

# Faithful Chronicles By Father Frank D. Almade

As mentioned in last week's column, Pope Francis has called for a Synod of Bishops on the topic of "synodality" for October 2023. Consultation and participation of all the People of God are to mark the run-up to the actual Synod of Bishops over the next two years, at the parish, diocesan, continental and universal level.

Pope Francis knows that these are not easy times to be a follower of Jesus Christ. Let me quote from one preparatory document about the situation of the world: "The context in which this Synod is taking place is a global pandemic, local and international conflicts, growing impact of climate change, migration, various forms of injustice, racism, violence, persecution and increasing inequities across humanity, to name a few. In the Church, the context is also marked by the suffering experienced by minors and vulnerable people, due to sexual abuse and the abuse of power ... by a significant number of clerics and consecrated persons."

These are challenging times! Yet it is our blessing to be called by God today to renew the church and our lived faith in the midst of these challenges.

There are also internal challenges to being a synodal church. Let me suggest some of these, in the form of questions:

- Can we listen to one another? In the words of the prayer of St. Francis, can we "not so much seek to be understood as to understand"?
- Can we listen to (discern) the Holy Spirit in the midst of our various conversations, discussions and opportunities for prayer?
- Can we be honest and transparent in our discussions with one another?
- Can we be inclusive, making every effort to include those who feel marginalized or excluded?
- Can we leave behind prejudices and stereotypes?
- Can we address and overcome "the scourge of clericalism"?
- Can we embrace the cultural diversity of our country, church and world?
- Can we look to the future with hope, and avoid falling back on the lame excuse, "we've always done it this way"?
- Can we respect the rights, dignity and opinion of every participant?
- Can we acknowledge and respect the rightful authority of the pastors of the church?

In a section listing pitfalls which prevent the church from being synodal, another Vatican document lists temptations to be avoided:

- The temptation of wanting to lead ourselves instead of being led by God.
- The temptation to only see problems, and not see hope.
- The temptation of focusing only on structures.
- The temptation not to look beyond the visible confines of the Church, to the possibilities of our world.
- The temptation of conflict and division.
- The temptation of seeing the synod as a parliament or congress, in which there are only winners and losers.
- The temptation to listen only to those already involved in church activities.

I have tried to lay out the outline of Pope Francis's vision for the church in this preparation for the 2023 Synod of Bishops. I encourage you to read more on the U.S. bishops' website, www.usccb.org . Let me conclude with a couple of personal comments.

When I wrote my doctoral dissertation on the right to a just wage for all workers, one special takeaway was the power of participation. When we participate—in voting, offering an opinion, forming unions or being church—we feel more human. Our dignity is uplifted. We feel heard and healthy. Participation is a virtue, and we need to exercise it as church. Participation is one key to making our church "more real" and "more appealing."

Listening is hard. For ten years I have been a member of a priest support group. We gather once a month to air grievances, tell stories and support one another. I have to admit, it is much easier to talk during these sessions than to listen. I am constantly trying in these gatherings to really listen to someone who thinks or acts differently than me, whose family and formation are different than mine. As Pope Francis wants us to listen to one another in "a synodal church" we cannot underestimate the difficulty of becoming better listeners.

As Americans we are blessed to live in a democracy. But recent history has indicated that conflicts in our political system are on the rise, and community and the common good trending downward. It is tempting to see "synodality" as synonymous with "democracy." It is not. We have to avoid the us/them divisions prevalent today. We have to rejoice in the teaching authority of the church and its foundations: the Sacred Scriptures, the catechism, canon law, the witness of the saints in every age. Being a synodal church means we rely on prayer and discernment of the Holy Spirit working in our midst.

I ask all of you to pray to the Holy Spirit for the Synod of Bishops of 2023, and all that leads up to it.





### Saint of the Week

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St, Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint"
