REFLECTIONS

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

FROM A HOMILY BY POPE JOHN PAUL II IN 1997. Today's liturgy sets before us the radiant icon of the Blessed Virgin who was taken up into heaven in the integrity of her body and soul. In the splendor of heavenly glory shines the One who, by reason of her humility, was made great in the sight of the Most High to the point that all generations call her blessed (cf. Lk 1:48). Now, as Queen, she sits beside her Son in the eternal happiness of paradise and looks upon her children from on high.

With this consoling certainty, we turn to her and call on her for those who are her children: for the Church and for all humanity, so that everyone, by imitating her faithful following of Christ, may reach the definitive homeland of heaven. The first among those redeemed by Christ's paschal sacrifice, Mary shines forth today as Queen of us all, pilgrims on our way to immortal life.

In her, assumed into heaven, we are shown the eternal destiny that awaits us beyond the mystery of death: a destiny of total happiness in divine glory. This supernatural vision sustains our daily pilgrimage. Mary teaches about life. By looking at her, we understand better the relative value of earthly greatness and the full sense of our Christian vocation.

From her birth to her glorious Assumption, her life unfolded on a journey of faith, hope and charity. These virtues, which blossomed in a humble heart abandoned to God's will, are those adorning her precious, incorruptible crown as Queen. These are virtues which the Lord asks of all believers, if they are to share in his Mother's glory.

The passage from Revelation just proclaimed speaks of the enormous red dragon that represents the perennial temptation facing man: to prefer evil to good, death to life, the easy pleasure of disengagement to the demanding but rewarding journey of holiness for which everyone has been created. In the fight against "the great dragon ... that ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, the deceiver of the whole world" (Rv 12:9), there appears the great sign of the victorious Virgin, Queen of glory, seated at the Lord's right hand. And in this spiritual battle her help to the Church is decisive for attaining the ultimate victory over evil.

Mary shines on earth "until the day of the Lord shall come, a sign of certain hope and comfort to the pilgrim People of God" (Lumen gentium, n. 68). A caring mother to everyone, she supports the efforts of believers and encourages them to persevere in their commitment. Here I am thinking most particularly of young people, who are more exposed to the attractions and temptations of fleeting myths and false teachers.

Dear young people, look to Mary and call upon her with trust! May Mary help you to feel that you are an integral part of the Church and spur you not to be afraid of assuming your responsibilities as credible witnesses to God's love. Today, Mary assumed into heaven shows you where love and complete fidelity to Christ on earth lead: to the eternal joy of heaven.

FROM THE HEART OF OUR PASTOR, FATHER STUBNA

1. Many thanks to everyone who helped to make the Mass in celebration of San Lorenzo a beautiful and inspiring experience. Nearly 150 gathered at Saint Regis Church on Sunday, August 1 for this celebration and I was delighted to celebrate the Mass in Italian and English. To the members of the San Lorenzo-Gamberale Society, Jeannie Johnson, Ken Danchik and the choir, servers, and readers and those who prepared the reception especially Linda Elachko and Lisa Sciulli - it was a great day to celebrate our Italian roots and tradition in honor of the great patron, San Lorenzo. We collected \$550 through the devotion to the statues of San Lorenzo and the prayer requests made.
2. **ALL EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION IN OUR PARISH** - and those interested in this ministry - are asked to attend a meeting scheduled for **MONDAY, AUGUST 30** from 6:30 until 8:00 pm in the Cathedral. This is our annual training and updating for those who serve in this important ministry. Please make every effort to attend. Only those who are in full compliance to the safe environment policies of the Diocese of Pittsburgh are eligible to serve as a volunteer. I would ask all of our EEMs (regardless of what Church site you typically serve) make every effort to attend this meeting.

THE ANNUAL MASS AT OUR LADY'S PARKWAY SHRINE will be celebrated on Tuesday, August 17, at 6:30 pm. The Mass will be followed by the recitation of the Rosary. Father Stubna will celebrate this Mass. This is an annual event celebrated at this unique shrine to Our Lady that overlooks the Parkway East. The shrine is located off the Boulevard of the Allies from the City of Pittsburgh, passing by Bates Street, and then make an immediate right onto Ward Street. At the end of the street, turn left. The small alley does not allow many cars, so you need to proceed on foot down the alley to the shrine. Wear appropriate shoes and have some help to make it to the shrine. All are welcome.

LECTORS FOR DAILY MASS. We are in need of lectors for both the 8:15 am and 12:05 pm Masses at Saint Paul Cathedral. We are happy to provide training for those who may desire to serve in this ministry. Compliance to the safe environment policies of the diocese is a requirement. Even if you can only serve once or twice a month this would be a significant help in addressing our current needs. It is a wonderful ministry of proclaiming God's Word for the faithful at Mass. PARISH NEWS

THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION OF MARY is a very old feast of the Church, celebrated universally by the sixth century. The feast was originally celebrated in the East, where it is known as the Feast of the Dormition, a word which means “the falling asleep.” The earliest printed reference to the belief that Mary’s body was assumed into Heaven dates from the fourth century, in a document entitled “The Falling Asleep of the Holy Mother of God.” The document is written in the voice of the Apostle John, to whom Christ on the Cross had entrusted the care of His mother, and recounts the death, laying in the tomb, and assumption of the Blessed Virgin. Tradition variously places Mary’s death at Jerusalem or at Ephesus, where John was living.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven at the end of her earthly life is a defined dogma of the Catholic Church. On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII, exercising papal infallibility, declared in “Munificentissimus Deus” that it is a dogma of the Church “that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory.” As a dogma, the Assumption is a required belief of all Catholics; anyone who publicly dissents from the dogma, Pope Pius declared, “has fallen away completely from the divine and Catholic Faith.”

As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* proclaims: “Finally the Immaculate Virgin Mary, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death.” (CCC 966). The Assumption of the Blessed Mother is a singular participation in the Resurrection of her Son, but it is also the sign and hope for every Christian of the resurrection of the body at the final judgment.

WE WELCOME LAUREN MARIE GAULT and her family and friends today who will attend the 12:00 Noon Mass at the Cathedral. Bishop Zubik will preside at this Mass where Lauren Marie will express her resolution to embrace the call to be a Consecrated Virgin Living in the World. This is a lesser-known vocation in the Church but an important one. Consecrated Virgins embrace the promise of lifelong virginity, prayer, and service in the Church. Unlike religious men and women, they do not live in community but contribute to the work of the Church by their fidelity to the Gospel and a life of prayer and service. There are two other consecrated virgins living in the Diocese of Pittsburgh at this time as well. We extend our prayers and support to Lauren as she embraces this call from God.

PARISH NEWS

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

August 16 marks the Feast of **SAINT STEPHEN OF HUNGARY**, King of Hungary in the ninth century. He brought the Christian faith to Hungary and battled the pagans. He established a system of tithes to support Churches and to help the poor. His generosity to those in need was immense. He lived a life of simplicity and love, desiring that all would know the Gospel and be lifted up in the practice of their Christian faith.

On **August 19** we remember **SAINT JOHN EUDES**. Ordained a priest at 24, he volunteered to care for the sick during the several plagues in 1627 and 1631. He became a parish missionary and was known as an extraordinary preacher and confessor, preaching over 100 parish missions. He founded a new religious community known as the Eudists or Congregation of Jesus and Mary devoted to the formation of clergy and seminarians. He was also deeply touched by the sad life of prostitutes, many of them unable to escape their miserable lives. He founded a new religious community, the Sisters of Charity of the Refuge who continue this day providing for prostitutes desiring to change their lives. His devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Mary as the model of Christian life speak to us of God's mercy and love calling us to holiness.

On **August 20**, we celebrate the feast of **SAINT BERNARD**, abbot and doctor of the Church. Bernard, along with his five brothers, two uncles and 30 friends joined the monastic community of Citeaux and the dying community was revitalized. They established a nearby monastery renamed Clairvaux, the valley of light. Bernard was involved in settling many disputes and became advisor to several Popes, his wisdom and eloquence were so well known that he was sought after greatly, particularly in fighting the Albigensian heresy. He wrote 86 sermons on the Canticle of Canticles. He devoted a great deal of time each day to prayer and had a tremendous devotion to the Blessed Mother.

POPE ST. PIUS X is honored on **August 21**, perhaps best remembered for his encouragement of the frequent reception of Holy Communion, especially by children. He lowered the age for the reception of Communion to the age of reason. He was known for his simplicity of life: "I was born poor, I live poor, and I will die poor." He fought for the separation of the Church from the political sphere and his immense concern and generosity for the poor. His motto was "To Renew All Things in Christ," and he led the fight against modernism in the Church.

The saints are men and women who endured great hardships and sufferings, even death, but held fast to their Catholic faith. They not only preached the Good News but gave witness to what they believed by their lives of holiness, love, service, and trust in God. They are examples to each of us and serve as the heroes that we can look to for inspiration and help as we work every day to grow in our faith, and in our love for God and neighbor.

For those who still need to complete this workshop, the email notification, which you have received or will receive, is sent from the National Catholic Risk Retention Group, VIRTUS.

- This email explains that you go to www.virtusonline.org
- When on the VIRTUS homepage, the login box is located in the upper left section of the page. This is where you enter your username and password.
- Your original login credentials were migrated from Austin Computing to the VIRTUS platform when the Diocese of Pittsburgh PGC Office switched providers in the spring of 2021.
- Can't remember your original credentials? Click *Need login information* in red font.
- Still experiencing difficulties? Click *Contact Information* located across the top of the homepage, almost to the far right of the page.
- You can then either click *Online Help* for assistance or call the VIRTUS Help Desk at 1-888-847-8870.

ADULT CHILDREN need to be registered separately in the parish. It is important that adult children, those who are out of school and most probably working, register in the parish as a separate individual. The registration form supplies us with the information not on their parent's record. Adults must be registered in their own name, not as a child on their parent's registration. This is critically important if you desire to obtain an eligibility certificate to be a godparent, when you approach the Church to get married, or even to have your own children baptized. Often times adults forget that they need to have their own standing in the Church as a separate person. Please take the time to complete a registration form in your own name.



COVID Procedures Updates for the Diocese of Pittsburgh

As variants of the COVID-19 virus continue to spread, the Diocese of Pittsburgh is updating safety procedures at Mass and Bishop David Zubik is urging everyone to get vaccinated and to wear masks when indoors with others.

Effective immediately:

- All ministers of the Eucharist, ushers and greeters must wear masks while engaging in their ministries, regardless of their vaccination status.
- As a change in a previous announcement, outdoor Masses may continue until further notice. (Previously it was announced that outdoor Masses would cease as of September 1.)

Bishop Zubik met virtually on Friday August 6, 2021, with all the Catholic bishops of Pennsylvania and signed their joint statement about COVID safety and the Mass. As previously announced, the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days will resume on the weekend of August 14-15, but with the age-old exemptions for those who are sick, at risk, are caregivers and also for those with concerns about being in a crowd due to COVID.

Each bishop was also expected to make his own statement based on conditions in each diocese.

"Our response to the pandemic falls under the commandment, 'Love your neighbor as yourself,'" Bishop Zubik wrote in the attached letter to clergy of the Diocese of Pittsburgh.

"For us as members of the Church of Pittsburgh, any response to COVID must be guided by the Catholic social principles of solidarity and the common good. It is impossible in these circumstances to make decisions that affect one person alone. COVID affects the whole community, so we must act with the whole community in mind."

He urged everyone to follow CDC guidance with regard to masks and vaccinations, adding that public officials have given assurance that there is no shortage of vaccine for anyone living within the six-county Diocese of Pittsburgh.

"Even those who have been vaccinated can carry and spread the virus, but research continues to show that masking provides significant protection for you and those with whom you interact. In the words of Pope Francis, vaccination and masking are 'acts of charity,'" Bishop Zubik wrote. It is also important to note that both Pope emeritus Benedict XVI and Pope Francis have themselves been vaccinated.

Given the rapidly changing dynamics of the COVID-19 virus, the bishop wrote that these policies could change "based on the best practices and guidance of county, state, and federal public health officials."
