

REFLECTIONS

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

It seems appropriate that the Feast of the Holy Family falls in the octave of Christmas. As the familiar carol reminds us: There is no place like home for the holidays! This is the time when families are reunited, and we celebrate the gift of family and the love that joins us together. The Catechism of the Catholic Church speaks of the family as "the domestic Church," a "community of faith, hope and charity; a communion of persons, a sign and image of the communion of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit." The family is a place of grace and blessing.

There are three things that we learn about the gift of family today. First, we do not find salvation alone; we need one another. Each of us is placed in some sort of family that can help us to become who we were meant to be – sons and daughters of God. The readings instruct us in how Christian families are to live. The great lesson here is that each member of the family has a responsibility for the others. The Church speaks of the family as "the first and most important school of learning." The greatest lessons of life and faith are received in the home: respect for others, the ability to forgive, patience, compassion, kindness, understanding, and love. The Feast of the Holy Family speaks of the child Jesus going up to Nazareth where he grew in wisdom and grace. Families must always work to help each of its members grow in wisdom and grace. We are responsible to help each other achieve salvation.

Second, families are called to be places of holiness and faith. Families must be places, above all, where the faith is lived and taught. Parents assume a great responsibility before God for the spiritual welfare of their children. We can all too easily get caught in advancing their temporal well-being, but we neglect their souls. Families must make time to pray together, to read the Scriptures, to pray the rosary and most importantly to attend Mass together each Sunday. Our homes need to be places where the Catholic faith is experienced: holy water fonts, crucifixes, images our Lord and our Blessed Mother and the saints. Visible reminders of our faith are good and important. It is true that families who pray together stay together. Saint Paul's instruction in the Scripture today can cause some to bristle, but the meaning these words convey is profound. Husbands are called to love their wives completely, to be faithful in marriage, and to be selfless in love. Wives are called to love their husbands in the same ways as both work to create a marriage and a home that reflect the love of God. Children must be obedient to their parents, respectful and patient, always working to give back the love that they have first received unconditionally.

Third, families must be connected to the Church. Mary and Joseph knew that they had to bring Jesus to the temple to be consecrated to God and to offer their prayer of thanksgiving to the Lord. The temple was the place where the importance of Jesus' mission for the whole people of Israel and the Gentiles became manifest. It is no different for each of us. The Church helps us to remain faithful to God, to put the Lord above all else in our lives. This is no easy task as we navigate in a world that is so often secular and lacking in allegiance to the ways of God. Making sure your family gets to Mass and receives the sacraments

OUR MONTHLY AFTERNOON OF EUCHARISTIC ADORATION will be held today, Sunday, December 26, on the Feast of the Holy Family at Saint Paul Cathedral. The Blessed Sacrament is exposed for adoration at the conclusion of the 12:00 Noon Mass until 5:00 pm. Solemn Vespers and Benediction begin at 5:00 pm until 5:30 pm, followed by the 6:00 pm Mass. Please consider making this part of your new year's resolution to come and join us for these wonderful afternoons of prayer and adoration before our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

MAKE TIME FOR FAMILY PRAYER. It is true that the family that prays together stays together. "Prayer needs to become a regular habit in the daily life of each family. Prayer is thanksgiving, praise of God, asking for forgiveness, supplication, and invocation. In all of these forms the prayer of the family has much to say to God" (St. John Paul II, Letter to Families, §10). "For the People of God, Mary represents the model of every expression of their prayer life. In particular, she teaches Christians how to turn to God to ask for his help and support in the various circumstances of life. Her motherly intercession at the wedding in Cana and her presence in the Upper Room at the Apostles' side as they prayed in expectation of Pentecost suggest that the prayer of petition is an essential form of cooperation in furthering the work of salvation in the world. By following her model, the Church learns to be bold in her asking, to persevere in her intercessions and, above all, to implore the gift of the Holy Spirit" (St. John Paul II, Audience, Sept. 10, 1997, §4-5).

GOSSIP IS TERRORISM. That is how Pope Francis described the sin of gossip recently: "Gossiping is a way of distancing yourselves. Listen well: No gossiping, the terrorism of gossip. Because whoever gossips is a terrorist. He or she is a terrorist in the community because a word against this one, against that one, is as ugly as a bomb ... it destroys! The one who does this destroys, like a bomb, and he distances himself. The apostle Santiago said having dominion over one's tongue was perhaps the most difficult virtue, the most difficult human and spiritual virtue to acquire. If you think of saying something against a brother or sister, to lob a gossip bomb, mortify your tongue! Be strong! No terrorism in our community of the Church. Gossip is useless, destructive, and sinful behavior. Gossip no more."

SATURDAY, JANUARY 1 IS THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD. We honor the Blessed Mother in her role as the Mother of God and the Mother of Jesus Christ. From antiquity, Mary has been called "Theotokos", or "God-Bearer" (Mother of God). The word "Theotokos" is Greek. The term was used as part of the popular piety of the early first millennium church. It is used throughout the Eastern Church's Liturgy, both Orthodox and Catholic. It lies at the heart of the Latin Rite's deep Marian piety and devotion. This title was a response to early threats to 'orthodoxy', the preservation of authentic Christian teaching. A pronouncement of an early Church Council, The Council of Ephesus in 431 A.D., insisted "If anyone does not confess that God is truly Emmanuel, and that on this account the holy virgin is the "Theotokos" (for according to the flesh she gave birth to the word of God become flesh by birth) let him be anathema." (The Council of Ephesus, 431 AD). The Council's insistence on the use of this title reflected the effort to insist on the Church's teaching that Jesus was both human and divine, that the two natures were united in his One Person.

JANUARY 1 IS THE SOLEMNITY OF MARY, THE MOTHER OF GOD. It is a holyday but there is no obligation to attend Mass this year as it falls on a Saturday. Masses will be celebrated in our parish as follows:

JANUARY 1 also marks the World Day of Prayer for Peace. We share the following Prayer for Peace by Pope Francis:

Lord, God of peace, hear our prayer!

But our efforts have been in vain.

Now, Lord, come to our aid! Grant us peace, teach us peace; guide our steps in the way of peace. Open our eyes and our hearts and give us the courage to say: "Never again war!"; "With war everything is lost". Instill in our hearts the courage to take concrete steps to achieve peace.

Lord, God of Abraham, God of the Prophets, God of Love, you created us, and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of our citizens who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarreling into forgiveness.

Keep alive within us the flame of hope, so that with patience and perseverance we may opt for dialogue and reconciliation. In this way may peace triumph at last, and may the words "division", "hatred" and "war" be banished from the heart of every man and woman. Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that the word which always brings us together will be "brother", and our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam! Amen.

AS WE BEGIN A NEW YEAR, EACH FAMILY IS INVITED TO BLESS THEIR HOME and to use chalk to mark the main doorway(s) of your home. The home blessing can be done as follows:

Use the blessed chalk to write:
20+C+M+B+22
above the main doorways of your home: 2022 for the year;
C, M, B for the 3 Magi Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar –
and also for Christus Mansionem Benedicat,
Latin for "May Christ Bless this House."

As you are writing, pray the following prayer:

May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is Lord, forever and ever. Amen.

You can also bless yourself with holy water and sprinkle holy water on each door.

- 1. **We can never accept any food that has expired.** Please check the expiration dates. It causes our volunteers a great deal of extra work and anything with a past expiration date must be thrown in the trash. We cannot use it.

- 4. **We do not accept clothing (except during our annual coat drive).** Please make your donation of clothing to the St. Vincent de Paul Society or Goodwill. We cannot take clothing of any kind.
- 5. **GIANT EAGLE GIFT CARDS are always welcome, as are monetary donations**, as we can purchase things for the food pantry that we cannot obtain otherwise.


Please be attentive when donating food items to the food pantry. It is for the safety and security of everyone.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK. December 28 is the feast of the Holy Innocents. "A voice is heard in Ramah, weeping and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children and refusing to be comforted, because they are no more." During this octave of Christmas, the Church celebrates the memory of the small children of the neighborhood of Bethlehem put to death by Herod in a jealous attempt to kill the newborn King of the Jews, the child Jesus. Sacrificed by a wicked monarch, these innocent lives bear witness to Christ who was persecuted from the time of His birth by a world which would not receive Him. It is Christ Himself who is at stake in this mass-murder of the children; already the choice, for or against Him, is put clearly before men. But the persecutors are powerless, for Christ came to perform a work of salvation that nothing can prevent; when He fell into the hands of His enemies at the time chosen by God it was to redeem the world by His own Blood. Our Christmas joy is tempered today by a feeling of sadness. But the Church looks principally to the glory of the children, of these innocent victims, whom she shows us in heaven following the Lamb wherever He goes. It is hard on this feast day not to think of all the innocent children who have been massacred in our own country through the great sin and evil of abortion and other children whose lives have been lost through abuse, poverty, and neglect. May they rest in peace.




