#### **PASTORAL PLANNING**

The following are excerpts from a letter from Bishop Persico regarding the Erie Diocesan Pastoral Planning and Restructuring.

In our ongoing effort to create parish communities that are vibrant, dynamic and able to welcome parishioners old and new, we are embarking on another more formal round of parish restructuring.

As the data we commissioned in 2015 predicted, our realities also have changed significantly. As expected, the number of practicing Catholics in our diocese has declined steeply, as has the number of active priests available to serve in parishes. Attendance in our Catholic schools continues to decrease as well.

- The number of people attending Sunday Mass in our diocese went from 120,000 in 1990 to 26,770 in 2022. That's a 78 percent decrease. These numbers underscore the reason significant adjustments must be made.
- The number of students in our Catholic schools has dropped by 38 percent since 2013/14, while the number of students attending faith formation has gone down by 53 percent.
- The number of parishes in our diocese during these same timeframes changed from 127 in 1990 to 117 in 2012 and 93 in 2023.
- And finally, we consider the number of active priests serving in the diocese over the past three decades: In 1990 - 210 in 2012 - 130 and in 2023 - 92

We estimate that number will be around 60 by 2031, just eight years from now. (Please note: not all "60" are available to work as a parish priest.)

Our churches are beautiful and we have strong attachments to them. We are comfortable in the parish communities many of us have known our entire lives. But Jesus asked us to go out and proclaim the good news, not to keep the buildings we inherited open at all costs. So, if our mission is to care for souls, celebrate the Eucharist, proclaim and live the Gospel, catechize the faithful and help others develop a personal relationship with Christ, we have no choice but to be open to change. We all belong to the Diocese of Erie and we have the responsibility to ensure that the needs of all our sisters and brothers are met as we plan for the future.

#### The clergy

While the decline of population — and more significantly, the decline of the number of practicing Catholics in our region — is significant, I cannot share my thoughts about planning without taking the time to discuss our clergy. As I write this letter, we have four parishes without pastors: St. Thomas in Corry, St. Teresa in Union City, and Our Mother of Sorrows as well as Our Lady of Mount Carmel in Erie. From what I can see, it is not going to get any better. Even if the Lord blessed us with a significant increase in vocations, our needs would outpace our ability to meet them in the coming years. To that end, I ask that parishioners make every effort to be as supportive of their pastors as they can during pastoral planning. We all are in the same boat. While commiserating with each other is understandable, complaining will not advance the cause. I, of course, encourage charity, generosity and optimism on the part of our clergy as well.

I invite you to make a special effort to pray and sacrifice for the priests who serve you in the coming months. I have no doubt that prayer will play a key role in the success of this initiative.

Pastoral planning and its implementation is the responsibility of all of us. We must rise to the challenge. Is it going to be easy? No. Will there be a sense of loss, and will accepting the changes be difficult? Yes. Jesus said we would have to take up our cross to follow him. He also said he would send the Spirit to be with us. Our pastoral planning prayer asks for "the vision to see new paths of possibility" as well as "the strength to be unafraid of what is new." This is a moment that calls for all of us, clergy and laity alike, to let go of some of our old ways of doing things.

I look forward to working with you in a collaborative spirit, knowing we are doing what needs to be done to live out our mission and create parish communities that are vibrant, life-giving places of worship where people find encouragement and hope as they grow in their relationship with Christ, his church and each other.





#### Feeding the Hungry

This past Monday, Sacred Heart's Debbie Salamon prepared a wonderful meal that was served at the SSJNN Monday meal to 70 men, women and children. Your continued financial assistance allows us to fund the cost of the meals that Debbie prepares on a monthly basis.

#### Refugee Resettlement

Your Kinship Ministry is very busy this month assisting Catholic Charities with refugee resettlement. We have 5 families and 2 single men arriving in Erie from refugee camps this month. The total number of persons you are assisting within these family groups is 35! We have been working with Catholic Charities for over a year now and at the end of this month you will have helped furnish approximately 36 households. We could not have done so without your continued household item and financial support. Kinship Ministry would like to continue this work but to do so we need to continue to ask frequently for specific items and for your financial support. Your financial support allows us to purchase needed household items that we fall short of even with your item donations. We shop at Ollies and use coupons to save what we can. We continue to need the items listed on our shopping list contained in the last 2 church bulletins. A couple of items are extremely low and their donation would be greatly appreciated to meet this month's immediate demand. Those items are women's hair brushes, combs for women and men, deodorant for men and women, brooms with dust pans, rugs for both entry ways and bathrooms, adult and baby shampoo, queen- and twin-size sheet sets, tall kitchen waste baskets, and bath towel sets.

#### **Coffee Collection**

The coffee, creamer, and individually wrapped snacks collected to this point have been distributed to Community of Caring, the SSJNN Monday Meal, and to Community Shelter Services. These 3 agencies recently contacted us and asked if we could meet this particular need for them. Approximately a case of coffee was distributed to each agency this past week. We are ending this drive now but will certainly deliver any late donations.

#### DEACON DABBLINGS... WE NEED YOU DAD

Father's Day is this weekend but as we celebrate, we must not forget the millions of children who are growing up without a dad or father figure in the home. Data from the United States Census Bureau shows that nearly 18.5 million children grow up without their fathers. This makes the United States the world's leader in children without fathers. It is incomprehensible that our country, a world leader in so many positive aspects of life, is also a world leader when it comes to dysfunctional family units. Yes, a family without a father or father figure is dysfunctional! I know that I will get some push-back on that statement, but fatherhood is essential to the development of our children, and the increased involvement of fathers in the home leads to a more stable environment for children who are growing up in a time that respect for authority has all but disappeared, the culture of using drugs has grown out of control, and violence is the norm rather than the exception. Fatherless youth eventually become adults who, without the structure of a two-parent household, struggle to gain their footing in the world.

Before I go any further, this is not a denunciation of single mothers. Women who are raising children on their own face the monumental task of juggling work, household duties, and parenting. The criticism is aimed at a society that has embraced a certain lifestyle that has reduced the importance of faith, family, and education. Back when I was growing up, these three principles were considered of utmost importance and adherence to these principles molded a society that so much different than what we have now. Was everything perfect then? Of course not! Yet, living where faith, family, and education was central, developed a society of respect for one another. Order was kept in classrooms because teachers were respected by the students and their parents.

Faith was introduced and was nurtured within the family. People went to church, together, as a family. They ate their meals, together, as a family where they exchanged ideas, goals, and if there was any strife, often, it could be worked out during that meal. The role of father and mother was distinct, the father whose unofficial role as head of the family was to be the provider and mentor. The mother was the nurturer of the family. She was the stabilizing instrument when situations appeared that required common sense, and warmth.

Ok! I just described Ozzie and Harriet. And yes, that portrayal of family life is bias against the role of women in family and in society but the whole point of this article is that today, nobody has time to sit and eat together, or go to church together (if church attendance is even considered). Today, many families are fragmented, and, in most cases, those fragmented families are families without fathers.

On this Father's day weekend, let's think back to our own fathers and what they meant to us. One of the most vital aspects of a father's contribution to the lives of his children is the different parenting style from that of a mother. An article by Dr. David Popenoe, Professor of Sociology at Rutgers University states, "They introduce them to a wider variety of methods of dealing with life. They tend to stress rules, justice, fairness, and duty in discipline. In this way, they teach children the objectivity and consequences of right and wrong. They give kids insight into the world of men. They prepare them for the challenges of life and demonstrate by example the meaning of respect between the sexes. Moms raise children with sympathy, care, and help, thus demonstrating the importance of relationships. Dads tend to see their child in relation to the rest of the world. Moms tend to see the rest of the world in relation to their child. Neither style of parenting is adequate in and of itself. Taken together, they balance each other out and equip the up-and-coming generation with a healthy, well-rounded approach to life."


