REFLECTIONS

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

The situation is dire when the prophet Elijah visits the poor widow and her son. The drought in Israel has been devastating; a punishment sent by God because of King Ahab's waywardness and infidelity to the covenant. The widow and her son are experiencing the full consequences of this devastation. They are in absolute poverty, with almost nothing left to eat. In fact, the widow is gathering bits of wood to prepare what is going to be their last meal before death. But in her poverty and want, she generously offers Elijah not only some water to drink but prepares a cake for the prophet to eat. She believes in his word. It is her faith in God and in the prophet whom God has sent that allows her to experience the abundance of God's goodness. "The jar of flour shall not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, until the day when the Lord sends rain upon the earth." She learns that God's power can bring abundance of life where all earthly power and resources fail.

It is this complete reliance on God that we see in the today's Gospel. Jesus stands near the treasury of the synagogue. Despite a number of large contributions from the wealthy patrons, it is the gift of two small coins made by a poor widow that catches the Lord's attention. "Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." Jesus is so often critical of those whose lives do not reflect the fullness of their faith; it is the great sin of hypocrisy that can undermine our faith witness. All of us can look into our own hearts and see how we fail to reflect in our decisions, in our public actions, and in how we treat others, all that our faith obliges us to embrace. We cannot put our faith under a bushel basket or profess one thing and do another. All too often, for example, we see Catholics in public office who keep their faith commitment hidden and private rather than allow the truth of the Gospel to guide their decisions and determine how they will live. Authenticity requires us to live always in a way that is reflective of what the Church teaches, as the Church is the Body of Christ and as members we are called to live in light of its truth.

The poor widow offers everything she has to God and his prophet – regardless of the cost to her personally. She loves God completely and gives all that she can to manifest her faith and love. What an example worthy of imitation! She is more of a religious leader than any of the Pharisees.

Today's second reading speaks of the fulfillment of God's promises to those who are faithful. Christ the High Priest has already poured out his blood on the Cross, once and for all, for the redemption of God's people. But as the Letter to the Hebrews proclaims, "Christ will appear a second time, not to take away sin but to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him." Salvation awaits those who are with God, those who embrace God's way. Each of us is called to live a life of faith, hope and love. To live worthily, like the poor widow we read about today, is nothing other than striving each day to please God and to serve Him by leading lives of selfless, sacrificial service in which all we have is offered to God in love.

FROM THE HEART OF OUR PASTOR, FATHER STUBNA

- PARISH SHARE APPEAL PROGRAM UPDATE.** As of September 30, we have had 400 families/individual make a gift or pledge to this year's PARISH SHARE APPEAL, totaling \$162,525.10. I am deeply grateful to those who have made a gift or pledge to this year's appeal. We have until the end of January 2022 for anyone in the parish to make a gift or pledge to this important appeal. Please consider helping us in this effort. Our parish goal this year is \$225,000 which will allow nearly \$125,000 to remain at the parish for use in our operational fund. Please consider making a contribution if you can. May God bless all of those who have already contributed. We are deeply grateful for your generous support.
- OUR OFFERTORY COLLECTION** continues to increase slightly. We are asking every parishioner to please use your weekly envelopes or make a contribution online. For the first quarter of this fiscal year, our offertory income is up 16% from last year but still lagging behind from our pre-covid numbers. We are asking everyone to be good and faithful stewards in helping our parish to be able to do all the things we need to do in order to be a vibrant parish and serve the needs of all. Thanks to all who contribute regularly to the offertory collection and help our parish to have the necessary resources to serve the faithful. May God bless you.
- OCTOBER COUNT.** Each year the diocese asks each parish to conduct an October count indicating the number of people that attend each Sunday Mass (including the Saturday evening vigil Masses). This count gives us an indication of the numbers of people who typically attend Mass at the parish on a regular basis. The average attendance for each Mass during the month of October is as follows:

It is good to see the numbers have increased following the covid restrictions and in light of the continuing impact of the corona virus. Clearly the number of Masses we have is sufficient for the numbers attending as each of the Masses can accommodate more people. We hope that the number of people attending Mass in our parish will continue to increase moving forward. Please reach out to neighbors and friends who may not have returned to Mass and invite them to attend. Each of us must work to help build up our parish family.

- YESHIVA SCHOOL UPDATE.** Yeshiva has been working diligently on the former St. Rosalia school building in hopes of making it ready for occupancy this coming spring. They have erected a fence

that delineates the property line that was part of the subdivision and sale of the school buildings to Yeshiva. There will be less parking for our parish community as we had discussed at the meetings held this past year with the Yeshiva and parish community. But the sale of the buildings and property were essential to any hopes of long-term fiscal stability for our parish and do not represent too much of a hardship for us. Our parishioners continue to have access to the parking along the old school building, in front of the fence and in the lower parking lot behind the rectory. Nothing will change regarding the protocol for funeral access and parking. We have established good lines of communication between our parish and Yeshiva. Change is never easy for anyone, but we are delighted to have such good neighbors and to be able to put those properties that we no longer need to good use.

SAINT OF THE WEEK. We celebrate the feast of **SAINT FRANCES XAVIER CABRINI** on November 13. She was the first United States citizen to be canonized a saint, canonized by Pope Pius XII on July 7, 1946, who said on that day: "Although her constitution was very frail, her spirit was endowed with such singular strength that, knowing the will of God in her regard, she permitted nothing to impede her from accomplishing what seemed beyond the strength of a woman." Born in Lombardy, Italy, Frances took religious vows and set her heart on being a missionary in China. The Pope prevailed on her to go to America to care for the Italian immigrants in New York City. She was met with disappointment and frustrations at every turn, but she was determined. In 35 years, Frances founded 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the uneducated and the sick, even organizing the first schools to prevent the Italian immigrants from losing their faith and their heritage. She died of malaria in her own hospital in Chicago, having exhausted herself in the service of compassion and charity to hundreds of thousands. She is an inspiration to us to carry on the work of Christ's love despite the obstacles, doing what we can to touch the hearts and lives of those around us in need.
