Sixth Sunday of Easter

FIRST READING—Acts of the Apostles 15:1-2, 22-29

Some who had come down from Judea were instructing the brothers, “Unless you are circumcised according to the Mosaic practice, you cannot be saved.” Because there arose no little dissension and debate by Paul and Barnabas with them, it was decided that Paul, Barnabas, and some of the others should go up to Jerusalem to the apostles and elders about this question.

The apostles and elders, in agreement with the whole church, decided to choose representatives and to send them to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas. The ones chosen were Judas, who was called Barsabbas, and Silas, leaders among the brothers. This is the letter delivered by them:

“The apostles and the elders, your brothers, to the brothers in Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia of Gentile origin: greetings. Since we have heard that some of our number who went out without any mandate from us have upset you with their teachings and disturbed your peace of mind, we have with one accord decided to choose representatives and to send them to you along with our beloved Barnabas and Paul, who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. So we are sending Judas and Silas who will also convey this same message by word of mouth: ‘It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities, namely, to abstain from meat sacrificed to idols, from blood, from meats of strangled animals, and from unlawful marriage. If you keep free of these, you will be doing what is right. Farewell.’”

SECOND READING—Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23

The angel took me in spirit to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. It gleamed with the splendor of God. Its radiance was like that of a precious stone, like jasper, clear as crystal. It had a massive, high wall, with twelve gates where twelve angels were stationed and on which names were inscribed, the names of the twelve tribes of the Israelites. There were three gates facing east, three north, three south, and three west. The wall of the

city had twelve courses of stones as its foundation, on which were inscribed the twelve names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb.

I saw no temple in the city for its temple is the Lord God almighty and the Lamb. The city had no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God gave it light, and its lamp was the Lamb.

GOSPEL—John 14:23-29

Jesus said to his disciples:

“Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me.

“I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid. You heard me tell you, ‘I am going away and I will come back to you.’ If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father; for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it happens, so that when it happens you may believe.”

THE NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

LIVE IN THE TRUTH

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JAY



We are just under 11 years away from a major milestone—April 17, 2033—commemorating the greatest moment of human history: The Resurrection of Jesus Christ! Last week I discussed what that means. But HOW can we make it relevant in our daily lives?

To live the promise of Christ's Resurrection in our own lives here on earth, we each must engage our **heart, mind** and **body** to be fired up by Jesus!

HEART

Opening our hearts to those around us, and loving the way Jesus did, takes place in our relationships. This is where evangelization begins: by loving Jesus, loving ourselves, and loving our neighbors with no qualifications... Just building all relationships on love.


MIND

This means engaging our curiosity about the truth. Everyone wants to believe that there is something fundamental that is true. Something that all lesser truths are built upon. Even Pontius Pilate asked Jesus, "What is truth?" But truth itself isn't a *what*. It's a *who*! We engage this curiosity by catechization, and we earn the right to teach by listening to the curiosity of others, then responding with heartfelt love of Jesus in the truth.

BODY

We have absolute freedom in morality (Jesus declares that the truth sets us free). Freedom isn't simply doing whatever we wish, whatever we feel makes us happy in the moment. That's called hedonism. True freedom comes from existing in the way we were purposely created to exist. Morality is the response of our hearts and minds to live the love that Jesus desires for us. Accepting what Christ teaches is true frees us to be ourselves. The Christian Catholic way is the path to freedom and fulfillment here and in heaven.

Let go of our prejudices toward Jesus and his Church and allow Him total access to our hearts, minds and bodies. We let internet information and images in; we let the voices of athletes, actors, and world leaders in; we let our family and friends in. Letting Jesus into all the facets of our person is how we will take the daily, decisive step toward Jesus' loved relationships, curiosity for the truth and freedom in morality.

The best way to love, learn and live is to let Jesus reveal to us the best version of ourselves. 

THE DETAILS

As we continue reading from the final two chapters of *Revelation*, we are presented with an odd vision. The Heavenly Jerusalem is floating out of the sky down toward the earth, and it is described in intricate detail. What is going on here?

There is a long history in the scriptures of prophetic visions of a Heavenly Jerusalem. *Tobit 13:16-17* and *Isaiah 54:11-12* contain shorter descriptions, and *Ezekiel 40-48* contains a much longer and far more detailed description. This passage from *Revelation* draws heavily from the *Ezekiel* passage. All the small details recall the Lord's original description of the tabernacle that Moses built, described in excruciating detail in *Exodus 25-27* and *35-40*. All of these taken together point to the fact that the details matter to the Lord.


Since the details are not as important to us, the Church has us skip over a few verses in the middle of this passage. In *verses 15-21*, an angel measures the Heavenly Jerusalem and finds it to be a cube with walls measuring 200 feet thick and 1,500 miles long! That would stretch from Miami, Florida, to the southern border of New Hampshire.

The God of this giant, gleaming city is also the Lord of the loneliest places in your heart.

MISSIONARY COOPERATION SUNDAY—JUNE 4-5

One of the ways the Roman Catholic Church is deeply inspirational is through her missionary work. For millennia, the Church has sent forth innumerable Catholic missionaries to bring relief to the poor. We serve women, children, and men of all races and religions. The Church pursues the poor and serves them because poverty is painful. There is no other litmus test.

This year, **Missionary Cooperation Sunday is the weekend of June 4-5.** As with the past couple of years, because of restrictions we will not host a missionary but instead will hear a homily letter written by a missionary.

Our parish this year is supporting the *Sisters of Mary Immaculate* for their mission in India. The aim of their community is the holistic development of family, the spiritual, moral, social and material welfare. They do this mainly through their village apostolate and home visitation programs. They go into the villages, stay with the people, visit their homes and meet them in their own life situation. They are consequently then able to help transform these families through, for example Basic Nursing Training program. Their sisters are engaged in the ministry of fighting against the modern slavery of human trafficking. They are constantly on the move, visiting villages, schools, parishes, organizing awareness program and finding ways to keep the women and girls safe.

Realizing that it has been a difficult few years for all of us, we can only imagine how difficult it has been for people who live in countries with no or very few safety nets. Please be as generous as possible through prayer and financial support in helping to offer the safety net that the *Sisters of Mary Immaculate* is providing for the people of India.

As Catholics, we believe that Christ becomes truly present within the Blessed Sacrament. As promised by Him, His Presence is abiding, not something that vanishes at the conclusion of Mass. During Eucharistic Adoration, we can sit silently in His Presence and open ourselves to His Graces. Adoration available at Our Lady of Peace, Monday-Thursday 8AM-8PM and perpetually at Saints John & Paul, Sunday-Friday.
