REFLECTIONS

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

As we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus and rejoice in God's triumph of life over death, grace over sin, good over evil, and light over darkness, the Scriptures speak to us of the call to faith in the person of Jesus Christ, our Risen Savior. Our belief in the Resurrection itself leads us to a personal encounter with the Living Christ himself. Even the disciples of Jesus had a difficult time believing. We are again reminded of the appearance of the Lord to those followers locked in the upper room. He stands in their midst and brings the message of peace and hope. "Peace with you." But despite seeing and hearing the Lord, they are "terrified and startled." Jesus shows them his hands and his feet, and the nail marks from the crucifixion, and he eats with them. He must gently and patiently lead them to real faith, to belief that he is indeed risen and alive. He opens their minds and hearts to understand the Scriptures.

In our first reading, Peter does the same with the crowds of people. He shares the Good News of the Resurrection and explains the meaning of the Scriptures to them. The God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob "has glorified his servant, Jesus. God has raised him from the dead." The Lord Jesus is the long-awaited Messiah whose sacrifice on the Cross has conquered sin and death once and for all. Now people are invited to believe in Him, to have faith, and to come to know Jesus who is present to us in the Church, in the sacraments and in our life through prayer.

Faith calls us to repentance and conversion. "Repent, therefore and be converted, that your sins will be wiped away." John writes in his first letter, "Jesus is expiation for our sins and not for our sins only but for those of the whole world." But we must come to know Jesus and the way to know him is "to keep his commandments." Those who say, I know him, but do not keep his commandments, John writes, "are liars and the truth is not in them." Keeping the commandments allows us to know the Lord and in knowing him we come to be filled with God's saving love.

Like those first followers of Jesus, we are often slow to understand and to believe. We allow our own doubts to cloud our vision. Our own sufferings and crosses can sometimes blind us to the loving and merciful presence of Jesus all around us. He brings us that same message of Easter: Peace be with you. Have no fear. It is I, the Lord. We have been invited to walk the way of faith, to keep God's commandments, to know deeply the Risen Lord so that God's love will fill our hearts and be our constant companion in life. Lord let your face shine on us.

FROM THE HEART OF OUR PASTOR, FATHER STUBNA

I continue to be very grateful for the faithful stewardship exercised by so many in our parish family. One of the precepts of the Church is to contribute out of our financial means to support the Church. Catholics do this primarily and regularly through the **weekly offertory collection** but there are other means in which we are invited to support the works of the Church with our contributions including the annual **Parish Share Appeal**. I am very mindful of the economic impact of the pandemic on individuals and families, some of whom

REFLECTIONS

have lost their jobs in this time. All that I can ask, as your pastor, is to be mindful of the ways in which we are called as followers of Jesus Christ and members of the Church to share what we have in support of the work of the Church and in charity to others. **It is important for our parishioners to know that we are "treading water" this year – not bleeding or adding to our debt, or using our reserves, but managing to operate on very thin ice.** Clearly, our financial resources are one of the driving forces in making decisions about what we can and cannot do in our parish regarding staffing, programs, ministry, outreach, service, facilities, and capital improvements.

I would like to provide a brief update on our parish finances for this fiscal year that began on July 1, 2020 and runs through June 30, 2021:

1. **Offertory contributions are running 20% behind last year.** On the positive side, those weekly collections have been on the increase in recent months and nearly 350 parishioners are now using the online option for their offertory contributions which is an increase of over 250% since the pandemic began.
2. With the help of our parish staff and parish finance council, we have been able to reduce our overall expenses considerably this year, by more than \$200,000 over budgeted costs. This has been a huge help in stabilizing our budget for this year.
3. A number of people in our parish have given donations to help offset the loss in offertory revenue. These gifts have been a significant help to us as we navigate the financial woes of the pandemic. I am deeply grateful to those benefactors whose kindness and generosity have truly helped our parish to operate and to continue to serve the needs of so many people who come to us for prayer and worship, and for assistance.
4. We have received, this year, several bequests from the estates of deceased parishioners. These bequests are typically used for extraordinary expenditures (like needed capital repairs) or placed in our savings. This year, because of the loss of offertory revenue, we have had to use these funds to balance our budget and pay our bills. How very grateful we are for those who remember the Cathedral parish in their wills. We pray regularly for all benefactors, living and deceased.

Again, all I can ask of each and every one of our parishioners is to do the best they can to be good and faithful stewards in support the Church. God requires of us the good use of our time, talent, and treasure as members of His Body, the Church, as we carry on the work of faith. Please use your weekly envelopes or register for online giving. As more people return to Mass, it is our hope that offertory revenue will continue to increase and that as a parish we can do the things we need to do for in service to God and his people. May God bless you for your generosity.

PARISH NEWS

SAINT OF THE WEEK. April 21 marks the feast of **SAINT ANSELM**, bishop and doctor of the Church. As a youth, Anselm became indifferent to his Catholic faith and spent years of dissolute living, not unlike Saint Augustine. But he had a deep sense of God calling him that led him to the monastery where he became a monk and within 15 years was elected Abbot. Anselm was a great thinker who loved analyzing and illuminating the truths of faith through the aid of human reason. He was known for his patience and gentleness as a teacher and helped to lead many of his students to greatness through his skills as a theologian. He wrote a number of theological works, perhaps best known for his natural proofs for the existence of God. At 60, against his will, he was elected the Archbishop of Canterbury, where he faced great antagonism and opposition to his reforms for the Church from King William Rufus and his successor brother, King Henry I. They tried to claim the right from the Church to appoint bishops and Anselm was forced into several exiles. He courageously fought to defend the faith and the rights of the Church. He had a great love for the poor and was the first in the Church to oppose the slave trade, already in the early 1100's. His teaching and preaching were done with the hope that all would come to discover God's love and his divine will and through faith be able to follow God's plan with courage and love.

QUESTION OF THE WEEK. A parishioner asked me why we publish the banns of marriage and other parishes do not. **ANSWER:** The banns of marriage were formerly required by the Catholic Church for three consecutive Sundays prior to the marriage ceremony. These were publicly read from the pulpit and often printed in the parish bulletins as a way of notifying the congregation of a pending marriage. The 1983 Code of Canon Law abolished the requirement for such banns to be published and in many ways the banns of marriage simply disappeared. I have previously re-instituted the publication of the banns of marriage and have done so for a few particular reasons. In a special way, the banns call to mind for our parish family those in the final stages of preparation for marriage. I would ask that in seeing the names of these couples we can make a special effort as a parish community to keep them in our prayers as they approach the holy and sacred bond of the Sacrament of Marriage. In addition, by recognizing those about to be married, we can join in their joy at this important moment of their lives and let them know how important they are to our parish family, whether they are parishioners of the Cathedral parish or not. It is a way, as well, of highlighting the beauty and importance of all those who are married and seeking marriage. We ask that God bless each of these couples and shower down upon them his abundant grace.

INSTALLATION OF AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATORS (AED's). We have recently upgraded and installed fully operative AED's in both Saint Paul Cathedral Church, Social Hall, Synod Hall, and in the Saint Rosalia site Church. Automated external defibrillators (AEDs) are portable, life-saving devices designed to treat people experiencing sudden cardiac arrest, a medical condition in which the heart stops beating suddenly and unexpectedly. The combination of CPR and early defibrillation is effective in saving lives when used in the first few minutes following collapse from sudden cardiac arrest. The AED system includes accessories, such as a battery and pad electrodes, that are necessary for the AED to detect and interpret an electrocardiogram and deliver an electrical shock. These are **public access AEDs** that can be found in churches, airports, community centers, schools, government buildings, hospitals, and other public locations. They are intended to be used by laypeople who have received minimal training. They are clearly marked and can be accessed easily by those medical professionals and others who have been trained in the case of an emergency. We will be providing some training opportunities for those interested once the pandemic restrictions are lifted allowing us to gather in groups safely.

ALTAR SERVERS. We are so grateful to those who are altar servers in our parish. They provide a beautiful ministry to help the priest be able to celebrate the Mass properly and worthily. We need more young people to help with the serving ministry at both our Saint Rosalia site and Saint Paul Cathedral. Anyone in 4th grade or above is welcome to help. Training is provided. We invite our parents to encourage your children and young people to serve. High school and college age students are needed to serve as well. Please consider assisting the parish in this important ministry. Call the parish office if you are interested and Father Stubna will get back to you. God bless.



OUR WEEKLY NOVENA TO OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL HELP takes place every Wednesday evening. Please consider attending our weekly novena and lifting up our prayers to Our Lady of Perpetual Help. SAINT PAUL CATHEDRAL PARISH FOOD PANTRY. The former food pantries serving Saint Paul Cathedral parish and Saint Rosalia parish have been combined into one parish food pantry over the past several months. We are happy to report that the food pantry is fully operational and serving many people with need in our communities. The food pantry is now operating out of the Saint Rosalia rectory (the former Saint Rosalia parish office). Currently the pantry distributes food supplies weekly every Tuesday from 2:00 pm until 3:00 pm. We have had wonderful support from our partner, the Greater Pittsburgh Community Food Bank. We have been able to secure many food supplies, including produce, milk, eggs, cheese, butter, and other dairy products as well as frozen meats, canned goods, and dry food supplies. We just recently received a \$3,000 grant from the Community Food Bank to help the Saint Paul Cathedral Food Pantry serve our clients in these challenging times. Many thanks to the parish volunteers who are stocking the food pantry, preparing the bags for distribution and for those meeting with our patrons and distributing the food. It is a wonderful and needed ministry and those who participate are so very grateful for the kindness and assistance they receive. With more and more people being vaccinated, we are hoping that some of our regular food pantry volunteers – as well as other interested people in our parish – will consider volunteering to help us in this ministry. Financial donations – including Giant Eagle gift cards – are more helpful to us at this time in meeting the needs of our clients.





CATHOLIC GUIDELINES ON CREMATION

On October 25, 2016, The Vatican published guidelines for Catholics who want to be cremated, saying their remains cannot be scattered, divided up or kept at home but rather stored in a sacred, church-approved place. For most of its 2,000-year history, the Catholic Church only permitted burial, arguing that it best expressed the Christian hope in resurrection. But in 1963, the Vatican explicitly allowed cremation as long as it didn't suggest a denial of faith about resurrection.

The new document from the Vatican's Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith repeats that burial remains preferred, with officials calling cremation a "brutal destruction" of the body. But it lays out guidelines for conserving ashes for the increasing numbers of Catholics who choose cremation for economic, ecological, or other reasons. It said it was doing so to counter what it called "new ideas contrary to the church's faith" that had emerged since 1963, including New Age-y ideas that death is a "fusion" with Mother Nature and the universe, or the "definitive liberation" from the prison of the body.

Catholicism teaches that all people will be resurrected – both body and soul – at the end of days. Cremation does not "prevent God, in his omnipotence, from raising up the deceased body to new life," the Vatican says, but it does raise the possibility that the deceased's body, which the church believes is sacred, will not be properly respected by ancestors and relatives. "By burying the bodies of the faithful, the Church confirms her faith in the resurrection of the body and intends to show the great dignity of the human body as an integral part of the human person whose body forms part of their identity," the new guidelines state.

To set the faithful straight, the Vatican said ashes and bone fragments cannot be kept at home, since that would deprive the Christian community as a whole of remembering the dead. Rather, church authorities should designate a sacred place, such as a cemetery or church area, to hold them. The document said remains cannot be divided among family members or put in lockets or other mementos. Nor can the ashes be scattered in the air, land, or sea since doing so would give the appearance of "pantheism, naturalism, or nihilism," the guidelines said. "The dead body isn't the private property of relatives, but rather a son of God who is part of the people of God," Mueller said. "We have to get over this individualistic thinking."

It repeated Church teaching that Catholics who choose to be cremated for reasons contrary to the Christian faith must be denied a Christian funeral. If the cremains are not properly buried in consecrated ground, a funeral liturgy cannot be celebrated for the deceased.
