

SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must pre-register for the session. Baptisms are celebrated during Mass, following the last Mass on Sunday, or by special arrangement. Please schedule by calling the Parish Office.

First Reconciliation/Eucharist – Children entering the $2^{nd} \& 3^{rd}$ grades and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including St. Gregory Parish School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions. Sacraments are celebrated in late winter and spring.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation program. Sessions begin in the fall and Confirmation is celebrated in the spring.

Matrimony – Call the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the anticipated wedding date. Church date and arrangements should precede all other wedding plans.

Anointing of the Sick – The Sacrament is available to all those who are seriously ill or advanced in age. Please call the Parish Office to request a visit by the priest.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:00 - 4:30 PM, or by request. There are two multi-parish celebrations during Advent and Lent.

Dear Members and Friends of the St. Gregory Parish Family,

It's 99.9% finished! That's right, friends, the new Chapel roof at 136 West Main Street is in place and helping to keep all who visit warm and dry. Actually, the .1% of the work that remains has nothing to do with the roof itself. There is a minor brick repair job that needs to be completed, and I'm confident that this repair will happen as soon as the weather permits. It's just such a relief to be able to enter the Chapel, offer up a prayer, and not hear that drip, drip, drip of water dropping into a plastic bucket! All of you who have dealt with leaky roofs know exactly what I'm talking about.

As this project progressed, friends, I couldn't help but think about all of the people, as well as their particular gifts and talents, who helped bring this project to completion. Of course, there was a general contractor who skillfully managed the entire operation. That being clarified, there was also an architect involved who completed the drawings according to specifications for a public building. Actually, we were blessed to have the same architect who designed the St. Gregory School roof, making him very familiar with the St. Gregory property and buildings. The roof design had to be inspected and approved both for the work to begin and as it continued. Behind the scenes, there were people involved, many unknown, who built the trusses, provided the metal sheeting, and transported these items to the Main Street property. Later, the space between the old roof and new roof had to be insulated and a new drainage system installed.

Now, I'm not a contractor or all that knowledgeable about construction, so I may have missed some steps and some people along the way in the process. My point is that, like everything we do as a community or as a parish, it takes many people to actually make it happen. In the case of the Chapel roof, that also includes all of you who were so generous in donating to the annual CSA and in offering up prayers for the success of this and all of our endeavors! Without that prayerful support, offered each and every year, so many of our projects and efforts

would be minimalized or come to a grinding halt! That's the truth of it, friends! Without you, without your faith, without your prayers, without your ongoing encouragement, without the contribution of your personal gifts – we would not be where we are at today as a Family of Faith!

While my comments might seem to be a perfect introduction to the annual Catholic Services Appeal for 2022, that is actually not my intention today. Rather, I've been thinking about so many of our projects and the wonderful ways we work together as a reflection on the scripture passages from St. Paul's First Letter to the Corinthians that we listened to last weekend and that continue this weekend. Last weekend, you may recall, St. Paul reminded us that while we have many varied gifts, we all have the same Spirit. Yes, a wonderful Holy Spirit who "distributes them (gifts) in-

dividually to each person as He wishes," and who gives them "for some benefit" to all. This weekend, St. Paul continues this same "train of thought" in his reminder that we are all "one body." There are many different parts of the body, but they are all important and contribute to the well being of the whole! "If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy." In short, we need to recognize and respect one another's unique gifts and talents if we are truly to live as the Body of Christ, manifesting His love and presence to the world! (First Letter to the Corinthians, 12, 4-30)

Isn't it amazing that St. Paul's message to people hundreds of years ago equally applies to all of us as God's "*Church*" today? This wonderful reminder that in all our projects and efforts to love and serve we are, in fact, "*raising a Family of Faith*!" That beyond the scope of any individual project or program there are underlying spiritual reminders: that we are all the beloved children of God, that we are all blessed in some way, that we should recognize and appreciate our own unique gifts as well as those of others, that we should be grateful for them, thankful to others for sharing theirs, and use them well to minister to one another as the living Body of Christ!

With that in mind, I would like to express my personal gratitude to you for the wonderful way so many of you take to heart and do your best to live out God's Word as part of the St. Gregory Family of Faith. Like our Chapel roof project, there are many who I recognize are so very active in ministry and who I regularly see in action. And, also like so many of our efforts, I'm sure there are many who are so very generous and who contribute to the well being of our parish and community in ways I don't see or am not clearly aware of. Take heart! Rejoice because our ever-watchful God sees what none of us sees and His reward is beyond any human recognition! As St. Matthew reminds us: *"Your Father who sees in secret will reward you."* (Matthew 6,4) Never underestimate the blessings our God has in store for those who honor, love and serve Him!


