REFLECTIONS

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

We have the powerful profession of faith given by Peter in the Gospel today. "Who do you say that I am" is the question that Jesus poses to his disciples. Others have been saying he is Elijah or John the Baptist or one of the prophets. It is Peter who makes the confession: "You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God." Peter may have had his faults and weaknesses, and he goes on to deny Jesus three times at the Passion. Even in the Gospel today, Peter makes his act of faith but then immediately rejects the notion that faith will require the suffering and death that Jesus speaks about. But his act of faith is important; it is a sign of his belief in Jesus Christ and his willingness in his heart to put his trust in the Lord.

But faith requires action. "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow in my steps," Jesus says. Faith demands the same kind of self-emptying love that Jesus gives for the forgiveness of our sins and the salvation of the world. Faith implies a life of service, humility, and love. St. James speaks about those who claim to have faith, but do not have good works. "Faith of itself, if it does not have good works, is dead." Our profession of faith in Jesus Christ impels us outwards so that what we believe and profess is made manifest in our lives. If we care little for the needs of others, what good is our faith?

Isaiah speaks of the cost of discipleship. "I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting." The work of a prophet was anything but easy; but it is a mission guided always by the hand of God. Our call to faith and holiness requires actions that speak to our core beliefs. Being a person of faith can often bring us derision and difficulty, especially in a world that is highly secular and hostile to Christian teaching and beliefs. But we are led each day by the hand of God who made us, gave us life, sustains us in grace, and has destined us for the glory of eternal life. We must sing with the psalmist: "I will walk before the Lord in the land of the living," keeping our eyes focused on Jesus Christ, making not only our profession of faith in his holy name, but embracing in our lives each day the conduct that is worthy of our calling. With Saint Paul, we are called "to demonstrate my faith to you from my works."

2. **PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN version 3.2.** There seems to be some confusion among our volunteers regarding the new 3.2 version of Protecting God's Children. It is a requirement, not optional, that every volunteer in our parish must complete Protecting God's Children version 3.2. Virtus attempted to email every volunteer in our database but in many cases the emails "bounced back". This could have resulted from someone changing their email address without notifying us to change it in the safe environment database, or it could have gone to your junk mailbox. Whatever the reason, even if you did not get an email, every single volunteer must complete the updated 3.2 version of Protecting God's Children. Once completed you will print up your certificate and give to the parish office in person or by mail or email. I am asking our volunteers to complete this as soon as possible or you will no longer be in compliance, and you will be unable to volunteer. Directions about how to access the program online have been in the bulletin for the past number of weeks, including today's bulletin. If you have any problems, you can contact our office manager, Mike Pittek at the rectory and we can direct your concern to the safe environment coordinators. BISHOP ZUBIK'S STATEMENT ON RELIGIOUS EXEMPTIONS FROM COVID-19 VACCINES:

Recently there has been an increase of requests to many of you and in my office for letters to assist those seeking a religious exemption from receiving a COVID vaccine. The Holy Father himself has strongly encouraged vaccines and has held vaccination clinics at the Vatican. Pope Francis has gone as far as to say that being vaccinated is an act of love. Because the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith has said it is morally acceptable to receive the FDA approved vaccines, as Church we support that interpretation and at the same time are not in the position to affirm any exemption from receiving the vaccination as a religious exemption.

An individual may have objections based on his or her personal conscience. But this is not a matter of a religious belief but rather of one's own conscience. **Once again, neither the diocese nor any of its parishes is in a position to provide any written or verbal support for anyone seeking an exemption from the vaccine based on religious grounds.** In alignment with Pope Francis, I strongly recommend that Catholics should receive COVID-19 vaccines unless a medical reason prevents them from doing so.

OUR SYMPATHIES AND PRAYERS are extended to the Christian Brothers on the death of Brother Benedict Oliver. Brother Benedict served as a long-time teacher and principal at Central Catholic High School, as well as Seton LaSalle High School in the Diocese of Pittsburgh. He was elected the leader of his province and served in numerous ministries. He was a beloved teacher, friend, and mentor to many. Father Stubna said, "Brother Benedict was a dear and cherished friend who served the Church with fidelity and love. He was a trusted colleague in the work of Catholic education and a person who touched the lives of countless people. He will be greatly missed. We are forever grateful for his service to the Church and pray now for his eternal rest. May he rest in peace."

FETAL RESEARCH AND EXPERIMENTATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH. Bishop Zubik has released the following statement:

It has recently come to my attention that the University of Pittsburgh Medical School has for some time been using the bodies of aborted babies for medical research. This information is a matter of grave concern. From the perspective of the Church, this is a gross violation of human rights. This practice epitomizes the exploitation of human beings, valued not for their intrinsic worth but as parts for gain. Opposition to these medical experiments on helpless babies should transcend every political affiliation and every faith tradition.

While some might defend the practice of using aborted fetal tissue in science as bringing about good, with this practice the most fundamental ethical norm undergirding all efforts for human betterment – the dignity, sanctity, and infinite worth of **all** human beings – is being violated. The foundation of a just and free society is the recognition that every human being has value and is the bearer of rights, regardless of strength, ability, or origin. This foundational belief must also and always be the very inspiration for scientific advancement and the compass guiding science to true progress.

The medical community, together with the scientific and academic communities, must honor the pledge to "First, do no harm."

At Saint Paul Cathedral on Wednesday evenings the Eucharist is exposed on the altar at 7:00 pm and the novena prayers and Benediction begin at 7:30 pm until about 8:00 pm. UPDATE ON SYNOD HALL PASTORAL CENTER RENOVATION. We are happy to announce that we are taking our first step in utilizing the funds raised during the Cathedral's Church Alive/Building a Future of Hope campaign to begin the much-anticipated renovation of the future pastoral center at Synod Hall, which is located right next to the Cathedral. Byrn Enterprises will be replacing the failing synthetic shingles installed on the roof of Synod Hall in 2010 with natural slate and Mariani and Richards will be undertaking the repair of the exterior masonry of Synod Hall. This work is being coordinated between these two contractors and is expected to begin in the immediate future and completed in 8 to 10 weeks.

In light of this construction, the walkthrough and the small parking lot between the Cathedral and Synod Hall will be closed to allow for mobilization, storing of materials, and for pedestrian safety. There will be no access from Craig Street to the Cathedral or to Dithridge Street through the walkway. We regret any inconvenience this may cause. We will attempt to keep our parishioners updated as to the progress of this project as it proceeds. During this period of renovation of the roof and exterior of Synod Hall our goal will be to have raised enough funds to renovate the interior of Synod Hall as the next step in achieving our goal of having Synod Hall house our parish's pastoral center. Thank you for your cooperation and understanding.

ALTAR SERVERS are needed for both our Saint Rosalia site (4:00 pm Saturday evening and 9:00 am Sunday) and Saint Paul Cathedral (6:00 pm Saturday evening and 10:00 am, 12:00 noon, and 6:00 pm Sunday). We are so grateful for our faithful servers who continue to assist us at the altar. But we need to increase our ranks so that our servers are not being asked to serve every Sunday. We are looking for young men and women in grades 4 and higher. High School students and College students are invited and encouraged to serve as well. Please contact Father Stubna at the parish office or at kstubna@diopitt.org for more information. Training is simple and available for anyone who is interested. We can use your help. I would ask parents to encourage your children to consider serving for the Masses. It is a special and blessed ministry to assist at the altar for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

A SPECIAL SECOND COLLECTION WILL BE TAKEN UP NEXT WEEKEND, SEPTEMBER 18-19, for the victims of the earthquake in Haiti. Reports indicate that over 2,000 people have died, and thousands of homes have been destroyed. This devastation further impacts the Haitian community as they are still rebuilding following the major earthquake in 2010. The USCCB has asked every diocese in the United States to hold this special collection in every parish. The funds received will be given to the Bishops' Emergency Disaster Fund, which supports the pastoral and reconstruction efforts of the Church through the local agencies of Catholic Relief Services and Catholic Charities USA, in responding to immediate needs across the globe. THE FEAST OF THE EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS, celebrated every year on September 14, recalls three historical events: the finding of the True Cross by Saint Helena, the mother of the emperor Constantine; the dedication of churches built by Constantine on the site of the Holy Sepulchre and Mount Calvary; and the restoration of the True Cross to Jerusalem by the emperor Heraclius II. But in a deeper sense, the feast also celebrates the Holy Cross as the instrument of our salvation. This instrument of torture, designed to degrade the worst of criminals, became the life-giving tree that reversed Adam's Original Sin when he ate from the Tree of the Knowledge of Good and Evil in the Garden of Eden. According to tradition, first mentioned by Saint Cyril of Jerusalem in 348, Saint Helena, nearing the end of her life, decided under divine inspiration to travel to Jerusalem in 326 to excavate the Holy Sepulchre and attempt to locate the True Cross. A Jew by the name of Judas, aware of the tradition concerning the hiding of the Cross, led those excavating the Holy Sepulchre to the spot in which it was hidden. In celebration of the discovery of the Holy Cross, Constantine ordered the construction of churches at the site of the Holy Sepulchre and on Mount Calvary. Those churches were dedicated on September 13 and 14, 335, and shortly thereafter the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross began to be celebrated on the latter date. The feast slowly spread from Jerusalem to other churches, until, by the year 720, the celebration was universal.

It's easy to understand that the Cross is special because Christ used it as the instrument of our salvation. But after His Resurrection, why would Christians continue to look to the Cross? Christ Himself offered us the answer: "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me" (Luke 9:23). The point of taking up our own cross is not simply self-sacrifice; in doing so, we unite ourselves to the sacrifice of Christ on His Cross. When we participate in the Mass, the Cross is there, too. The "unbloody sacrifice" offered on the altar is the re-presentation of Christ's Sacrifice on the Cross. When we receive the Sacrament of Holy Communion, we do not simply unite ourselves to Christ; we nail ourselves to the Cross, dying with Christ so that we might rise with Him. "For the Jews require signs, and the Greeks seek after wisdom: But we preach Christ crucified, unto the Jews indeed a stumbling block, and unto the Gentiles foolishness..." (1 Corinthians 1:22-23). Today, more than ever, non-Christians see the Cross as foolishness. What kind of Savior triumphs through death? For Christians, however, the Cross is the crossroads of history and the Tree of Life. Christianity without the Cross is meaningless: Only by uniting ourselves to Christ's Sacrifice on the Cross can we enter into eternal life.

PASSING FROM DEATH TO NEW LIFE. We extend our deepest sympathies and prayers to the families of those who were buried from our parish recently. May their souls and all the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK. September 16 marks the memorial of both **SAINT CORNELIUS** and **SAINT CYPRIAN**. There was no pope for 14 months after the martyrdom of Pope Saint Fabian because of the intensity of the persecution of the Church. Cornelius was elected Pope and reigned for two years. Much of that time was spent on the question of re-admitting Christians who had apostatized during the persecutions (they rejected the faith to save their lives). Cyprian, the primate of Africa, advocated that God's mercy could forgive the sins of even those who had apostatized but that this sin could only be forgiven by the bishop of the local Church. In Rome a radical priest named Novatian insisted that apostasy could never be forgiven, nor could other sins like adultery, murder, and fornication of any kind. This became known as the Novatian heresy which Cornelius, with the support of Cyprian, worked diligently to combat. Cornelius held a Synod in Rome in 251 that affirmed the Church's teaching and understanding that God's mercy could forgive any sins of those with sincere contrition and sorrow, and the "usual medicines of repentance" that were required through the Sacrament of Confession. Cyprian was elected Bishop of Carthage in Africa, known for his oratorical skills, his wisdom, and his kindness to the poor. He became involved in another controversy in the third century focusing on whether baptisms administered by heretics and schismatics was valid. These debates helped to define the Church's teaching in the earliest days of the Church and required great courage, dedication, patience, and skill to fight off heresy and protect the unity of the Church. As Cyprian wrote: "You cannot have God for your father if you do not have the Church for your mother."

THE FEAST OF OUR LADY OF SORROWS is celebrated on September 15. For a while there were two feasts in honor of the Sorrowful Mother: one going back to the 15th century, the other to the 17th century. For a while both were celebrated by the universal Church: one on the Friday before Palm Sunday, the other in September. The principal biblical references to Mary's sorrows are in Luke 2:35 and John 19:26-27. The Lucan passage is Simeon's prediction about a sword piercing Mary's soul; the Johannine passage relates Jesus' words from the cross to Mary and to the beloved disciple. Many early Church writers interpret the sword as Mary's sorrows, especially as she saw Jesus die on the cross. Thus, the two passages are brought together as prediction and fulfillment. Saint Ambrose in particular sees Mary as a sorrowful yet powerful figure at the cross. Mary stood fearlessly at the cross while others fled. Mary looked on her Son's wounds with pity, but saw in them the salvation of the world. As Jesus hung on the cross, Mary did not fear to be killed, but offered herself to her persecutors. When Jesus gives the beloved disciple to Mary, we are invited to appreciate Mary's role in the Church: She symbolizes the Church; the beloved disciple represents all believers. As Mary mothered Jesus, she is now mother to all his followers.

WINE CHEESE AND THE GOSPEL: FALL 2021 EDITION. Father Kris Stubna will sponsor the new edition of Wine, Cheese and the Gospel beginning on Monday evening, September 20. We will meet in person in the Cathedral Social Hall with wine and cheese at 6:30 pm and our session starting at 7:00 pm until 8:00 pm. Father Stubna will address contemporary issues in the Church including the Synod on the Eucharist, the apostolic letter *Traditionis Custodes*, the recent parish mergers in the Diocese of Pittsburgh and other questions or issues that participants want to address. FAITH IN THE WORKPLACE : A PANEL DISCUSSION

Very Reverend Kris D. Stubna, STD

Fr. Stubna was ordained a priest in 1985 and has served at several parishes in the diocese, including Most Blessed Sacrament in Natrona Heights and the former Saint George Parish in the Allentown section of Pittsburgh. In 1989, then Bishop Wuerl appointed Father Stubna as the Director for Catechesis and the Consultant for Secondary School Catechesis.
