ask for your participation in the Synodal process. My personal hope is that you will be generous in accepting an invitation to participate and in sharing your experience and vision of "*Church*." Any thoughts you have will be welcomed and appreciated.

May God bless you and our entire Parish Family as we do our best to love and serve one another, as Christ would, on our pilgrim journey together.
