THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

SOME THOUGHTS FROM FATHER PACKARD...

When I walked down the main aisle of Church last weekend and arrived in the sanctuary, I couldn't believe my eyes when I looked out at everyone who was gathered in Church for worship! There was this <u>wonderful</u> SEA OF RED! It was everywhere!! I think it was the best glimpse of the influence and presence of the Holy Spirit we have ever had! I want to thank everyone who responded to the invitation to wear something RED for Pentecost this year. It was something else!

On the west side of the Church stands a very different ornamental tree called – I think – a "French Lilac." This year it has burst into the most beautiful tree with white blossoms that look like cotton candy and have a pungent sweet aroma to them. If the blooms are still with us by this weekend, you owe it to yourself to take a close look at it (and get a whiff of its fragrance). Mother Nature outdid herself this year with this tree!

With the celebration of Pentecost and the fifty-day celebration of Easter completed, our Church enters into its longest liturgical season of the year – **ORDINARY TIME**. The United States Conference of Bishops call Ordinary Time "a time for growth and maturation." It's appropriate because it comprises the bulk of weeks in our Liturgical Year. It takes place in the Northwestern Hemisphere during summer and autumn, when plants and animals are growing and thriving, and crops ripen and are ready to harvest. Offering the goods of the earth for our sacrifice and thanksgiving at the Eucharistic feast, we can also feel our faith life growing, maturing, and ripening. Notice that the <u>color</u> of the season of Ordinary Time is **green**, which is a symbol of Hope.

Right off the bat the Church celebrates two very important aspects of our faith on the first two Sundays of Ordinary Time. This weekend we celebrate the great mystery of the Holy Trinity – our God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit – three persons yet ONE God.

This belief is what distinguishes us as persons yet ONE God. This belief is what distinguishes us as <u>Christian</u>. The mystery of the Trinity is the core of the Christian Creed. We profess belief in one God who is three persons: Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier. This belief does not come easily for most of us. How can one God also be three persons? It defies logic! Luckily, the goal of faith is not to solve equations but to be in relationship with our deeply mysterious, ever-loving God who reveals God's self in the world in incredible and unexpected ways!

There are many symbols of the Trinity in the ornamentation of the Church. Take a look around at the interior of St. Titus Church and see if you can identify any of the symbols of the Trinity visible – especially in the windows of our Church. That should keep you busy for a while!!

While the dust is beginning to settle throughout the Diocese of Erie with the recent changes in Clergy Personnel, many of the priests affected by the recent appointments are packing up their personal belongings so they can be moved to new places of residence. That seems to be a pre-occupation for me these days. You quickly

become aware of what you REALLY need – with the rest being superfluous. Over the years I have gathered <u>many</u> things that remind me of where I have been and whom I've met during those years. For those of you who have had to move to new places, you know what I am talking about! In the weeks left in this month of June, please keep Father Christopher Barnes in your prayers as he prepares to become your new Pastor, and remember me in your prayers as I prepare to transition into a new way of life for myself! New clergy appointments take effect on July 6th!

Many of you are unaware of who takes care of the maintenance of our parish grounds. The flowers and plantings are always there to enhance the exterior of our Church, but who is it maintaining the beautiful surroundings of our Church? I'm here to tell you! Every Wednesday (when it is not raining), **Hazel Spoharski and Mary Anne Connor** can be found tending the flowers around St. Titus Church. They do a wonderful job!! But they certainly could use some help with their labors! If anyone would like to volunteer and become one of our "Parish Gardeners," you would be most welcome. This usually takes place on Wednesday mornings, around 9:00AM and lasts for one to one and a half hours. I know both Hazel and Mary Anne would welcome any help you could offer!

The **Knights of Columbus** reported to me the results of their **Spaghetti and Meatball Dinner** that took place on Sunday, May 22nd. They served approximately 170 dinners that were all take-out dinners, and they profited \$1,500 to help them with their charitable works in our Titusville community. The Knights would like to thank everyone who patronized their recent Spaghetti Dinner!
