



Inspiration for the week

God calls us to bring His Word to all corners of the earth. What does that mean for you and me? We are just simple and humble folks trying to find our way through the Gospel and our world. After all, we are not professional preachers but gentle servants. Jesus summons us to take his message on the road and bring it from the pew to the pavement. We cannot keep the joy of the Gospel to ourselves but must bring it into every aspect of our lives: our families, our schools, our work, our corporations, our politics, our social circles, and our philosophies. We cannot just accept the wisdom of the world as true and conduct our lives as if the Good News is a separate matter. They are one. Jesus never asked his friends to go and construct buildings where people could come to hear the truth. He asked them to go to their homes and meet them one on one, face to face. When the rubber meets the road and the message is challenging, rejection is quite possible. That's the litmus test for whether we're really doing what we have been asked.





SUCKED IN, WASHED UP, BLOWN OVER

Peepus the parakeet never saw it coming. One second he was peacefully perched in his cage. The next he was sucked in, washed up, and blown over. The prob-



lems began when Peepus' owner decided to clean his cage with a vacuum cleaner. She removed the attachment from the end of the hose and stuck it in the cage. The phone rang, and she turned to pick it up. She'd barely said "hello" when "ssssopp!" Peepus got sucked in. The bird's owner gasped, put down the phone, turned off the vacuum cleaner, and opened the bag. There was Peepus, still alive, but stunned. Since the bird was covered with dust, hair and all the stuff you find in a dust bag, she grabbed him and raced to the bathroom, turned on the tap, and held Peepus under the running water. Then, realizing that Peepus was soaked and shivering, she did what any compassionate bird owner would do, she reached for the hair dryer and blasted him with hot air. Poor Peepus never knew what hit him. A few days after the trauma, a friend who had heard about Peepus' troubles contacted his owner to see how the bird was recovering. "Well," she replied, "Peepus doesn't sing much anymore. He just sits and stares." Who can blame him? Sucked in, washed up, and blown over, that's enough to steal the song from the stoutest heart. Things happen in our lives that come along unexpectedly and we end up feeling a bit like Peepus, sucked in, washed up, and blown over.

I would image that most people, if they live long enough, could relate to Peepus' troubles and as a result, begin to feel afraid and vulnerable. Remember a couple of weeks ago where the disciples in the boat were tossed back and forth, afraid and vulnerable? We all face adverse events and situations in life. You might be going through a season of hardships in your life at this time. This could be job loss, finances, sickness, loss of a loved one, relationship with a troubled child, or even divorce. But whatever the challenge is, you can have the determination to see things through as you find your strength in God.

As I write this week's Deacon Dabblings, it has been 7 days since the collapse of the condominium in Surfside, Florida. The death toll has reached 16 and 147 are still unaccounted for. There is no question that friends and relatives of those victims are feeling sucked in, washed up, and blown over. Many of the news stories focus on the faith shone by those anxiously awaiting word about their loved ones.

I find the Apostle Paul's words in Romans 8: 35, 37 to be very encouraging in times of adversity: "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall trouble or hardship or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? ... No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us."

Allow these verses to resonate in your heart, and know that no matter how bad the situation you are facing is, you can experience God's love, and nothing can separate you from it.




