SOME THOUGHTS FROM FATHER PACKARD...

Haven't we been spared again? I was listening and watching the coverage of the freakish snow storm that occurred in Virginia this past Tuesday morning. All those people who were stranded for HOURS on Interstate 95. Some were there for almost twenty-four hours! Just imagine that. The serious thing was having enough gas in your car's tank to keep your car alive and heated — not to mention the lack of food that many encountered. And just before that, all those people stranded in airports and trying to return home after the Christmas holiday! I'll take Titusville anytime!

The Church's celebration of Christmas Time comes to an end this weekend as we celebrate the **Feast of the Lord's Baptism**. The manifestation of Christ that we celebrate at Christmas and the days up to now culminate with Jesus' baptism in the River Jordan by John the Baptist. On this last day of the Christmas season, may we think of how we will be open to allow Christ to be manifested in our lives. Let us resolve to consciously choose to follow Christ more closely and take seriously our baptismal call to live as disciples of Jesus.

Can I offer this suggestion to all of us? Try to search for the date of your baptism and, if the Church where you were baptized is nearby, visit the Church of your baptism. If the Church isn't nearby, try to find a picture of the Church — you might be able to find it online. Look to see if your photo albums have any pictures of your baptism. Try to identify who the people are who were present. If your godparents are still alive, contact them and thank them for the special role they played at this important time in your life. Include your children in the same project. You may even have the candle that was presented to you at baptism. Please take me up on my challenge!

As everyone is aware, our Church's Baptismal Font has undergone major repair and restoration since last spring. When we drained it last year at the beginning of Lent we discovered that a hidden leak had drastically deteriorated the structure of the font. Two different contractors said there was nothing that could be done to save it. And then all of a sudden, Eugene Andrien surfaced and asked if he could do what he could to restore and rebuild it. I wasn't going to stand in his way of his offer. What would we have to lose? After painstakingly disassembling the font, there appeared to be light at the end of the tunnel. But each step of the way had many questions. To make a long story even longer, we filled the font with water for a trial run. And Eureka! It held water and was as good as it was when it was first built - actually it is BETTER than it was when first built! We owe a debt of gratitude to Gene for all his time and labor and sacrifice to get our Baptismal Font where it is now.

And so this weekend, as we celebrate the **Feast of the Lord's Baptism**, it seems most appropriate that we rededicate this very important symbol of our faith and our Church's worship here at St. Titus Church!

But first I want to offer some credit to the parish's Worship Committee who saw the need for a Baptismal Font that would be one of the most important aspects of the Church Renovation that took place in 1998-1999, under the direction of then pastor, Fr. James Gutting. And so I want to offer some thoughts for all of us on why our Baptismal Font is so important in the life of St. Titus Church.

The rites of Baptism, the first of the sacraments of Initiation, require a prominent place for celebration. Initiation into the Church is entrance into a Eucharistic community united in Jesus Christ. Because the rites of initiation of the Church begin with baptism and are completed by the reception of the Eucharist, the Baptismal Font and its location reflect the Christian's journey through the waters of Baptism to the altar. This integral relationship between the Baptismal Font and Altar is so important.

The location of the Baptismal Font, its design, and the materials used for its construction are important considerations in the planning and design of the Church. It is important to locate the Baptismal Font in a special area within the main body of the Church. Through the waters of Baptism the faithful enter the life of Christ. For this reason the Font should be visible and accessible to all who enter the Church.

Water is the key symbol of Baptism and the focal point of the Font. In this water believers die to sin and are reborn to new life in Christ. In designing the Font the parish will want to consider the traditional symbolism that has been the inspiration for the Font's design throughout history. The Font is a symbol of both tomb and womb. Its power is the power of the triumphant cross. And Baptism sets the Christian on the path to the life that will never end.

Let us be grateful for the saving waters of Baptism and for the Font in our Church that continues to remind us of the significance our Baptism is to us. May each time we bless ourselves with this holy water when we enter our Church remind us of the day of our Baptism into Christ Jesus!
