REFLECTIONS

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

In returning from their mission, the disciples are filled with excitement about “all they had done and taught.” No doubt, Jesus wants them to reflect more deeply on the cause of their joy. It is not their labors that should be celebrated, but the Holy Spirit working through them! It is God who first chose them and sent them out and gave them the power and strength to accomplish his will. This is why Jesus invites them to “come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while.” How important that there is time to rest in God, to open our hearts to the power of grace and the life of the Holy Spirit that comes from God alone.

We too can often get caught up in our own activities. We can easily put the focus on our accomplishments and success and be filled with a false sense of pride. As Saint Paul writes, “brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have become near by the blood of Christ...through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father.” Rooting ourselves firmly to God in and through prayer leads to humility, the real cause of our joy. We are the instruments of God and his designs. The goal is to allow ourselves to be led by the power of the Holy Spirit to accomplish what God desires of us. As the Psalmist reminds us: “He guides me in right paths for his name’s sake. Even though I walk in the dark valley I fear no evil; for you are at my side with your rod and staff that give me courage.”

This dependence on God and openness to his way ultimately leads us out of ourselves to a greater awareness and concern for the needs of others. What a beautiful description in today’s Gospel when Jesus disembarks and sees the vast crowd: “his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd.” He began to teach them, to care for them, to heal them and lead them forth to an experience of the saving and tender love of his Father. So it is for each of us. We must see those around us and be filled with compassion and love – striving always to bring the love of God and his mercy to those around us. Pope Francis has asked each of us to be about the work of evangelization. Sharing the Good News of faith in love with joyful hearts, companions for the journey here on earth so that we can lead others to fullness of life in Christ Jesus.

FROM THE HEART OF OUR PASTOR, FATHER STUBNA

1. **DOCUMENT ON THE HOLY EUCHARIST.** *The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops* voted overwhelming at their June meeting to write a document on the importance of the Eucharist. The Second Vatican Council said that the “Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of all that Christians believe and practice.” How desperately we need this teaching of the Church to be affirmed, particularly in the face of a growing secularized culture. Already the media – and sadly, Catholics themselves – have blasted the bishops of our country for even considering such a document. Despite what you may hear in the media, this is not a political document. It is the responsibility and duty of the bishops, successors to Peter, to teach the faith. Many Catholics today do not even believe in the real presence and yet Catholic teaching has never wavered on our belief that the Eucharist contains the real

presence of Jesus, His Sacred Body and Blood, his entire body, soul, and divinity made truly present in the Eucharistic species. We can't be Catholic if we do not believe in the real presence; we can't be Catholic if we don't believe all that the Church teaches and believes; and we certainly can't call ourselves Catholic if we don't practice what we believe. Sadly, many people want to call themselves Catholic but have rejected major teachings of the Catholic faith. As Bishop Zubik said: *"The Eucharist is the source and summit of our life as Catholics. It is crucial for all Catholics to understand that truth that when we receive the Eucharist, we receive Jesus Himself. The U.S. Bishops have given support to a drafting committee to work on a document that will help every Catholic to better understand the Eucharist and to live accordingly. It is crucial for all Catholics to understand the truth that when we receive the Eucharist, we receive Jesus Himself and are united more closely to Him in the Church."* What a blessing this document will be when it is completed and promulgated.

- EUCCHARISTIC DEVOTION.** As a parish we have made a commitment to help the faithful grow in their love for the Holy Eucharist and to provide the faithful regular opportunities to pray before the Blessed Sacrament. As your pastor, I encourage you and your families to take advantage of these special opportunities:
 - Attending Sunday and weekday Masses, of course, is at the center of our Catholic life and faith.
 - The Cathedral is open for prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament in the tabernacle from 7:30 am – 4:00 pm.
 - Every Wednesday evening, we have a Holy Hour from 7:00 – 8:00 pm with Eucharistic Adoration from 7:00 – 7:30 pm, followed the Novena to our Mother of Perpetual Help and Benediction from 7:30 – 8:00 pm.
 - The last Sunday of every month (except July and August) our parish has a monthly afternoon of Eucharistic adoration from 1:00 until 5:00 pm with Solemn Vespers and Benediction celebrated at 5:00 pm.
- COFFEE AND DONUT SUNDAYS.** At the suggestion of the parish pastoral council, it is our hope that our parish can have two Fellowship (Coffee and Donut) Sundays each month beginning in September. It is our hope to have one at our Saint Rosalia site after the 9:00 am Mass on the First Sunday of each month and one at Saint Paul Cathedral after the 10:00 am and the 12:00 noon Masses on the Second Sunday of each month. These are Saint Paul Cathedral parish sponsored gatherings and we are looking for volunteers in our parish to get involved with us to make these gatherings a success. We will have a coordinator for each site but need as many other volunteers as possible to get involved and be part of this important effort. We want to be able to bring our parish family together in hospitality, welcome and fellowship. It will be a great opportunity for members of our parish family to get to know each other and to come together as a family. Anyone who wants to help can contact the parish office and we will begin to get a list of volunteers together for our coordinators.

SAINT OF THE WEEK. July 14 marks the feast of **SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA**, the first Native American to be canonized. Her mother was a Christian, taken captive and given as wife to the chief of the Mohawk clan. When Kateri was only four she lost both of her parents and her brother. She was badly disfigured in a smallpox epidemic. She refused to marry a Mohawk brave and at the age of 19 converted to the Catholic faith. She was from that time forward treated like a slave and her life was in danger because of her conversion. She stole away and made a 200-mile walking trek to a Christian Indian village in Montreal. There she grew in holiness under the direction of a priest and at the age of 23 took the permanent vow of virginity, an unprecedented act for an Indian woman, whose maintenance and security in life depended on being married. She practiced severe fasting and penance, devoted long hours to prayer – all for the conversion of her tribe. She died on Holy Thursday and some around said "her emaciated face changed color and became like that of a healthy child." She is known as the "Lily of the Mohawks," canonized by Pope Benedict in October 2012. She is an example for us of finding love and joy even in adversity and struggles, seeking always through prayer, fasting and works of charity to grow in holiness and love for God and others.
