# MASS TIME CHANGE

Our Mass schedule will change to our Fall/Winter schedule beginning next Sunday, September 4th. The only change is to the last Mass on Sunday. Mass times will be:

Dear Parishioners,

The theme of the Readings for today is the virtue of *humility*. So, what is humility? We often confuse humility with modesty or timidity, which are similar. Modesty and timidity are more about concern with outward appearances or speech, whereas humility is a spiritual or internal virtue. Humility recognizes that all we are and all we have are gifts from God even though we might have worked hard to acquire them. He gave us time, talents, or opportunity to acquire them. There is no such thing as a "self-made" man or woman. Further, our recognition of God's gifts should cause us to help those less fortunate. Let us see how this is illustrated in today's readings.

The First Reading is from the *Book of Sirach (3:17-18, 20, 28-29)*. Sirach might be considered to be a book of "Good Counsel." The writer is giving sage advice when he encourages all mankind to be humble, for boasting and arrogance have no place in the kingdom of God. The message is straight-forward and needs little interpretation and yet, modern society seems to think that humility is only for the



meek or weak. In reality, it takes a strong character and a strong sense of God in one's life to be truly humble.

The **Responsorial Psalm** is (68:4-7, 10-11). This prayer picks up the same theme recognizing our dependence upon God as the "father of orphans and the defender of widows," and it is He who gives all talents and graces to those who seek His guidance.

The Second Reading is from the *Letter to the Hebrews (12:18-19, 22-24A)*. The author is comparing the harshness of the Mosaic Law of the Old Testament with the Love and forgiveness that Jesus holds out to us in the new covenant. These are gifts that we don't deserve but are offered none the less because of God's benevolence. The strange language about "a blazing fire, gloomy darkness, a trumpet blast and people begging to have no further messages" are in reference to many scenes of the Israelites in the desert during the time of Moses. (See Exodus 19:12-20) While there, fear was used to get the people to obey God's commands. What *we* should fear is being left out of Heaven because we could do "it" all by ourselves without God's help or guidance.

The **Gospel Reading** is from the **Gospel of Luke (14:1, 7-14).** All of Chapter 14 is a lesson in humility and probably the clearest statement from Jesus on the subject, "For everyone who exalts himself shall be humbled and he who humbles himself shall be exalted," in the eyes of God. The last part of this reading, with reference to inviting the poor, the lame and the blind to dinner, is not so much a directive, but rather an exaggeration of the point of observing the virtue of humility to benefit those less fortunate.

Again, we must try to understand the spiritual (or Biblical) meaning of *humility*. It does not mean to demean or belittle oneself, but instead to recognize who we are in the eyes of God and what God is in our life and then recognizing that all of our possessions, talents, and good qualities are God's gifts to us. *What we do with them is our gift to God*. Something to think about during your prayer time this week!
