PASTOR'S DESK

Instead of allowing life to get in the way of prayer, wouldn't it be better to allow prayer to be our way of life?

This thought came to mind as I had recently been in several conversations with people who were struggling with finding the time to pray. I do not know about you, but I have confessed on more than one occasion of needing to have prayer as more of a priority in my life. It is not that I don't want to pray or feel the need to pray...it is life getting in the way of prayer.

Schedules, deadlines, meetings, and even down-time can push prayer not only on the proverbial "back burner," but completely off the stove. Even "Down-time?" Down-time is supposed to be your/my time. How can down-time get in the way of prayer? Because often we are at a point when we do have down-time, and the last thing on our mind is prayer.

Be honest: have you ever said, "I know I need to pray more, but things are just so _____ (fill in the blank)." Or "I'm just so exhausted at the end of the day I either forget or fall asleep." Or "I know I need to make prayer more of a priority in my life." If you have, then life is most likely getting in the way of your prayer.

So...what to do? According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, "Prayer is the encounter of God's thirst with ours." That is a beautiful quote! I have no doubt that each of you reading this *Pastor's Desk* has a thirst for a relationship with God (otherwise, you probably would not be reading this).

The thirst for God is often described as a longing in our hearts that cannot quite be satisfied. In every man, woman, and child that longing is ultimately a desire to be close to God. It is like looking out at the ocean and seeing the horizon. As we venture toward that point, we look up and see another horizon. They seem endless, but we keep moving forward, trusting that one day we will reach our point of destination. Our thirst to be one with God can be likened to the ocean's

horizon. We venture toward God to grow closer to God. We come to a point where we might feel comfortable, only to find that as we look up we see another point God

beckons us to approach. And so we continue our venture until that day comes when we reach our destination.

The great news is that God longs for such closeness with us as well. As we venture toward God, God ventures toward us. But, if schedules, deadlines, meetings, and even down-time get in the way, we can easily miss the opportune moments that can quench our thirst, giving us what we need to continue our venture that will lead us to one day reaching our destination with God.

I read once where "Prayer is our turning toward God with as much of our true self as we can muster. Prayer is best when it springs from our deepest emotions of joy, wonder, sorrow, gratitude, yearning, loss, and need. Perhaps the sincerest prayers we will ever voice are short and clear, "Please, God." or "Thank you, God!" or "Help me, God!" I believe what is being said here is that prayer should not be laborious or something we put off until we think we have time to do it.

Prayer is sharing our life with God and recognizing the moments God yearns to share His life with us. This can be done anytime and anywhere. Prayer is keeping God at the forefront of our mind, heart, and soul throughout the course of each day, from the morning prayer of gratitude as we begin our day to the evening prayer of expressing the longing in our heart to be close to God. Throughout the day prayer is keeping our senses open to the opportune moments God will present to us.

Please do not allow life to get in the way of your prayer. Rather, let prayer be your way of life.



THE YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH

St. Joseph "concretely expressed his fatherhood" by making an offering of himself in love "a love placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing to maturity in his home," writes Pope Francis, quoting his predecessor St. Paul VI.



And because of his role at "the crossroads between the Old and New Testament," St. Joseph "has always been venerated as a father by the Christian people." In him, "Jesus saw the tender love of God," the one that helps us accept our weakness, because "it is through" and despite "our fears, our frailties, and our weakness" that most divine designs are realized. "Only tender love will save us from the snares of the accuser," emphasizes the Pontiff, and it is by encountering God's mercy especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation that we "experience His truth and tenderness," - because "we know that God's truth does not condemn us, but instead welcomes, embraces, sustains and forgives us."

Joseph is also a father in obedience to God: with his 'fiat' he protects Mary and Jesus and teaches his Son to "do the will of the Father." Called by God to serve the mission of Jesus, he "cooperated... in the great mystery of Redemption," as St. John Paul II said, "and is truly a minister of salvation."

Pizza Pasta Casserole Recipe:

Ingredients:

2 pounds of ground beef
1 large onion chopped
3 ½ cups spaghetti sauce (28 oz)
1 package (16 oz) spiral pasta, cooked and drained
4 cups (16 oz) shredded part skim mozzarella cheese
8 ounces sliced pepperoni



Directions:

In large skillet, cook beef and onion over medium heat until meat is no longer pink; drain. Stir in spaghetti sauce, pasta and pepperoni. Transfer to two greased 13" x 9" baking pans or one larger pan. Sprinkle with cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 - 45 minutes or until heated through.

The COVID-19 Vaccine: Ways you can help

Three COVID-19 vaccines have been approved for use in the United States to date. They are: the Moderna vaccine, the Pfizer vaccine and the Johnson & Johnson vaccine. The vaccines have diverse efficacy and storage and distribution criteria. They also give rise to various ethical questions. The distribution of the vaccines has been a particular challenge. Here are some ways in which individuals and parishes can help.

Volunteering as an individual to assist in vaccine distribution:

Any volunteer (medical and non-medical) who wishes to support the Pennsylvania COVID-19 response or any public health emergency can sign up at SERVPA (<http://www.serv.pa.gov>).

Registering simply says that you are open to the idea of volunteering in case of an emergency and provides a little about your background, preferences, and constraints. It does not guarantee that you will be called upon, nor does it mean that you must participate if called.

Retired Nurses who wish to help may reactivate a nursing license which has expired or been inactive for less than 5 years at:


CHRISM MASS



WORSHIP & MEDITATION**GOSPEL MEDITATION****Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture**

Any good teacher or parent will tell you that once a lesson is really learned it doesn't need to be taught again. When we internalize things we have learned, they become a part of who we are and influence how we perceive and interact with our world. The same is true for the law God has written upon our hearts. Once humanity learns this lesson, we will simply know it to be true and act accordingly. Sometimes, it is hard to get people to learn the lessons they need to learn. They are often distracted, disinterested, conflicted, misdirected, or just too stubborn and unable or unwilling to see what is right before their eyes. Understanding that God is in a loving and committed relationship with those fashioned and formed in God's own image, seems like such a simple lesson to learn. But history and experience has proven that it is not.

We struggle with faith, especially when that faith asks us to learn something very particular about ourselves. We must, like a grain of wheat, fall to the ground and die. Because God's DNA is at the very core of who we are, there are specific pearls of wisdom that must be acquired before we can live a full life. One very powerful lesson is that it is not the task of the world to tell us who we are and what has meaning, but God. For many, death is not an opportunity for greater life but a permanent ending to the life they have known. Jesus knew every dimension to what it means to be fully human because he was! He knows the joys, limitations, sorrows, frustrations, wonders, suffering, opportunities, and joys of the human experience. Jesus can teach us a wealth of knowledge and life's lessons from his example, especially obedience.

When we accept the law God has placed in our hearts and gain wisdom from it, then when we suffer we learn to listen more attentively to the Voice behind that law. We naturally flee to our Creator for inspiration, consolation, hope, direction, and comfort as we navigate through this time of darkness. We will not need to run from it, subdue it, fight it, or be overcome by it because we will know, having internalized this profound lesson before, that God will bring new life. God's law is love and love never fails. Even in the moments of Jesus' deepest despair, he glorified the name of his Father. What he learned allowed him to put everything in perspective and be obedient to the tender, loving Voice that echoed within. As Lent quickly winds down, may we learn the same! Then, may we gain the fortitude and wisdom to help others see what is right before their eyes.






