REFLECTIONS

SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

The Book of Wisdom celebrates God's promise to the ancestors of the people of Israel that He would free the people from the bondage of Egypt. The people put their trust in these promises and saw God's wonders (Book of Wisdom, chapter 18, verses 6 -7). Egyptians had slain the male children of God's people and the crime was punished by the death of the first-born of Egypt. This intervention by God identified Israel as God' people (verse 8). The Passover meal was thereby established as a sacred bond among the Israelites for sharing their joys and sorrows in common (verse 9), always under God's loving care.

This notion links us to the Gospel text for this Sunday, which is about living without fear and always trusting in God who is capable of making his "little flock," the poor in spirit, sharers in the Kingdom or Reign of God. "The poor" are not so much those who have little or nothing in the realm of material things, but those who know their need for God and who follow the Lord's instructions about trusting in God.

If we place our hope in God, placing our hearts where our treasure is to be found, that is, simply in God, then our treasure is secure (free from "thieves and moths") and well invested, since nothing can be lost ("like purses that do not wear out"). The phrases in quotes about thieves, moths and purses are simply images of security to be found in adhering to God.

Another way to express the truth is this: love entrusts what it has (even if it's nothing in the material realm) into God's faithful and loving hands. This Christian attitude toward life is not based on human wisdom, but flows from a love of Christ. That is spiritual wisdom at its purest and simplest.

The follower of Jesus, called a "servant" in the Gospel text this Sunday, must always be ready for whenever the Master returns, either when we are young, middle aged or elderly. We live in the period between the two coming of Christ. How should we act during this time? If the believer is found awake when the Master returns, the Master will seat that one at the heavenly banquet and even wait on the believer. This may seem preposterous, but it is what Christ teaches. Lamps are to be burning for the Master's return, without fear and trembling, but in love and joy!

All of us who follow Jesus are challenged to be faithful to the task entrusted to us, the responsibility of service to the community of believers to which we belong. Fidelity is being asked of us, who are urged to be always watchful, for we know not the day nor the hour of God's return. Again, not a cause for fright or fleeing, but a call to living mindfully, not haphazardly or blindly, in the presence of God.

The faith and trust that often characterized the ancestors in the faith is the basis on which we today can "give up all" to have God at

It is by watchfulness (the word in Greek is nepsis), a readiness and a sense of responsibility because of the promises of old, that we should desire to live and share in order to obtain the peace and riches that the world cannot give.

FROM THE HEART OF OUR PASTOR, FATHER STUBNA

1. Losing someone we love is never easy but always a painful and difficult experience to endure. Over 40 years of priesthood, I have celebrated countless funerals, including those of my parents, aunts, uncles, cousins and dear friends. These are never easy but for us of course, death is not the end, nor does it destroy the bonds of love forged in this life. As people of faith we are lifted up in our grief by the promise of eternal life, won for us by our Risen Savior in His own Resurrection from the dead. But still we grieve with broken hearts for those we treasure. My younger sister, Mary Beth Presutti, died on Sunday, July 27 after a two year battle with glioblastoma brain cancer. She was only 65 years old, a wife and mother of two boys. She was a nurse who spent her whole career helping and serving others in their illnesses and deaths. For those of you who knew Beth, she was a strong and determined woman, a woman of deep faith in God and a great love for the Church. She was kind and generous to a fault. She had a huge and loving heart. She loved her family and gave of herself to everyone around her. For the past two years she fought valiantly, with such grace, never giving up and exceeding everyone's expectations. Her husband and my brother-in-law, Mike, celebrated 43 years of marriage on July 17 but have been best friends for over 50 years. We are consoled by the reality that she is at peace, in the loving arms of our Lord, whom she loved greatly. So many people have walked this journey with us and we are so very grateful to each of you. You have extended prayers, acts of kindness, love, support, flowers, food and most especially the gift of your presence in Beth's life and ours. That has made all the difference. On July 4, 2023 following her brain surgery and cancer diagnosis, she was given 6 months to live and here we are two years later. There have been so many miracles along the way for which we are deeply grateful. She has been an inspiration to all of us who knew her and loved her. Her medical team at Hillman led by her doctor, Dr. Drappatz were incredible people who loved Beth and we are so grateful to them for their loving care, as well as the Bridges Hospice team in these final months. To all of you who are my extended family, thank you for your loving care of Beth and Mike and our family, including myself. How grateful we are and will always be to have such wonderful people standing with us in our time of need. Her funeral here at the Cathedral on Friday, August 1, was a celebration of faith and a life well lived. May she rest in peace.

OUR ANNUAL MASS AT THE PARKWAY SHRINE in honor of Our Lady will be celebrated on Tuesday, August 12 at 6:30 pm. Father Stubna will celebrate this Mass. This is an annual event celebrated at this unique shrine to Our Lady that overlooks the Parkway East. The shrine is located off the Boulevard of the Allies from the City of Pittsburgh, passing by Bates Street, and then making an immediate right onto Ward Street. At the end of the street, turn left. The small alley does not allow many cars so you need to proceed on foot down the alley to the shrine. Wear appropriate shoes and have some help to make it to the shrine. All are welcome.

SILVER ROSE PROGRAM. A silver rose on a nine-month pilgrimage will be the centerpiece of a special prayer service at Saint Paul Cathedral on Monday, August 11, immediately following the 12:05 p.m. Mass. This special program is sponsored by Knights of Columbus Council 14474 to honor Our Lady of Guadalupe and express both international unity and dedication to the sanctity of human life.

The journey of the silver rose begins each year in March and ends on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. During that time, Silver Roses travel from town to town along eight routes throughout North America. Several of those routes begin in Canada and end in Mexico. The Silver Rose Program began in 1960, when the first rose – a real, live one – was blessed by a bishop in Ontario. The rose then traveled to New York and then to Texas where it was taken across the border into Mexico. The rose ended its pilgrimage at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. To better ensure future annual trips, a silver rose was ultimately made. Today, due to the popularity of the program throughout the North American continent, eight silver roses travel unique routes.

In 2001, when Carl Anderson, Past Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus, expanded the Silver Rose Program, he commented: "Through [the Silver Rose Program] we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the [Knights of Columbus], but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

All members of the parish are encouraged join Knights of Columbus to pray for a civilization of love and culture of life in our own country and throughout the world.

Please Spread the Word! Council 14474 is one of 17,000 Knights of Columbus councils that make up the world's largest Catholic fraternal service organization. Founded in 1882 to assist working-class and immigrant Catholics in the United States, today the approximately two million members of the Knights put their faith into action through a broad range of charitable causes locally, nationally and internationally through financial contributions and hands-on service.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY will be celebrated on Friday, August 15. This is a holyday of obligation which requires Mass attendance for Catholics. **Masses will be celebrated:**

4:00 pm on Thursday, August 14 (Saint Rosalia)

THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION OF MARY is a very old feast of the Church, celebrated universally since the sixth century. The feast was originally celebrated in the East, where it was known as the Feast of the **Dormition**, a word which means "the falling asleep." The earliest printed reference to the belief that Mary's body was assumed into Heaven dates from the fourth century, in a document entitled "The Falling Asleep of the Holy Mother of God." The document is written in the voice of the Apostle John, to whom Christ on the Cross had entrusted the care of His mother, and recounts the death, laying in the tomb, and assumption of the Blessed Virgin. Tradition variously places Mary's death at Jerusalem or at Ephesus, where John was living.

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven at the end of her earthly life is a defined dogma of the Catholic Church. On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII, exercising papal infallibility, declared in "*Munificentissimus Deus*" that it is a dogma of the Church "that the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory." As a dogma, the Assumption is a required belief of all Catholics; anyone who publicly dissents from the dogma, Pope Pius declared, "has fallen away completely from the divine and Catholic Faith."

As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* proclaims: "Finally the Immaculate Virgin Mary, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death." (CCC 966). The Assumption of the Blessed Mother is a singular participation in the Resurrection of her Son, but it is also the sign and hope for every Christian of the resurrection of the body at the final judgment.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK. **August 13** marks the memorial of **St. Pontian**, pope, and **St. Hippolytus**, priest – both of them Fathers of the Church and martyrs. Pontian served as Pope from 230-235 when he was banished to Sardinia by the Roman emperor and subjected to harsh and cruel punishment. He fought for the belief that the mercy of God could forgive all sins which is what the teaching of the Church embraced as the fullness of the teaching of Jesus. Hippolytus, at first, had many conflicts with the Church, often coming close to heresy himself because of his over-zealous behavior, remaining in schism for a number of years because of his radical teaching. He at first believed that some sins could never be forgiven. But his writings provide the fullest source of our knowledge of the Roman liturgy and the structure of the Church in the second and third centuries. Hippolytus was a strong defender of orthodox teaching and before his death admitted his excesses and reconciled himself to the Church. Like Pontian, he was imprisoned and treated cruelly for his faith and shared with him in martyrdom. **August 14** marks the feast of **St. Maximilian Kolbe**. Ordained a priest at the age of 24, he had an immense devotion to our Lady, founding what was called the Militia of the Immaculata, whose purpose was to fight evil with the witness of the good life, prayer, work and suffering. He was arrested by the Nazis and imprisoned for three months in 1939 and then again in 1941. At Auschwitz, when ten men were ordered to be put to death because a prisoner escaped, Maximilian stepped in to replace one of those men because he had a wife and children. In the block of death, Maximilian led the prisoners in prayer and singing and he was the last one to die. He was a model of courage, self-sacrifice and love.

Sisters often travel great distances to outlying communities in order to provide religious education, sacrament preparation, and pastoral outreach, as well as to distribute food, materials, and supplies so that families can meet their basic needs.




