**Elizabeth Ann Seton,** SC (8/28/1774-1/4/1821) was a Catholic religious sister in the United States and an educator known as a founder of the country's parochial school system. After her death she became the first person born (in what would become the United States) to be canonized by the Catholic Church on September 14, 1975. She also established the first Catholic girls' school in the nation in Emmits-

burg, MD where she also founded the first American congregation of religious sisters, *the Sisters of Charity*.


# **Epiphany 2022 Our Journey of Life and Faith**

My brothers and sisters, each year during the Christmas Season we celebrate the wonderful Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. The word *epiphany* means manifestation (showing forth of glory). The showing forth of glory is, of course, the Baby Jesus, the Newborn King of the Jews.

The wise men often referred to as the *Magi* or *Kings*, were in search of the Newborn King as they follow the star. As our Gospel reads the Magi needed some further directions. So, they stop in Jerusalem and after talking to King Herod, "he sent them to Bethlehem and said, 'go and search diligently for the child."" (Matthew 2:8)

We all are familiar of what happened next. The Magi entered the house where Jesus, Mary and Joseph were and "offered Him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh." (Matthew 2:11b). They made a physical journey of traveling to Bethlehem and a spiritual journey of faith in following the star that led them to the Savior of the World. The Magi then made their journey of life and faith back to their homes in the East where they had undoubtedly shared their wonderful journey experience with others.

My friends, **our journey of life and faith** began and continued at our conception, birth and baptism. We have developed that journey in following the "star of grace and inspiration that led us to learn about our Catholic faith, and especially in receiving Jesus in the Sacrament of the Eucharist—the Mass. # SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

**Baptism** – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

**Confirmation** – High School youth who are entering the 11<sup>th</sup> grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

# SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

# SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request. Reconciliation - The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 - 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
