

REFLECTIONS

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Isaiah brings a message of hope and consolation to those facing the tribulations and trials of life. This is a message that is meant for our ears and hearts as well. "Say to those whose hearts are frightened; be strong and fear not! Here is your God." How often the difficulties of life can burden us down and overwhelm our spirits. We can all too easily lose hope and find ourselves doubting and questioning our faith in God and in his merciful love.

Saint James reminds the early Christians of their status through grace and the Holy Spirit as beloved sons and daughters of God. Faith has lifted them out of their misery and given them the consolation, strength, joy, and peace of ones who have become radiant in God's love. "Did not God choose those who are poor in this world to be rich in faith and heirs to the kingdom?"

We see the power and glory of God manifested through Jesus in the healings and miracles he performs. The deaf man came to Jesus unable to hear the Word of God. It is Jesus who puts his finger in the man's ears and immediately his impediment was removed. God had made him whole again. St. Mark's Gospel has Jesus instructing those who come to realize who he is to be quiet and not to tell anyone – the great Messianic secret of the Gospel of Mark – but the reality is different. Those who have been touched by God's grace and lifted up out of their misery cannot contain their joy and so "the more he ordered them not to, the more they proclaimed it. He has done all things well."

We are invited through faith to come to Jesus, over and over again, receiving his own Body and Blood in Holy Communion and his mercy and forgiveness in confession. But we receive his Spirit through prayer and our life in the Church. We are richly blessed through this personal encounter with Jesus. Our eyes and ears are opened, but so are our hearts. And coming to know God's unconditional love and his desire for our salvation, we too are led to proclaim his goodness. With the Psalmist we can exclaim, "Praise the Lord my soul" and with Mary we can proclaim "My soul magnifies the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior."

FROM THE HEART OF OUR PASTOR, FATHER STUBNA

1. I continue to receive a great deal of emails and letters about the reception of Holy Communion. Some people are upset that others are receiving Holy Communion on the tongue and not on the hand. We have asked – at the bishop's request and in light of safety protocols from CDC – that people consider receiving Holy Communion in the hand as the safest option to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and other germs. The bishop did not mandate this practice. The faithful are permitted by Church law to receive Holy Communion on the tongue or in the hand and we cannot deny anyone the right to do this. However, we are asking out of charity and concern for their neighbor, that people please receive Holy Communion in the hand for the time being. The priest, deacon, and EEM who are distributing communion have been trained to take every precaution in distributing Holy Communion to keep everyone safe. If we do come in contact with anyone's mouth – which is very rare – we immediately stop and sanitize our hands

2. **PARISH SHARE UPDATE.** Many thanks to all who have made a gift or pledge to this year's Parish Share Program. In the past five months, we have had **382 people/families make gifts and/or pledges totaling \$154,703.10**. We are making progress towards our parish goal of \$215,000 but we need everyone's help in reaching our target. Half of the goal is our obligation to the diocese for this year's PSP; the other half remains in our parish to help with our expenses and ministries. RELIGIOUS SIGNIFICANCE OF LABOR DAY. Labor Day was instituted as a national holiday on June 28, 1894, a day set aside to honor the working men, women and children who were the industrial foundation of America. But for Catholics the "gospel of work" needs to be proclaimed again every Labor Day. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* helps us with these insights: "Human work proceeds directly from persons created in the image of God and called to prolong the work of creation by subduing the earth, both with and for one another. Hence work is a duty: 'If anyone will not work, let him not eat.' Work honors the Creator's gifts and the talents received from him. It can also be redemptive. By enduring the hardship of work in union with Jesus, the carpenter of Nazareth and the one crucified on Calvary, man collaborates in a certain fashion with the Son of God in his redemptive work. He shows himself to be a disciple of Christ by carrying the cross, daily, in the work he is called to accomplish. Work can be a means of sanctification and a way of animating earthly realities with the Spirit of Christ. In work, the person exercises and fulfills in part the potential inscribed in his nature. The primordial value of labor stems from man himself, its author and its beneficiary. Work is for man, not man for work. Everyone should be able to draw from work the means of providing for his life and that of his family, and of serving the human community. The primordial value of labor stems from man himself, its author and beneficiary. By means of his labor man participates in the work of creation. Work united to Christ can be redemptive." No matter what we are doing as work we are to do it as unto the Lord." It changes the world, both within us and around us. That means all work—not just the "spiritual stuff." All human work sanctifies us and changes the world.

A SPECIAL COLLECTION FOR THE BISHOP'S EDUCATION FUND is scheduled for next weekend, September 11-12. Please use your envelope for this collection or mark in the memo line of your check: Bishop's Education Fund. Since this fund was established in 1995, more than \$25 million has been raised to help our students who attend Catholic schools. In the past 25 years, over \$20 million in assistance has been given to the more than 50,000 children from nearly every parish in the diocese, including a number of families from our parish who attend Catholic schools. Many students in the diocese want a Catholic school education but a number of those students can only do so with financial assistance. The Bishop's Education Fund makes such assistance possible. I would ask that you be as generous as you can. So many of us attended Catholic schools when it was free, or the cost was minimal. This was in large part to the huge sacrifices of the religious sisters and brothers who taught, often for very little. Many of our families desire to send their children to a Catholic school and make great sacrifices, but they need assistance in making this a reality. Catholic schools do give the great beginnings that last a lifetime. Your generosity in this collection will help a number of children with financial need. Thank you.

SAINT OF THE WEEK. September 9 marks the feast of **SAINT PETER CLAVER**. A native of Spain, Peter Claver became a Jesuit and a missionary to the slaves in Cartegena (Columbia). Peter Claver would board the slave ships and tend to the abused and ill-treated slaves. He would bring medicine and food, as many supplies as he could muster, and share with them the Good News of Jesus Christ. He lifted them up in their misery by reminding them of their dignity as children of God and assuring them of God's love even in those most horrible and dire situations. During the 40 years of his ministry, Peter Claver reportedly baptized more than 300,000 slaves. He preached against the abuse of slavery to all in Cartegena and suffered at the hands of many for his message. Peter Claver would tell others: "We must speak to them with our hands before we try to speak to them with our lips." This was a call to generosity, to compassion, to love and service to those most neglected and in need.

PRAYER OF REMEMBRANCE FOR THE ANNIVERSARY OF 9/11 (September 11, 2001). This date, 9-11, carries a heavy burden of memory. This day does not pass in the calendar without our remembering. We remember images of death and destruction. Images that human eyes were never meant to see. We remember words our ears were never meant to hear, the tender last words of *husbands and wives who would never embrace again*.

We imagine the feeling of emptiness in the arms of children who at the end of the day could not find mom or dad for their welcome home hug. We remember our own feelings of emptiness as our sense of security, as our own confidence in the predictable order of life and work was radically shaken.

We remember the heroism of the many that lost their lives in saving others. We remember all those who suffered and died, we grieve for them still, friends and strangers alike, along with their families and friends.

And it is right that it should not pass from our memory. But today and in this prayer, along with our remembrance of profound loss, it also seems right that we give voice to our deep longing for peace, and with this prayer, commit ourselves to those actions that will draw us closer to our most ancient and most holy desire, peace among all God's children. Lord, grant us peace. Amen.

PARENTS OF CHILDREN MAKING THEIR FIRST HOLY COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION THIS YEAR are reminded that you must contact Father Stubna immediately. An information sheet must be completed and returned to Father Stubna no later than November 7. Diocesan policy requires that all sacraments are to be received in the parish where the child belongs; any exceptions to this will need the expressed written permission of Father Stubna. Families must be registered, actively attending Mass, and supporting the parish to which they belong.

PARENTS ARE REMINDED that diocesan guidelines require that all children receiving sacraments must have at least two years of catechetical instruction prior to receiving First Penance and First Holy Communion (so you must attend classes regularly in 1st and 2nd grade) and the Sacrament of Confirmation (regular attendance at class is required for 7th and 8th grade). The pastor has the responsibility to determine a candidate's readiness to receive the sacraments and this obligation for catechetical instruction is a serious one. In addition, it is expected that parents will be taking their children to Mass on Sunday on a regular basis. It makes no sense to receive the sacraments, or to receive catechetical instruction, if our families are not attending Mass and receiving the sacraments regularly. Attendance at religious education class is required.

4. The monthly Wine, Cheese and the Gospel is livestreamed as well.


