# REFLECTIONS

## SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Job speaks for all of us in his lamentations in today's first reading: "Is not man's life on earth a drudgery? Are not his days those of hirelings? ... I shall not see happiness again." We all have had days and times like this in our lives. Sadness and despair seem to creep so easily in our hearts. The challenges and difficulties of life begin to wear us down. Anxiety and worries take over our hearts. Job's cry is our cry: "When shall I arise?"

Jesus is the answer to these deepest questions of the human heart. He who became one like us in all things, but sin is able to give meaning to our human experience and point to the hope that is meant to fill each and every child of God. Simon's mother-in-law lay ill with a fever, unable to move, even when the Lord himself enters the room. But it is Jesus who comes to her. "He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up." Immediately the fever left her, and she began to wait upon them.

We too are approached by the Lord each day. He comes to us with the invitation to faith, to new life in his Spirit. He extends his hand of mercy and love. He forgives our sins; he showers us with the light of love that fills the darkness of our hearts; he grasps our hands and pulls us out of our misery and sadness.

Why are we so often slow to believe in the power of God? Why do we hesitate in taking the hand of Jesus and walking with the One who is the Way, the Truth and the Life. St. Peter says it best when so many turn away from the Lord and his invitation to Life: "Lord to whom else would we go? You have the words of everlasting life." In our own brokenness and need may we know with confidence that it is God alone who can lift us up, heal us and give us the opportunity for life. "Great is our Lord and mighty in power; to his wisdom there is no limit. Praise the Lord who heals the brokenhearted. Amen."

**WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE SICK** will be celebrated on Thursday, February 11. The World Day of Prayer for the Sick has three consistent themes. First, it reminds the faithful to pray intensely and sincerely for those who are sick. Second, the celebration invites Christians to reflect on and respond to human suffering. And third, this day recognizes and honors all persons who work in health care and serve as caregivers. In his message for the 2018 World Day of the Sick, Pope Francis wrote that "the Church sees in the sick the special presence of the suffering Christ." He offers encouragement and hope to all who suffer in any way as the sick are joined closely to the sufferings of Christ. Our Holy Father also reminds each of us that "by baptism and confirmation we are called to be the Good Samaritan to all who suffer. When we come close with tenderness to those in need of care, we bring the hope and the smile of God amid the contradictions of the world."

# PARISH NEWS

**ASH WEDNESDAY.** The USCCB Committee on Divine Worship sent a memo to all bishops regarding the Distribution of Ashes for Ash Wednesday. Given the pandemic and serious concerns for the health and safety of the faithful, ashes will be distributed in a different manner this year. **We will not be receiving ashes on the forehead and no words will be spoken by the priest. Each person coming forward will be asked to simply bow their heads and ashes will be sprinkled on the crown of the head.** In the United States, the practice is to impose ashes on the forehead. In Italy and at the Vatican, the practice is to sprinkle ashes on the crown of the head. A couple of notes to remember:

- Sprinkling ashes on the head is biblical as it was a sign of penance.
  - "Now on the twenty-fourth day of this month the people of Israel were assembled with fasting and in sackcloth, and with earth upon their heads." (Nehemiah 9:1)
  - "Tamar put ashes on her head and tore the long tunic in which she was clothed. Then, putting her hands to her head, she went away crying loudly." (2 Samuel 13:19)
- In baptism we are washed clean from our original sin and anointed as priest, prophet, and king on the crown of the head. It is fitting that ashes, a reminder of our sin and baptism into death, be sprinkled on the crown of our heads because at Easter we celebrate the resurrection of Christ, the conquering of sin and death, and baptism into life.

## DIRECTIVE FROM THE VATICAN CONGREGATION FOR DIVINE WORSHIP

### NOTE ON ASH WEDNESDAY Distribution of Ashes in Time of Pandemic

The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water, without saying anything. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel", or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return".

The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask, and distributes the ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything.

## PRO-LIFE CORNER

### A MESSAGE TO PRESIDENT BIDEN FROM ARCHBISHOP GOMEZ, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES CATHOLIC CONFERENCE OF BISHOPS ON THE IMPORTANCE OF ENDING ABORTION IN OUR COUNTRY:

"For the nation's bishops, the continued injustice of abortion remains the "preeminent priority." Preeminent does not mean "only." We have deep concerns about many threats to human life and dignity in our society. But as Pope Francis teaches, we cannot stay silent when nearly a million unborn lives are being cast aside in our country year after year through abortion.

Abortion is a direct attack on life that also wounds the woman and undermines the family. It is not only a private matter, it raises troubling and fundamental questions of fraternity, solidarity, and inclusion in the human community. It is also a matter of social justice. We cannot ignore the reality that abortion rates are much higher among the poor and minorities, and that the procedure is regularly used to eliminate children who would be born with disabilities.

Rather than impose further expansions of abortion and contraception, as he has promised, I am hopeful that the new President and his administration will work with the Church and others of good will. My hope is that we can begin a dialogue to address the complicated cultural and economic factors that are driving abortion and discouraging families. My hope, too, is that we can work together to finally put in place a coherent family policy in this country, one that acknowledges the crucial importance of strong marriages and parenting to the well-being of children and the stability of communities. If the President, with full respect for the Church's religious freedom, were to engage in this conversation, it would go a long way toward restoring the civil balance and healing our country's needs."

### **INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER AND AWARENESS AGAINST HUMAN TRAFFICKING will be celebrated on February 8.**

The Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace and the International Union of Superiors General has designated February 8 as an annual day of prayer and awareness against human trafficking. February 8 is the feast day of St. Josephine Bakhita, who was kidnapped as a child and sold into slavery in Sudan and Italy. Once Josephine was freed, she became a Canossian nun and dedicated her life to sharing her testament of deliverance from slavery and comforting the poor and suffering. She was declared a Saint in 2000. On February 8, her feast day, Catholics all over the world are encouraged to create greater awareness about this phenomenon. Through prayer, we not only reflect on the experiences of those that have suffered through this affront to human dignity, but also comfort, strengthen, and help empower survivors. We are invited to offer up this prayer: O God, when we hear of children and adults deceived and taken to unknown places for purposes of sexual exploitation, forced labor, and organ 'harvesting', our hearts are saddened and our spirits angry that their dignity and rights are ignored through threats, lies, and force. We cry out against the evil practice of this modern slavery and pray with St. Bakhita for it to end. Give us wisdom and courage to reach out and stand with those whose bodies, hearts and spirits have been so wounded, so that together we may make real your promises to fill these sisters and brothers with a love that is tender and good. Send the exploiters away empty-handed to be converted from this wickedness and help us all to claim the freedom that is your gift to your children. Amen".

It is an opportunity to affirm our married couples for their faithful witness to the Church in living out their vocation, and to pray for them and their families. **We will offer a special blessing for all married couples as part of the final blessing after communion at each of the Masses next weekend.**




