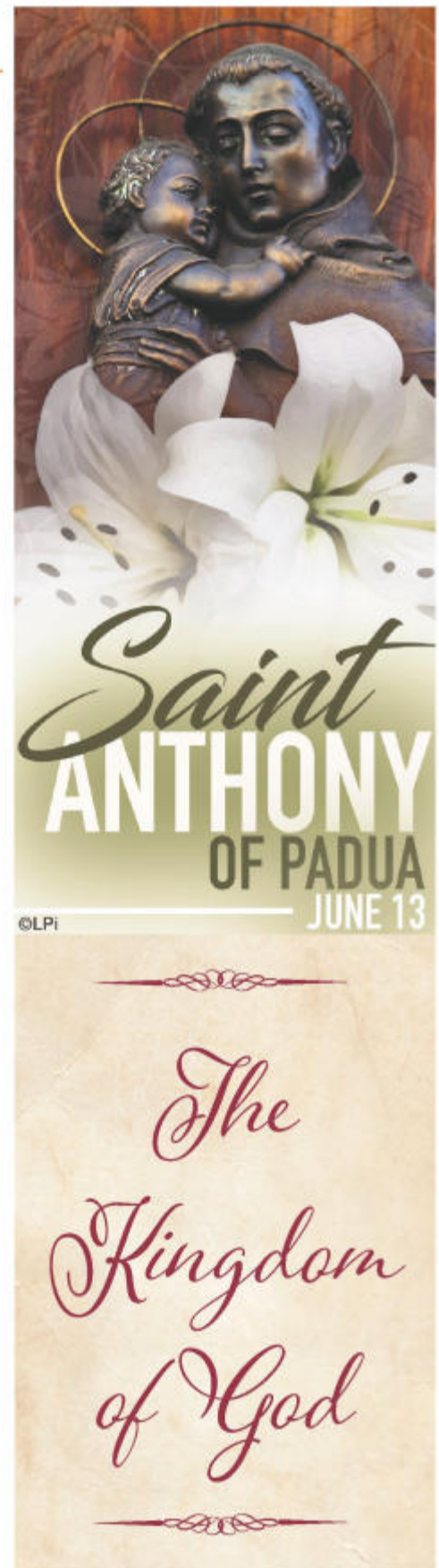

## **Summer Update on Feeding the Hungry**

It will be some time before the neighborhood network returns to feeding the hungry in our community at a sit-down meal. However, they will continue to provide take-out meals. In early June we have the opportunity to help a struggling local caterer. They will provide a meal of meatloaf, mashed potatoes, green beans, gravy, drinks, fruit and a dessert. Through your generosity we will fund the full cost of this meal. Later in the month, we will purchase 6 pans of mac and cheese to be served with hotdogs they have on hand. In early July, we will purchase several pans of lasagna for the Monday meal. The Neighborhood Network lets us know what their specific needs are for each month or two and we decide how we can help them financially meet that need.

This financial assistance is possible because of your continued funding of the Feed the Hungry account. Your contributions help feed many individuals including "weary travelers" like the individual in the photo who are so hungry that they receive their meal and immediately sit of the steps of the auditorium to eat their meal. Thank you to all those who continue to help address hunger in our community.

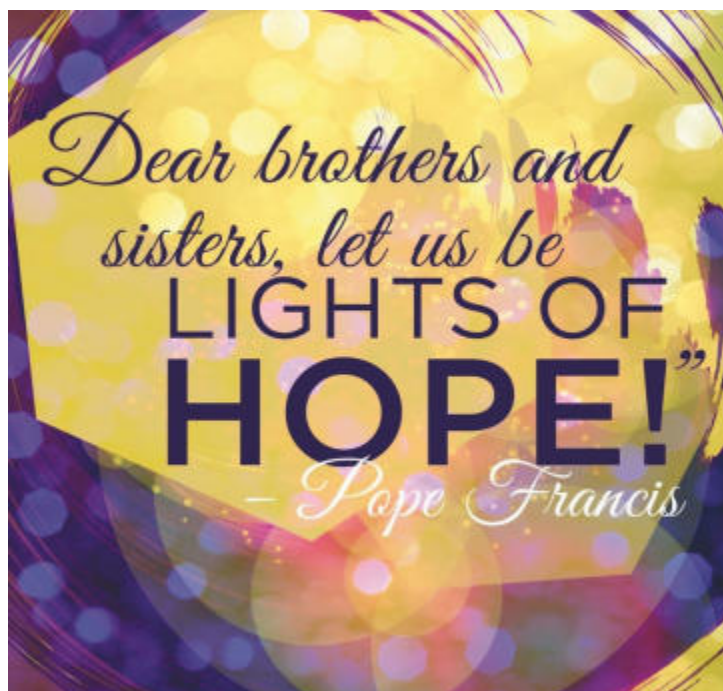

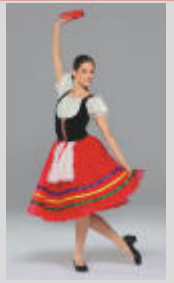

### **DEACON DABBLINGS - WHAT TEACHERS MAKE**

The dinner guests were sitting around the table discussing life. One man decided to explain the problem with education. He argued, "What's a kid going to learn from someone who decided his best option in life was to become a teacher?" He reminded the other dinner guests what they say about teachers: "Those who can, do. Those who can't, teach."

To stress his point he said to another guest; "You're a teacher, Bonnie. Be honest. What do you make?" Bonnie, who had a reputation for honesty and frankness replied, "You want to know what I make? She paused for a second, then began, "Well, I make kids work harder than they ever thought they could. I make a C+ feel like the Congressional Medal of Honor. I make kids sit through 40 minutes of class time when their parents can't make them sit for 5 without an iPad, Game Cube, or movie rental.

"You want to know what I make?" She paused again and looked at each and every person at the table. I make kids wonder. I make them question. I make them criticize. I make them apologize and mean it. I make them have respect and take responsibility for their actions. I teach them to write and then I make them write. I make them read, read, read. I make them show all their work in math. I make my students from other countries learn everything they need to know in English while preserving their unique cultural identity. I make my classroom a place where all my students feel safe. I make my students stand to say the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, because we live in the United States of America.

Finally, I make them understand that if they use the gifts they were given, work hard, and follow their hearts they can succeed in life. Bonnie paused one last time and then continued. "Then, when people try to judge me by what I make, I can hold my head up high and pay no attention. You want to know what I make? "I make a difference. What do you make?"

I use this story to illustrate two points. The first point is that it is not an exaggeration to say that a great teacher can change a student's life. There are an endless amount of great teacher stories that attest to the benefits of a strong relationship between an educator and pupil. And the second point is that it's no accident that his followers called Jesus Teacher. He made the Apostles wonder: Where is He taking us? He made them take responsibility for continuing His mission after he left. He made them understand that the gift of the Holy Spirit would guide them. Through parables he made them understand helping the poor, the importance of faith in God and Himself, forgiveness for the repentant, opening the eyes of the blind and the ears of the deaf. Through it all HE MADE A DIFFERENCE!

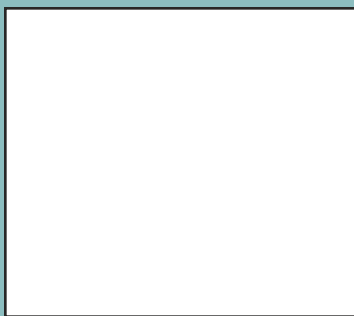

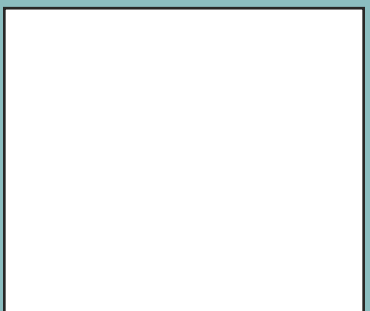
