REFLECTIONS

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Marriage! The readings today speak to us about the creation of man and woman and their union with one another in marriage. Today it is so difficult to speak about marriage because our culture is against the Christian idea of marriage. We have to be able to speak clearly and yet not condemn anyone.

The first reading today is from the Book of Genesis and speaks of the creation of woman. It is important to hear this teaching as it was meant and not to listen to it only with the interpretations of our time. The author wants us to know that men and women come from the same creation, that there is a close relationship between men and women and that God creates both man and woman. Woman is not inferior to man because of this account of the creation of woman. No, the intent is to show that they are both from God.

The second reading is from the Letter to the Hebrews. The phrase that can link this second reading with the two other readings is this: "He who consecrates and those who are being consecrated all have one origin." This reaffirms the teaching that we are all from God, that men and women are equal even though not the same. In the Letter to the Hebrews the point is that by being one in Christ, we are all saved. From the point of view of marriage, the point is that men and women are both created by God and can live a Sacrament together because they are both of God and marry to live out that relationship in God.

The Gospel is from Saint Mark. The main point that Jesus wants us to understand is that divorce is not acceptable in the plan of God. It is important that we recognize again that Jesus is arguing against a culture where divorce was easy and not challenged. This is very similar to much of modern culture. Divorce is widely accepted by everyone to the point that many are suggesting that there should not even be marriage. Just let people form relationships with anyone else and stay together until it no longer works!

For Jesus, marriage is clearly a gift from God. Marriage is between a man and a woman. Marriage is also about having children. Marriage is a celebration of creation and of God's love. In much of our modern culture, people no longer believe in God. People believe that marriage is just any two people making a commitment to one another. Many today do not want to have children in a marriage because it complicates the marriage. Finally, marriage is seen as something only on the human level and is not seen as a sacrament.

We Catholics have an enormous evangelization to do in our modern world. Even simply to state the truth about how our Holy Scriptures and our Catholic tradition see marriage is highly offensive to many people. Our challenge is first to live the teachings of Jesus and the Church and then to speak fearlessly about God's plan for marriage and children. We could even become martyrs for stating clearly the traditional teachings. Let us walk with the Lord.

- A WARM WELCOME IS EXTENDED TO CHRIS CATONE**, who begins his duties as Associate Director of Music for Saint Paul Cathedral parish next weekend, October 9-10. His primary duties will be to play the 4:00 pm and 9:00 am Masses at our Saint Rosalia site, including the planning of the music and helping to reorganize the choir at St. Rosalia moving forward. We are delighted to welcome Chris to our parish family and wish him every blessing and support.
- We received a significant bequest for our Synod Hall renovation project from the late DR. REBECCA CESARIO.** Dr. Cesario loved her parish, Saint Paul Cathedral. How very grateful we are for her generosity to the Cathedral in making this gift. She will be remembered eternally for this act of generous love and will be part of the prayers that we offer for our benefactors regularly throughout the year. May she rest in peace.
- As you have seen, the Synod Hall renovations on the exterior are now underway. There are two big projects that are being completed, hopefully before the onset of the winter: (1) the replacement of the slate roof; and (2) the cleaning and repair of the external masonry. Bryn Enterprise is the roof contractor and Mariani and Richards has been contracted for the masonry work. Fencing has had to be put in place for safety issues, and as a result, traffic from the Craig Street side of the Cathedral through the Synod Hall parking lot and passageway to the Dithridge Street side is now completely closed to all pedestrian traffic. The Synod Hall parking lot is also closed to use at this time. These may be inconveniences to some but necessary for the work to be completed.
- The Saint Rosalia site Social Hall renovation is progressing nicely. We have made tremendous progress in addressing a number of repairs. New ceiling lighting and new ceiling tiles are being installed, including the replacement of all 12 ceiling fans. New round tables have been ordered to replace the old cafeteria tables, but delivery has been slowed by COVID slowdowns in production. The lighting work is being done by Buch Electric and the ceiling work is being done by Sommer Contracting. John Sommer has played a major role in refinishing the wood, replacing the carpet, and putting in chair guards on the pillars. We are excited that this renovation is almost completed – and what a difference it has made.
- We are aware of the plaster dust falling in the sanctuary of Saint Rosalia Church. This is the result of the problems with the masonry on both sides of the Church building and part of the roof. As you know, last year we undertook a major repair of the front facade of the Church and part of the roof to address these same problems at a cost of more than \$65,000. These similar repairs

need to be completed on the east and west facades in order to address the water leakage which is the causing the falling of the plaster. These issues have resulted from a lack of maintenance over many years which has resulted in missing and disintegrating mortar leading to the bricks becoming dislocated. This has damaged the Church but also is a health and safety issue. The cost of these repairs will be substantial. We are in the process of obtaining proposals to correct these issues. There is no easy solution, and we will keep everyone informed of our progress. The falling plaster dust will continue to be a problem until we can fix the exterior of the Church.

ANNUAL BLESSING OF PETS AND ANIMALS will take place on **Monday, October 4 at 6:00 pm** on the lawn of Saint Paul Cathedral. This is the feast day of Saint Francis of Assisi, and we invite you to gather with your pets for this beautiful blessing service.

VOLUNTEER APPRECIATION DINNER. After much consideration, prayer, and discussion – and given the continued uncertainty of the COVID virus – it seems prudent that we would postpone our volunteer appreciation dinner, which was scheduled for Thursday, October 21. As much as I would have enjoyed the opportunity to bring people together for prayer and fellowship, and to be able to thank our parish volunteers for all that they do, I believe that our concern for the safety and welfare of our volunteers is paramount. We will hopefully be able to reschedule this gathering in the spring.

RESUMING OUR COFFEE AND DONUT SUNDAYS WILL BE DELAYED as well until after the new year. We want to avoid putting people at risk during this time by hosting any regular gatherings that are not really necessary.

OUR WEEKLY NOVENA TO OUR MOTHER OF PERPETUAL HELP. ANNUAL OCTOBER COUNT. Each October, every parish in the diocese must conduct a census of Mass attendance by counting every individual (adults and children) who attend Mass during the four weekends of October. The so-called "October count" provides the diocese and parish with valuable information on Mass attendance trends. This information is important for pastoral planning purposes, particularly in terms of how many Masses are really needed for a parish community to serve the needs of the faithful. The ushers will be counting every person in attendance at each Mass during the weekends of October. We are required to submit this information to the diocese at the end of the month. It will also give us a good idea of how well our Masses are populated.

THE FATHER VANYO LIBRARY will be reopening with an exciting brand-new look! Volunteers have been working hard this past year and a half to refresh not only the collection but also the interior and feel of our parish library. We have added new materials, including DVDs, children's books, and Father Stubna's recommended titles. We have upgraded the seating space to include plush reading chairs, a coffee station, and new shelves for parishioners to browse the collection. We hope you'll stay and read in our new, comfortable environment. Our children's space includes a place to play and for parents to read aloud. Old space, new look. Come in and browse. The library will be open in person every Sunday morning from 9:00 am - 12:00 pm in Synod Hall. Other times are available by appointment by calling the rectory. SAINT OF THE WEEK. We remember **BLESSED FRANCIS XAVIER SEELOS** on October 5. Born in southern Bavaria, he studied philosophy and theology in Munich. On hearing about the work of the Redemptorists among German-speaking Catholics in the United States, he came to this country in 1843. Ordained at the end of 1844, he was assigned for six years to St. Philomena's Parish in Pittsburgh as an assistant to Saint John Neumann. The next three years Father Seelos was superior in the same community and began his service as novice master. Several years in parish ministry in Maryland followed, along with responsibility for training Redemptorist students. During the Civil War Fr. Seelos went to Washington, D.C., and appealed to President Lincoln that those students not be drafted for military service, although eventually some were. For several years, he preached in English and in German throughout the Midwest and in the Mid-Atlantic states. Assigned to St. Mary of the Assumption Church community in New Orleans, Fr. Seelos served his Redemptorist confreres and parishioners with great zeal. In 1867, he died of yellow fever, having contracted that disease while visiting the sick. He was beatified in 2000 by Pope John Paul II. Father Seelos worked in many different places but always with the same zeal: to help people know God's love and compassion. He preached about the works of mercy and then engaged in them, even risking his own health. He needs one more miracle to become a saint. Blessed Francis Xavier Seelos, pray for us.

TODAY IS RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY. The Church begins a month-long celebration of Respect Life Month, an opportunity for each of us as Catholics to reflect in a special way on the sacred and magnificent gift of human life. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* reminds us that "human life is sacred from its beginning; it involves the creative action of God, and it remains forever in a special relationship with the Creator who is its sole end. God alone is the Lord of life from its beginning until its end: no one under any circumstance can claim for himself the right directly to destroy an innocent human being." Catholic teaching is clear and uncompromising on this issue and yet, sadly, we know how often those who claim to be Catholic can hold positions contrary to the teaching of the Church. This is impossible and inconsistent with what it means to be a Catholic.

Church teaching reminds us that love and life are bound together. The culture of life, love, and civilization that is at the foundation of God's plan begins in the heart of the Christian family. The Church calls the family an "icon of the Blessed Trinity" – the permanent, faithful, and life-giving love of husband and wife in the marriage covenant as designed and ordered by God's plan leads to children and the creation of the family, "the school of love." This kind of love reflects and mirrors for us the love that God has for the Church. It is a love that is at its roots selfless and giving, leading to a total care for others and a deep respect for the dignity, value and worth of every human being in every state of life. The marriage covenant speaks powerfully to all of us of the total giving, the unconditional love, the laying down of one's life for another that is the hallmark of every Christian life.

But whether married or not, whatever our vocation in life, each of us is called to respond to God's unconditional love with the gift of ourselves in loving service to others. We must see the dignity of each person and respond with love. Blessed Mother Teresa's ability to see Christ in the face of each person she met is the wisdom and grace that needs to guide us in our relationships with others.

The threats against human life in our society are frightening. Abortion is the law of the land. Each year countless numbers of unborn babies are put to death in the name of a woman's right to choose without any regard at all for the rights of the unborn child who has no one to be his advocate. But there are threats against life at every stage: those with disabilities, the elderly, the infirmed, refugees, immigrants, and the poor – so many of whom can be pushed aside by our society. As Catholics we have an obligation and responsibility to be defenders of human life, to be advocates for life and fight against the threats that minimize and destroy any human life. LIFE CHAIN. The National Life Chain is the largest peaceful, prayerful, pro-life, public witness in the world. More than 1,500 cities across the US and Canada are expected to participate **today, Sunday, October 3 from 1:00 – 2:00 pm**. Saint Paul Cathedral parish will be participating in the Life Chain on Fifth Avenue in front of the Cathedral. Signs will be available in the back of the church. Participants are asked to pick up a sign and proceed outside along Fifth Avenue on either side, standing 6 feet apart (social distancing required) and in SILENCE AND PRAYER. There are some prayers on the back of the signs. You can pray the rosary. Please face oncoming traffic so that they can see the signs and then return them to the table in the vestibule of the Cathedral when finished. Please join your fellow church parishioners in standing up for Life.

OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY. Our Blessed Lady, under the title of Our Lady of the Rosary, is credited with victory in a number of the battles that those feasts celebrate. Chief among these is the Battle of Lepanto (October 7, 1571), in which a Christian fleet defeated a superior Ottoman Muslim fleet and stopped the westward expansion of Islam in the Mediterranean. In honor of the victory, Pope Pius V instituted the Feast of Our Lady of Victory, which is still celebrated today as the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (October 7). And, in 1883, when Pope Leo XIII officially dedicated the month of October to the Holy Rosary, he made reference to the battle and the feast. The best way to celebrate the Month of the Holy Rosary is, of course, to pray the rosary daily. The rosary is a beautiful prayer of the Church that calls upon the intercession and protection of our Blessed Lady whose greatest desire is both to draw us more closely into the heart of her beloved Son, Jesus Christ, and to a great unity and love for the Church. As we pray the rosary prayers, our minds and hearts are invited to reflect on the various mysteries that marked out the life and ministry of Jesus and his mother. Each day the rosary is prayed in front of the Blessed Mother altar immediately following the 8:15 am Mass at the Cathedral. All are welcome and encouraged to participate in these public recitations of the rosary in our parish.

Up until that time you will need to submit all requests with the Mass intention form. With the reduced number of Masses, we are no longer able to take 5 Mass intentions. Any Mass intentions over the limit will be sent out to other priests for satisfaction.**


My Prolife Prayer

Two Suggestions for Respect Life Month

The Church's liturgical year is an incredible blessing for us. There are times to focus on repentance; to prepare for the Lord's Coming; to rejoice at the Incarnation, the Resurrection, and Pentecost; and to commemorate the saints, and to honor Our Lady and seek her help and intercession. These times and seasons are invitations to us to focus on a particular theme and allow God to work in us and through us. Those invitations require a response from us, if we are to see fruit through the celebrations.

Although not a liturgical season, the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops has declared October as Respect Life Month. The bishops encourage us: "Every October, we consider more deeply why every human life is valuable and reflect on how to build a culture that protects life from conception to natural death." As with the liturgical seasons, we need to respond to the invitation and embrace this month as an opportunity for God to work in us and through us. I have two suggestions as to how we can respond.

First, dedicate two hours to prayer and reparation during the month. I'd suggest two ways to accomplish this. One would be to spend two holy-hours in Church before the Blessed Sacrament—two one-hour sessions. Tell our Eucharist Lord at the beginning of the hour that you are there as an act of reparation for the sins committed against the dignity and sacredness of human life. Certainly, seek to make the hour prayerful (rosary, intercessions, litanies for life, etc.) but just to be there before our Lord and to focus on Him is a fruitful activity.

The other option that I suggest is to spend two hours praying in front of Planned Parenthood on Liberty Avenue in Downtown Pittsburgh during the month. I'll be there every Thursday from 3–5 and would welcome you to join me—although prayer will occur there every day of the month from 7 am to 7 pm.

Second, I suggest that you say a rosary each week especially for a respect life theme. The USCCB provides some formulas to use at <https://www.usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/prayers-and-devotions/rosaries/pro-life/rosaries>. Here are intentions that can be used with the Joyful Mysteries:

The First Joyful Mystery: The Annunciation of Our Lord

Prayer Intention: For parents facing an unexpected pregnancy, that they lovingly accept the precious life God has entrusted to their care.

The Second Joyful Mystery: The Visitation

Prayer Intention: That the family and friends of expectant parents might reach out and support them as they prepare to meet their child face to face.

The Third Joyful Mystery: The Nativity of Jesus

Prayer Intention: That the love of the Blessed Mother and the Christ Child may be a source of strength for every expectant mother, especially mothers living in poverty, and that they both will be surrounded by joy and love.

The Fourth Joyful Mystery: The Presentation in the Temple

Prayer Intention: That fathers of young children will model St. Joseph in devoutly practicing their faith, so that they lead their children to God by their words and example.

The Fifth Joyful Mystery: The Finding in the Temple

Prayer Intention: For all children who have been lost and forgotten, that they may be led to a place where they are treasured, protected and loved.

Let's not miss the opportunity to respond to the invitation of Respect Life Month. If we are responsive and faithful, God will bless our efforts.

2022 MASS INTENTION FORM

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for loved ones, living, or deceased, is a beautiful and wonderful part of our Catholic tradition. At Saint Paul Cathedral Parish, there are many requests for scheduling Mass intentions. As a way to allow as many Cathedral parishioners and friends as possible to schedule Masses, the following policies are put forth to help accomplish this goal. **Please complete this form for Mass requests for the 2022 year ONLY!**

Please read the following guidelines carefully:

1. We will accept **no more than 4 (four) intentions per household** and **no more than 2 (two) Sunday intentions per registered household**. We pledge to fulfill these intentions during the 2022 year. If you request more than 4 (four) intentions, the additional intentions will be sent out to be fulfilled--**no exceptions!**
2. Requests will be honored in the order the form is received at the Parish Office, beginning Monday, October 18, 2021.
3. A minimum \$10 stipend, as determined by Diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass request.
4. **No other Mass requests** for 2022 will be taken by phone or visit until all forms have been entered. Individual Mass requests will begin on Monday, December 6, 2021. Only 2 (two) Mass Intentions can be taken for any family once the book is opened for walk-ins. All other Masses will be sent to other priests to be satisfied.
5. **Please note** the following guidelines for Mass requests:
 - a. Mass intentions **cannot be scheduled** for the following days: **Holy Thursday, Holy Saturday, Easter Sunday, Christmas, and All Souls' Day**. These Mass intentions will be for the general intentions of our priests and parishioners.
 - b. Only one Mass request per priest may be scheduled per day.
 - c. One Mass every Sunday must be scheduled for the intentions of our parishioners known as "Pro Populo" (For the People) as required by Canon Law and diocesan statute.
6. **Mass requests will be granted as close to the requested date and time as possible**. If it is not possible to comply with the primary request, **the next closest date and time will be scheduled**. We will do the best we can to keep the intentions close to the date requested. We will mail a copy of your form with the updates to you. PLEASE print your address CLEARLY! There may be a reason that requires us to cancel a Mass already scheduled. If that is necessary, we will contact you and try to find another date.
7. Please print names clearly and legibly so that we can enter the names correctly. Lengthy intentions cannot be published in the Bulletin and will be edited for the sake of brevity. Since the purpose of publishing the intention in the Bulletin is to notify the family and friends of the intentions, we suggest the omission of middle initials, titles, etc. Please indicate if the person for whom the Mass is requested is living or deceased.
8. We are **NOT ABLE** to publish the names of those requesting the Mass.




