REFLECTIONS

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

We reach a dramatic point in the conversation Jesus is having with his disciples about the Eucharist. "My flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. Whoever does not eat my flesh and drink my blood does not have life within in." It is not surprising that his followers remarked: "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" It is that way with the teachings of Jesus. The Gospel is not for the faint of heart. The way set out for those who seek salvation is the way of the Cross. The path is a difficult one. But we are guided always by grace and the hand of God. "The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life," Jesus says. But many drift away, falling back to the comfortable and easy ways of sin. He asks the Twelve: "Do you also want to leave?" It is Peter, who once again makes his act of faith: "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life."

Each day we are asked that same question. Do we want to follow Jesus and his Way, or do we desire to go in another direction? This is what Joshua sets before the Israelites: "If it does not please you to serve the Lord, decide today whom you will serve, the gods of your fathers or the gods of the Amorites." Like Peter, Joshua throws his lot in with the God who has set them free from bondage and has called them to be his people: "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."

Saint Paul in our second reading speaks of the beauty of marriage as the mirror or reflection of the way in which God loves us and we are called to love him. "Husbands, love your wives even as Christ loved the Church." We can easily fail to see what is at the heart of this teaching: selfless, unconditional love, a love that sacrifices itself easily one for the other – just as husbands and wives do so readily for each other in marriage as they seek to live out their covenant with fidelity and create a holy family. We are members of the body of Christ, redeemed and saved through the blood of his sacrifice on the Cross – the greatest act of selfless love given by God for each of us. As we are lifted up and redeemed by this gift, we must embrace and live that way ourselves. "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord. I will bless the Lord at all times; his praise shall be ever in my mouth."

May we stand with Peter and the others in acclaiming our God each day, the God who calls us out of nothing, has claimed us as his own, leads us forward, embraces us with his love and desires our eternal salvation. May we make that same acclamation of faith each day: "You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

The Stations of the Cross with our pastor Father Stubna can be viewed every Friday at 3:30 pm on the Christian Associates Channel. Morning Prayer with Bishop Zubik can be seen each at 8:00 am and the Rosary follows the 8:15 am Mass until 9:00 am but is broadcast in its entirety at 10:00 pm each evening. We are grateful to the television ministry volunteers at the Cathedral who help to make this ministry to the elderly and homebound possible.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

SAINT ROSE OF LIMA is celebrated on **August 23**. She is the first canonized saint of the new world, having been born in Lima, Peru. Rose was blessed with great physical beauty, and because she was admired so much, she felt that would endanger her desire to give herself completely to God. She was extreme in her acts of mortification, even wearing a crown of thorns on her head, and fought her parents in their desire that she should marry, refusing to let her enter a convent. She continued to live a life of penance, solitude, and prayer at home. During the last few years of her life, she opened up her home to care for homeless children, the elderly, and the sick. When she died at the age of 31, the entire city came out for her funeral.

SAINT BARTHOLOMEW, an apostle of Jesus, is remembered on **August 24**. Jesus says of him, “Here is a true Israelite; there is no duplicity in him.” He was one of the followers of Jesus who witnessed the Risen Christ – a man about whom little is known but whose response of love and faith to the call of the Lord to serve him and the Church is an inspiration to every Christian. Living out our faith may not bring recognition or praise from others, but God sees our love and our faith, and will reward us with the crown of victory. Bartholomew is said to have preached the Gospel in India and Armenia where he was martyred for his faith and achieved the crown of victory in the name of Jesus Christ.

On **August 27** we remember **SAINT MONICA** the mother of Saint Augustine whose feast day we celebrate on August 28. St. Monica was a Christian who was married to a pagan, Patricius. St. Monica suffered greatly as her husband had a violent temper and lived a rather dissolute lifestyle. Her mother-in-law who lived in the house also treated St. Monica terribly for many years. Interestingly, it was St. Monica’s example of piety and charity that led both her husband and mother-in-law to embrace the Christian faith before they died. Monica grieved over her son’s immoral lifestyle and rejection of the Christian faith. But she continued to love him, staying close to him and fasting, and praying every day for his conversion. Her prayers were answered when St. Augustine came under the influence of Saint Ambrose, bishop of Milan, and eventually was baptized and received into the Catholic Church. She stands for us as an example of the call to trust in God, persevere in prayer and give witness by leading a life of charity and goodness for others.

August 28 marks the feast of **SAINT AUGUSTINE**. As we know from his famous autobiography *The Confessions*, he searched for years to find the answers to the questions of his heart. He had rejected Christian faith and studied all other religions and philosophies, led a life of immorality like his father, but was saved by the grace of God who brought St. Augustine to his senses. He met Saint Ambrose in Milan whose sermons removed his intellectual objections to Christianity. He struggled greatly with chastity but found strength in the writings of Saint Anthony the Abbot and Saint Paul – and God gave him the grace through prayer. It was St. Augustine who wrote, “My heart is restless until it rests in Thee, O God.” After his conversion, St. Augustine became a priest and the bishop of Hippo where he preached vigorously in defense of the faith and wrote extensively especially on the efficacy of God’s grace. It is grace that has the power to forgive sins and redeem the human person, the fruit of the Redemption won for us through the Passion and Death of Jesus Christ on the Cross. St. Augustine stands for us a sign of hope that we too can go from sinner to saint by the power of God’s grace at work in us if we come to our senses and embrace the Truth and the Love of God.

- This email explains that you go to www.virtusonline.org
- When on the VIRTUS homepage, the login box is located in the upper left section of the page. This is where you enter your username and password.
- Your original login credentials were migrated from Austin Computing to the VIRTUS platform when the Diocese of Pittsburgh PGC Office switched providers in the spring of 2021.
- Can't remember your original credentials? Click *Need login information* in red font.
- Still experiencing difficulties? Click *Contact Information* located across the top of the homepage, almost to the far right of the page.
- You can then either click *Online Help* for assistance or call the VIRTUS Help Desk at 1-888-847-8870.




