SOME THOUGHTS FROM FATHER PACKARD...

Haven't the past few days been "steamy" ones!?!! It's unusual for the first few weeks of June to be so warm. But it was just a few weeks ago that we were commenting about how cold it is. And many of us predicted that it wouldn't be long before we would be complaining about the heat! And here we are! Major topic of discussion, as well as a concern, is the rising cost of gasoline at the pumps. And the predictions of the weeks ahead are not too promising, either. The far-reaching effects of gas prices is staggering. A major concern for our area is the affect this will have on the tourism industry. If you can't afford gas for your car you won't be able to visit places of interest. And that affects the people and businesses that depend on us to visit and enjoy the amenities of this part of Pennsylvania - as well as many other places we would like for our vacations. And so we tighten our belts and hope for the best. I think many people are thinking twice before they turn on the ignition of their car. Will "footpower" and bicycles become the new normal of travel? Who knows?

This coming week's daily Mass schedule shows that something must be going on because there will be no daily Masses Monday through Thursday. What is happening this week is the annual diocesan Priests' Convocation - EMMAUS - that will be taking place at St. Vincent College in Latrobe, PA. I've lost track of what the number of this annual gathering is – could it be the 40^{th} ? – I don't know. (I just checked and it IS the 40th!) But to think that an annual gathering of the priests of our diocese has continued for all these years proves its importance as well as its popularity. These three days of Emmaus are designed for prayer, fraternity, and relaxation. For many of us it is the only time each year that we see one another. That in itself is very important. It renews the fraternal bond we have with each other as priests serving our diocese. Each year there is a keynote speaker. This year, Bishop Ronald Gainer, Bishop of Harrisburg, will address the priest's relationship with the Eucharist. On Wednesday evening it has been our custom at Emmaus to celebrate the milestone jubilees of our diocesan priests. (Last year I celebrated my 50th anniversary of Priestly Ordination). On Thursday morning we have a dialogue with Bishop Persico, at which time he discusses the "State of the Diocese of Erie." It's an opportunity to look back as well as project forward with the direction of the Church in our Erie Diocese. And then it's back home. You will notice a special insert in this weekend's Church Bulletin - The Emmaus Prayer for Priests. Let me ask you to pray this prayer on the three days that the priests of the diocese gather in Latrobe. Please be assured of our prayers for you each day as we celebrate Eucharist.

I am sad to announce the sudden death of **Bernard Pitrone**, brother of Kathleen Puleo, our Coordinator of Faith Formation. He was 62 years of age. Kathleen's mother had just been hospitalized in the Dubois Hospital for some tests, and her brother Bernie died suddenly while his mother was still hospitalized. This is a difficult time for Kathleen, her parents and siblings, and the entire Pitrone family. Please keep them in your prayers.

I need to discuss with everyone the suggested offering for our Votive Candles. As you know, the votive candles are a <u>petroleum</u> product. With the crazy oil market, all petroleum products are seeing increases in the prices of products. If that were not bad enough, we <u>used</u> to receive a substantial break in shipping (if we ordered \$1,000 +) with each order. Because of the rise in fuel, there is now NO free shipping of any kind. So we must increase the offering of our votive candles <u>just to break even!</u> Beginning this week, the suggested offering of the **7 Day Votive Lights will be** \$4.00 per candle. The suggested offering for the Sanctuary Candle (one month) will be \$25.00 (two candles are used per month). Who would have ever thought that our Votive Candles would be affected by the rising cost of oil!! Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Oh, are we close!!! To date we have \$41,139.00 pledged toward our Catholic Services Appeal. Our assessed goal for this year's CSA is \$43,484. You can see we are SO-O-O close to achieving our goal. If you have not yet made a pledge, please prayerfully consider helping us with this year's appeal! Many thanks to all those who have made a pledge/qift to this year's CSA!

There is another insert in this weekend's Church Bulletin – a letter from **Bishop Persico**. It concerns the special collection to be taken up all over the world for the annual **Peter's Pence Collection**. The Peter's Pence Collection supports the many charities of our Holy Father, Pope Francis, as he responds to some of the most urgent needs of the people throughout the world, including relief to victims of natural disasters such as earthquakes and floods. Peter's Pence also helps our Holy Father support seminaries and religious houses, orphanages, AIDS treatment centers, and other medical facilities in developing nations. Your prayers and contributions will allow this important work to continue. Please use the special envelope contained in your packets.

Please be assured of my prayers for you, and I ask that you keep me in your prayers!! God Bless you all!
