Mary, Mother of God

Mary's divine motherhood broadens the Christmas spot light. Mary has an important role to play in the Incarnation of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity. She consents to God's invitation conveyed by the angel (Luke 1:26-38). Elizabeth proclaims: "Most blessed are you

among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb.
(Luke 1:42-43)

The precise title "Mother of God" goes back at least to the third or fourth century. In the Greek form *Theotokos* (God-bearer), it became the touchstone of the Church's teaching about the Incarnation. The Council of Ephesus in 431 insisted that the holy Fathers were right in calling the Holy Virgin *Theotokos*. The tradition reaches to our own day. In its chapter on Mary's role in the Church, Vatican II's *Constitution on the Church* calls Mary "Mother of God twelve times.

Jesus, Mary and Joseph

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is indeed a Holy Family uniquely blest by God like no other family ever was and ever will be. They were not immune from problems. For example, we recall that they had to leave Bethlehem and go to Egypt because Herod was in "search of the child to destroy Him. (Matthew 2:13). Also, when Jesus was twelve years old, He had been lost for three days, but Mary and Joseph found "Him in the temple sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them, and asking them questions." (Luke 2:46)

The life of Mary and Joseph was tremendously blest by living and being in the presence of Jesus in His formative and young adult years. After the event in the temple, the Scriptures tell us that "He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and His Mother kept all these things in Her Heart. SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick—Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request. Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
