# REFLECTIONS

## SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

“Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit.” These words of Jesus himself challenge each of us to a life of communion with the True Vine, the only one from whom we can draw life and grace. One of the fruits, from the gift of faith received in baptism, is union with God and the Church. We are joined through the action of the Holy Spirit fully and completely to Jesus Christ and his Body, the Church. But this gift is a fragile one. It must be nurtured and cultivated each day by seeking God’s grace through prayer and sacramental living and through our right conduct and manner of living.

In the second reading, Saint John speaks of how this communion with God is kept strong and safe. “Those who keep his commandments remain in him, and he in them.” Faith calls us to believe in the name of Jesus Christ. As Saint Peter proclaimed, “there is no other name through which we can be saved.” But this proclamation of faith is evidenced by love, the greatest of all the commandments of the law. We must work to love God with our whole heart, soul, mind, and strength and to love our neighbor as ourselves. Christ our Head has shown us the way. Like him, we must abandon our own wills and desires so that we can seek to fulfill the will of the One who made us and who has destined us to become his beloved children.

The early Christians faced such tremendous difficulties in their living out of the Christian faith. But the fruits of their labors spoke to their complete abandonment of will and trust in God. We read in the Acts of the Apostles today: “The Church was being built up and walked in the fear of the Lord, and with the consolation of the Holy Spirit it grew in numbers.” This is the hope that God has for each one of us and for the Church. This is what Jesus promises to all who believe in his name and live in faith. “If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want, and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much and become my disciples.”

So, we can pray with the psalmist: “I will praise you Lord in the assembly of your people. I will fulfill my vows before those who fear the Lord. The lowly shall eat their fill; they who seek the Lord shall praise him: May your hearts live forever. Amen.”

**FIRST HOLY COMMUNION** will be celebrated at Saint Paul Cathedral parish next Sunday, May 9 (Mothers' Day) at the 10:00 am Mass. All of those to receive first Holy Communion should have already been in contact with Terri Taormina, our Director for Religious Education. Please keep our first Holy Communion candidates in your prayers as well.

**POPE FRANCIS' PRAYER INTENTION FOR MAY:** Let us pray that those in charge of finance will work with governments to regulate the financial sphere and protect citizens from its dangers.

**MAY IS THE MONTH OF MARY.** I encourage everyone to make a special effort this month to look to the Blessed Mother in prayer and devotion. Families are encouraged as well to pray the rosary at home with their children, even once a week during May would be a wonderful blessing to your family. **THE ROSARY** is a formalized prayer routine often said with the help of rosary beads. It is traditionally attributed to St Dominic (1170-1221) who founded the Dominican Order. Although prayer beads were already in use for probably many centuries before St Dominic's time, it is believed that he preached its use following a vision from The Blessed Virgin Mary who was holding rosary beads in her hands. In more recent Marian visions, Our Lady has continued to promise her very special protection and blessings on all those who recite the rosary. **THE ROSARY** is a Scripture-based prayer. It begins with the *Apostles' Creed*, which summarizes the great mysteries of the Catholic faith. The *Our Father*, which introduces each mystery, is from the Gospels. The first part of the *Hail Mary* is the angel's words announcing Christ's birth and Elizabeth's greeting to Mary. Saint Pius V officially added the second part of the *Hail Mary*. There are four groups of Mysteries, the Joyful, Sorrowful, Luminous, and Glorious. Each group recalls major events in the life of Jesus and the Blessed Virgin Mary. Pope John Paul II suggested we pray each of the four Mysteries on the following days:

**Joyful Mysteries - Monday and Saturday**  
**Sorrowful Mysteries - Tuesday and Friday**  
**Glorious Mysteries - Wednesday and Sunday**  
**Luminous Mysteries - Thursday**

The repetition in the Rosary is meant to lead one into restful and contemplative prayer related to each Mystery. The gentle repetition of the words helps us to enter into the silence of our hearts, where Christ's spirit dwells. The Rosary can be said privately or with a group.

**SAINTS OF THE WEEK. May 3 is the feast day of Saints Philip and James.** We know nothing of Saint James, Son of Alphaeus, except his name, and, of course, the fact that Jesus chose him to be one of the 12 pillars of the New Israel, his Church. He is not the James of Acts, son of Clopas, “brother” of Jesus and later bishop of Jerusalem and the traditional author of the Letter of James. James, son of Alphaeus, is also known as James the Lesser to avoid confusing him with James the son of Zebedee, also an apostle and known as James the Greater.

Saint Philip came from the same town as Peter and Andrew, Bethsaida in Galilee. Jesus called him directly, whereupon he sought out Nathanael and told him of the “one about whom Moses wrote” (Jn 1:45). Like the other apostles, Philip took a long time coming to realize who Jesus was. On one occasion, when Jesus saw the great multitude following him and wanted to give them food, he asked Philip where they should buy bread for the people to eat. Saint John comments, “[Jesus] said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do” (Jn 6:6). Philip answered, “Two hundred days’ wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little [bit]” (Jn 6:7). John’s story is not a put-down of Philip. It was simply necessary for these men who were to be the foundation stones of the Church to see the clear distinction between humanity’s total helplessness apart from God and the human ability to be a bearer of divine power by God’s gift.

As in the case of the other apostles, we see in James and Philip human men who became foundation stones of the Church, and we are reminded again that holiness and its consequent apostolate are entirely the gift of God, not a matter of human achieving. All power is God’s power, even the power of human freedom to accept his gifts. “You will be clothed with power from on high,” Jesus told Philip and the others. Their first commission had been to expel unclean spirits, heal diseases, and announce the kingdom. They learned, gradually, that these externals were sacraments of an even greater miracle inside their persons—the divine power to love like God.

**PLEASE HELP TO KEEP OUR WORSHIP SITES, THE CATHEDRAL AND SAINT ROSALIA, NEAT AND CLEAN.** It is still disconcerting so see the manner in which some people leave the pews after they depart for Mass. We have found bulletins left behind, used Kleenex on the floor, cookies and candy on the floor and in the pews, and worship aids strewn all over the place. We are asking that each person who comes to worship with take some pride in our Churches and work to keep them neat and clean. This is the house of God and is deserving our utmost respect and care. If you bring the bulletin or worship aid into the pew, take it out with you; don’t leave it behind. If you see something out of place please help to clean up – it is the task of each of us to do what we can to help in this important task.

**EMAIL SCAMMING.** We have received word that a few parishioners and Diocesan employees have received emails or text messages coming from what appears to be diocesan or parish employees. These communications more than likely will have the Diocesan employees real name attached as the sender, while the email address will be from something completely different. These emails have many different formats including asking for gift cards, needing certain favors, or asking for other personal information. Please be aware that these are called SPAM / PHISHING emails and are not legitimate in nature. These emails should be ignored/deleted and never responded to or acted upon. While little can be done from the Diocesan IT department's end outside of blocking the emails as we are made aware of them, please feel confident that our systems have not been compromised. 

**HELPING OUR NEIGHBORS.** Catholic Charities (412-456-6999) has a long history of helping those in need in the greater Pittsburgh area, regardless of their faith. The Red Door (412-261-0110) provides food to the homeless, and Operation Safety Net (412-232-5739) helps homeless people with many services, eventually leading to permanent housing. You might ask, "What do we do to help our neighbors in need?" For years **Saint Paul Cathedral Parish** has operated a **Food Pantry**, and we continue to offer food every Tuesday afternoon at the rectory attached to St. Rosalia Church. Volunteers pack bags of food and distribute to those who ask. **Fishes and Loaves Cooperative Ministries** provides Meals on Wheels to neighbors in Hazelwood and Greenfield, along with a free lunch program Monday through Friday. They also provide emergency food to those who ask; they are one of the few pantries that deliver food to those who have no access to transportation. **Saint Vincent DePaul** and **Ladies of Charity** continue to help people in our area. Ladies of Charity maintain contact through phone calls and cards to some of our homebound parishioners. The beauty is that ALL these ministries are staffed by volunteers from our parish – from all four of the former parishes. 




