





#### **Feeding the Hungry Update for September**

A sincere thank you goes out to all the parishioners who have contributed and continue to contribute to the Feed the Hungry account. Because of your generosity we had the opportunity to fund the Monday take-out meal on August 30<sup>th</sup> for the Neighborhood Network (NN) that was catered by the La Nuova Aurora Society. We also purchased 8 trays of frozen lasagna from GFS and delivered them to the NN for use in September.

What's next for tri-parish outreach ministry? The Monday meals will continue to be distributed as take out meals for the foreseeable future. The coordinator of the meal lets our outreach ministry know what their needs are so we can respond accordingly. Funds in the account do not feed the hungry if they sit in the account. Therefore, the ministry tries to fund as many NN needs as are brought forward to us. We will see how we can assist them financially in November with Thanksgiving food boxes that they will distribute along with turkeys provided by the 2<sup>nd</sup> Harvest Food Bank. Our parish donation covered the purchase of all the food items that accompanied the turkeys last year. Earlier this year the coordinator of the Monday meal gave us this message to ponder. It should remind all of us that the need to reach out is vital to our community.

"I'm thinking about a young boy who is homeless with his family moving weekly from place to place.... they have lost their belongings etc.....I always give him extra food and last week I said "hang in there". His response was "I have nothing to hang onto." Daily, I think and pray for him and his siblings and it just breaks my heart."





#### WE WILL NEVER FORGET!

On September 11, 2001, almost 3,000 innocent people lost their lives to terrorist attacks on United States soil and airspace. At 8:46 a.m. American Airlines Flight 11 traveling from Boston to Los Angeles hit the north tower of the World Trade Center in New York City. At 9:03 a.m. United Airlines Flight 175 also traveling from Boston to Los Angeles hit the south tower of the World Trade Center in New York City. At 9:37 a.m. American Airlines Flight 77 traveling from Dulles, Virginia, to Los Angeles hit the Pentagon Building in Washington. And at 10:03 a.m. United Airlines Flight 93 traveling from Newark, New Jersey, to San Francisco crashed in a field near Shanksville, PA.

As U.S. troops pull out of Afghanistan, Americans are preparing to commemorate the 20th anniversary of 9/11, which many believe led the United States into the war. I wanted to find a way to commemorate those who died in the attacks but I wasn't quite sure how to do it until I came across an article that had quotes referring to that tragic day. One of the mottos that came out of the tragedy was "We will never forget." Reflect on these quotes and let them enter the recesses of your heart.

"If we learn nothing else from this tragedy, we learn that life is short and there is no time for hate."—Sandy Dahl, wife of Flight 93 pilot Jason Dahl, in Shanksville, Pennsylvania, in 2002.

"My older brother John lived [his life] in Technicolor. ... When he walked in the door, the whole house lit up. And I'm sure heaven lit up when he got there too."—Anthoula Katsimatides at the World Trade Center site -2005.

"One of the worst days in America's history saw some of the bravest acts in Americans' history. We'll always honor the heroes of 9/11. And here at this hallowed place, we pledge that we will never forget their sacrifice."—

President George W. Bush at the Pentagon in 2008.

None of them saw past 10:00 am Sept 11, 2001. In one single moment life may never be the same. As you live and enjoy the breaths you take today and tonight before you go to sleep in preparation for your life tomorrow, kiss the ones you love, snuggle a little tighter, and never take one second of your life for granted."—Unknown
