#### SOME THOUGHTS FROM FATHER PACKARD...

Well, we made it! Christmas 2021 is almost a memory and we now have to practice writing a "2" instead of "1" on our letters and documents. It seems that the dates of our Christmas/New Years celebrations made the holiday whiz by so very quickly. Not only that, with Christmas being on a Saturday, we started up with celebrating the weekend the very next day. I have to thank our "Varsity Team" for their presence at our 9:00AM Mass last Sunday to celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. We only had one Mass last Sunday, but we had a wonderful response to our Sunday attendance. Thank you to those who were in attendance!

I also want to remind everyone that Christmas is a twelve day celebration! Even though we see appearances of already discarded Christmas trees on the curbs of our streets, and many of you have dismantled your artificial trees and packed them away for next year, the Church does not officially end the Christmas season until Sunday, January 9th when we celebrate the Feast of the Lord's Baptism.

This weekend we gather at worship to celebrate the solemnity of **The Epiphany of the Lord Jesus.** The word "epiphany" means the "manifestation of a divine or supernatural being". The Epiphany of the Lord Jesus Christ manifests the light that God shines on our world, a loving light that is utterly <u>inclusive</u>. In our Second Reading in our Liturgy of the Word this weekend, we hear St. Paul, in his Letter to the Ephesians proclaiming: **the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise of Jesus Christ through the Gospel.** And so, our God is utterly **inclusive** in his promise of salvation.

And speaking of Epiphany, there is a time-honored tradition of blessing our homes each year on the Feast of the Epiphany. Once again we are distributing printed Epiphany House Blessings to be placed above the front door of your home or apartment (over the inside of your door). When you place this blessing above the door. pray the blessing prayer on the reverse side, then attach the blessing above the door. The letters C M B traditionally refer to the legendary names of the three Kings: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar (scripture neither names them or says them nor says that there were three of them). This ritual is meant to remind households to gladly welcome everyone who comes to your door and to eagerly seek out Christ every time you leave your home. Another tradition refers to CMB as the abbreviation of the Latin phrase: Christus mansionem benedicat, which translated means: May Christ bless this house. Hang this blessing proudly and answer inquisitive guests' questions about what this sign means in your home! There are plenty of these house blessings to go around, so feel free to offer them to family and friends, or children away at college or living in other locations. Remove last year's blessing and replace it with these new ones. Let the tradition continue!

As I mentioned earlier, next weekend the Church will celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord Jesus. It's the final day of this year's Christmas season. We will be having a special ceremony to rededicate our recently refurbished Baptismal Font. It's very appropriate that we do this on the Feast of the Lord's Baptism. Once again, I want to give credit and show my appreciation to **Gene and Sharon Andrien** for making this project happen at St. Titus Church.

Gene spent countless hours working on rebuilding the font instead of having us replace it. We are so grateful for his labors and skill in doing this for us!

With the month of January upon us, each year in January it is St. Titus Church's turn to assist LOVE Inc. with supplies needed for them to provide easy to prepare meal items for the weekends. Some of the items we will need to collect include the following: individual drink boxes, oatmeal variety packs, individual cereals, pop tarts, Chef-boyardee canned pastas. Microwaveable mac and cheese, fruit/applesauce cups, non-refrigerated jello and pudding cups, hot chocolate packets, soup, ramen noodles, instant lunches (no peanuts or peanut butter products). Non-food items accepted include: chapsticks, toothbrushes, toothpaste, hats, scarves, gloves, small combs, antibacterial hand wash, and individual tissues. There will be receptacles in the Gathering Space to collect your donations throughout the month of January. I will continue to provide a list of needed items in the bulletins for the month of January.

And finally, I want to take this opportunity to give thanks to all those who made our celebration of the Christmas season happen at St. Titus parish. My sincere thanks to everyone who sent greetings and other expressions of Christmas over the last few weeks. I thank you very much and am most appreciative! Thanks to all who helped to prepare our House of Worship for Christmas – everyone who helped to create our Church's environment for this beautiful feast; to all who helped with our Christmas liturgies - our Lectors, Sacristans, and Ministers of Music, and to all whose presence at worship indicated just how important Christmas is to us! I want to thank in a special way T.J. Parks, our Director of Pastoral Music, along with Maggie Bernecky, for their special music that enhanced our Christmas liturgies. Thanks to our Cantors: Bill Stumpf, Marissa and Mariel Hanely. Thank you to our wonderful Parish Staff: Brenda Lytle. Kathleen Puleo and Greg Tress (Greg's father passed away just days before Christmas but Greg made sure that our Christmas needs were taken care of!) And thanks to Eden Lamey of McElroy's Flower Shoppe for creating the environment for our Church during Advent and Christmas. And thanks to all of you whose presence at Church during Christmas made a beautiful expression of our belief in the mystery of the Nativity of our Lord - the Word made Flesh - our Emmanuel, "God with Us"!
