

A Teaching Moment...

What happens to a consecrated host if it accidentally falls to the ground? The short answer is that nothing happens to the consecrated host. The Real Presence of Jesus remains in the consecrated host or any consecrated wine that might accidentally be spilled. Now, if this happens, the priest, deacon, or extraordinary minister of Holy Communion would immediately pick up the dropped host and consume it. If it is the Precious Blood that has been spilled, the minister would use the purificator to clean the spill and then the area would be reverently washed as soon as the Mass is over and the water poured into the *sacrarium* (a special sink located in the Sacristy for reverently disposing of holy water).

Saint of the Week

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Feast Day: January 6th

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, the patron saint of Catholic schools, was born in New York City on August 28, 1774 to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When Elizabeth turned 19 she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. In 1803, while the family was living in Italy, Elizabeth's husband died of tuberculosis leaving Elizabeth a young widow. While in Italy Elizabeth discovered the Catholic faith. In 1805 Elizabeth and her family returned home to New York City and Elizabeth converted to Catholicism.

In 1809 Elizabeth and her family moved to Emmitsburg, Maryland where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first

community for religious women established in the United States. Elizabeth also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

Elizabeth died January 4, 1821. She was canonized on September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."
