Sincerely yours, Paul

Nine of the letters attributed to Saint Paul were sent to large groups of people: the Romans, Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Thessalonians. They are filled with advice, instruction, and spiritual insights for these communities. The remaining four letters, however, were addressed to specific people: Timothy, Titus, and Philemon.

Written later in Paul's life, they are shorter and a bit more private. Though these letters were perhaps intended to be read by only a few people, they are now quite public because they were copied and shared with other followers of Jesus. For almost 20 centuries, Christians have recognized them as inspired, as words that feed us as much now as they did these first-century Christians. The feast of Saints Timothy and Titus (January 26) uses these letters.

Once a Christian-hater who became a phenomenal Christian leader, Paul, through his letters, guided and strengthened an unfolding Church, helping believers keep their new faith growing, alive, and true. Did Paul realize that these letters would be read for centuries by Christians all over the world? Almost 2,000 years later, they are still full of rich help to countless Christians who strive to nurture their faith. (Unless otherwise noted, all translations are from the New American Bible.)

#### **Special Wedding Anniversaries**



### **DEACON DABBLINGS...**GET OUT THE SHOVEL

It took a while but the winter weather has finally arrived. As I write this edition of "Deacon Dabblings" I am watching the snow quickly piling up on my sidewalk and driveway and for as beautiful as it is, I know that soon someone in my household will need to go out into the harsh elements and remove the accumulated blanket of Mother Nature's white winter gift that, if no action is taken, will eventually prevent me from getting my car out of the garage. Seeing that my household is comprised of my wife and I and two cats, I think we all know who will soon be outside in the blowing snow clearing a path for escape.

We often hear people talk about how much they hate winter; not only the snow and the cold but also the darkness associated with the shorter hours of daylight related to this time of year. And although I too can find some reasons for disliking winter (see paragraph above) there is a certain spiritual dimension to this season that I find calming.

We read in Ecclesiastes, "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens...a time to plant and a time to uproot...a time to search and a time to give up...He (God) has made everything beautiful in its own time."

What if we approached our spiritual life from a perspective of understanding that each season would teach us lessons on how to develop a close relationship with God? Our spiritual seasons typically mirror what we see in nature. Here we are in winter and if we just focus on the harshness of the weather and consider everything around us as being dead, then we miss a great opportunity for growth, both spiritually and psychologically. This is typically a period when things are not growing or blooming outside. Animals are hibernating and if we are smart we should take a cue from nature because this is a time to rest. Since we are indoors much of the time during these shorter days of sunlight, we have the opportunity to take time to take inventory of the relationship that we have with God.

We shouldn't resist this chance to rest. Rather, we should welcome the opportunity to grow in strength, endurance and faith. This is a good time to really hear from God by taking the time to quietly listen to what He has to say to you. Yes, "...God has made everything beautiful in its own time."

Let's take him up on His graciousness and rest in Him.
