FIRST READING—Acts of the Apostles 7:55-60

Stephen, filled with the Holy Spirit, looked up intently to heaven and saw the glory of God and Jesus standing at the right hand of God, and Stephen said, “Behold, I see the heavens opened and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God.” But they cried out in a loud voice, covered their ears, and rushed upon him together. They threw him out of the city, and began to stone him. The witnesses laid down their cloaks at the feet of a young man named Saul.

“Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me. And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me.

Father, they are your gift to me.

I wish that where I am they also may be with me, that they may see my glory that you gave me, because you loved me before the foundation of the world.

Righteous Father, the world also does not know you, but I know you, and they know that you sent me.

I made known to them your name and I will make it known, that the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in them.”

THE NICENE CREED

A CARING FAMILY

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JAY



Maybe you read my last few articles and wonder, “What—concretely—do you mean?” Or maybe like me you don’t always read things from our church. So, these past two articles, I desired to take a deep dive into why we are a parish; how we can be engaged personally; and now, what this looks like in practice.

I am fascinated by the *bitmoji*. We can flesh out our favorite characteristics of ourselves, then do fun things as we connect to others. Such as when I had the flu, and texted our business manager to tell her I was sick...




...and her response was...



Our humanity is sick and in need of a divine doctor to heal us daily of the virus and flu bugs that bite us, and which we allow to infect us. So, what should our parish look like? A field hospital where those who are healthy care for the sick, and those of us who are sick feel cared for by the healthy. Some days we are the sick ones. Some days we are the healthy ones.

So, will you help me imagine a Catholic Parish Family that is just that: a family that cares for its “sick.” Clergy, staff, council & ministry leaders, all registered members, and everyone in our neighborhood are family because we are created in the image of God. On a much smaller scale we participate in this image when we mirror God’s creative work... even sending “bitimoji care” for a sick member. Only one catch—you don’t have to be an M.D. You just need to let Jesus love you.

It helps, I guess, to have a heartbeat and curiosity for the truth, and a desire for authentic freedom. 

COMING SOON

We have reached the final few verses of the *Book of Revelation*. These verses echo many of the themes developed throughout the book as a whole. They also build up to the nuptial crescendo that closes out the book.

Jesus promises to give us recompense according to our deeds. Despite what the Protestant Reformers may like to think, this is a clear indication that our actions do affect our salvation. Our actions in time matter in eternity. How we conduct ourselves throughout the tribulations of life is incredibly important. It is the difference between being granted to eat from the tree of life (see 2:7) and being spewed out of Jesus' mouth (see 3:16).

Our actions determine if we are counted among the blessed who have washed their robes in the blood of the Lamb. This beatitude ("Blessed are...") is the final of the seven beatitudes found throughout the book (1:3, 14:13, 16:15, 19:9, 20:6, 22:7, and 22:14). The one that will sound most familiar to us is the fourth beatitude: "Blessed are those who are called to the marriage supper of the lamb" (19:9). The Bible begins with a marriage in the Garden of Eden, and it ends with a marriage in the New Creation.

The Spirit and the Bride say, "Come." The Bride of the Lamb was earlier described as the Heavenly Jerusalem descending from the sky. This Bride is not simply a city, but is all the People of God who live in the Heavenly Jerusalem. As the People of God united with Christ the Bridegroom, we become the Bride of the Lamb. We call the Mass the marriage supper of the Lamb, and in Holy Communion we consummate our marriage with our Creator. We receive his Body into our own bodies and become one flesh with God-in-flesh. Holy Communion is no small matter.

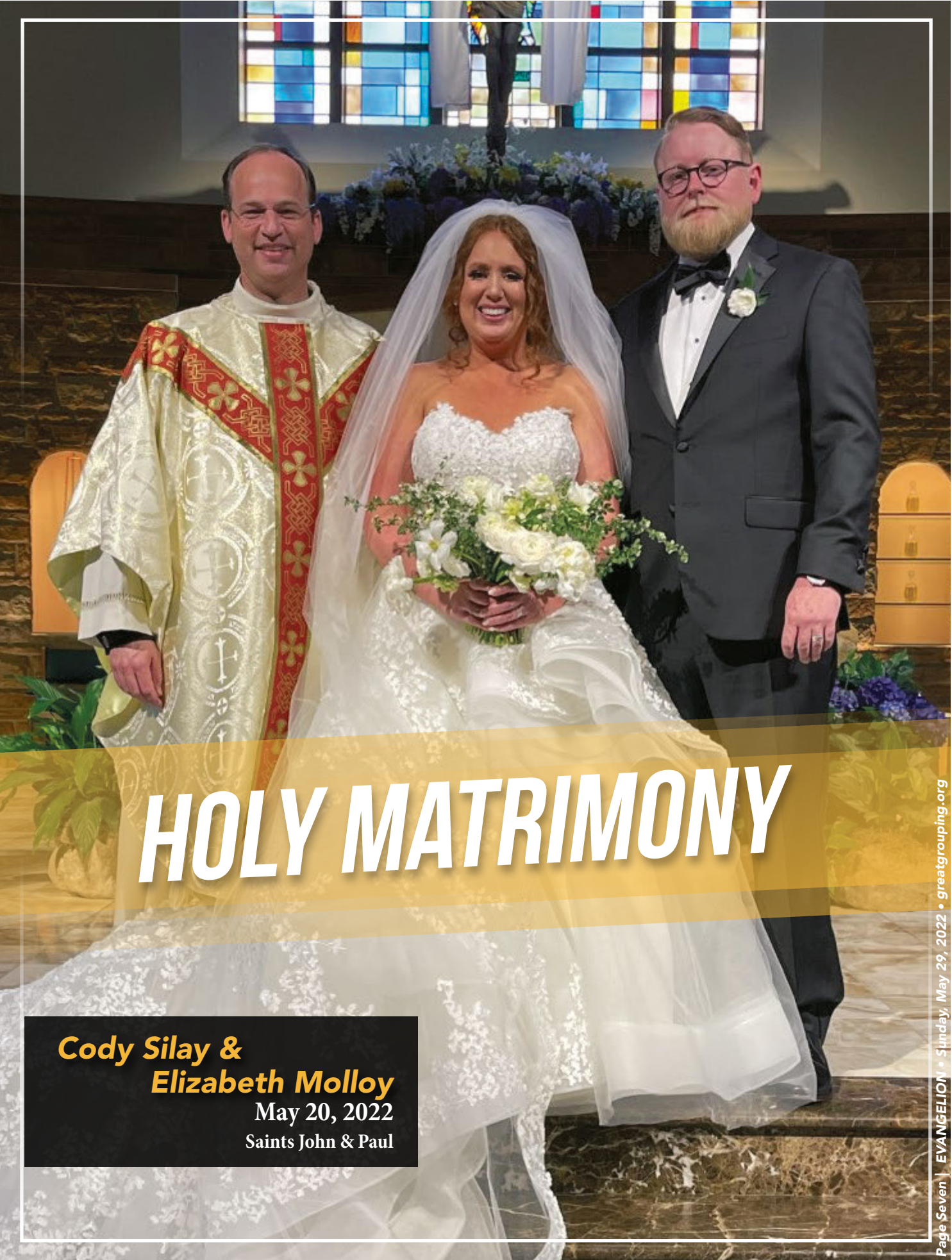
Jesus begins and ends this reading with the promise, "I am coming soon." He could be referring to his final coming since "with the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day" (2 Peter 3:8). But in context it seems more likely that he is referring to the marriage supper, the Mass, where Jesus is the fruit from the tree of life and the gift of life-giving water. Jesus may be coming soon in the white clouds of heaven, but he certainly is coming soon in the white wheat of the Eucharist.

Amen! Come, Lord Jesus!

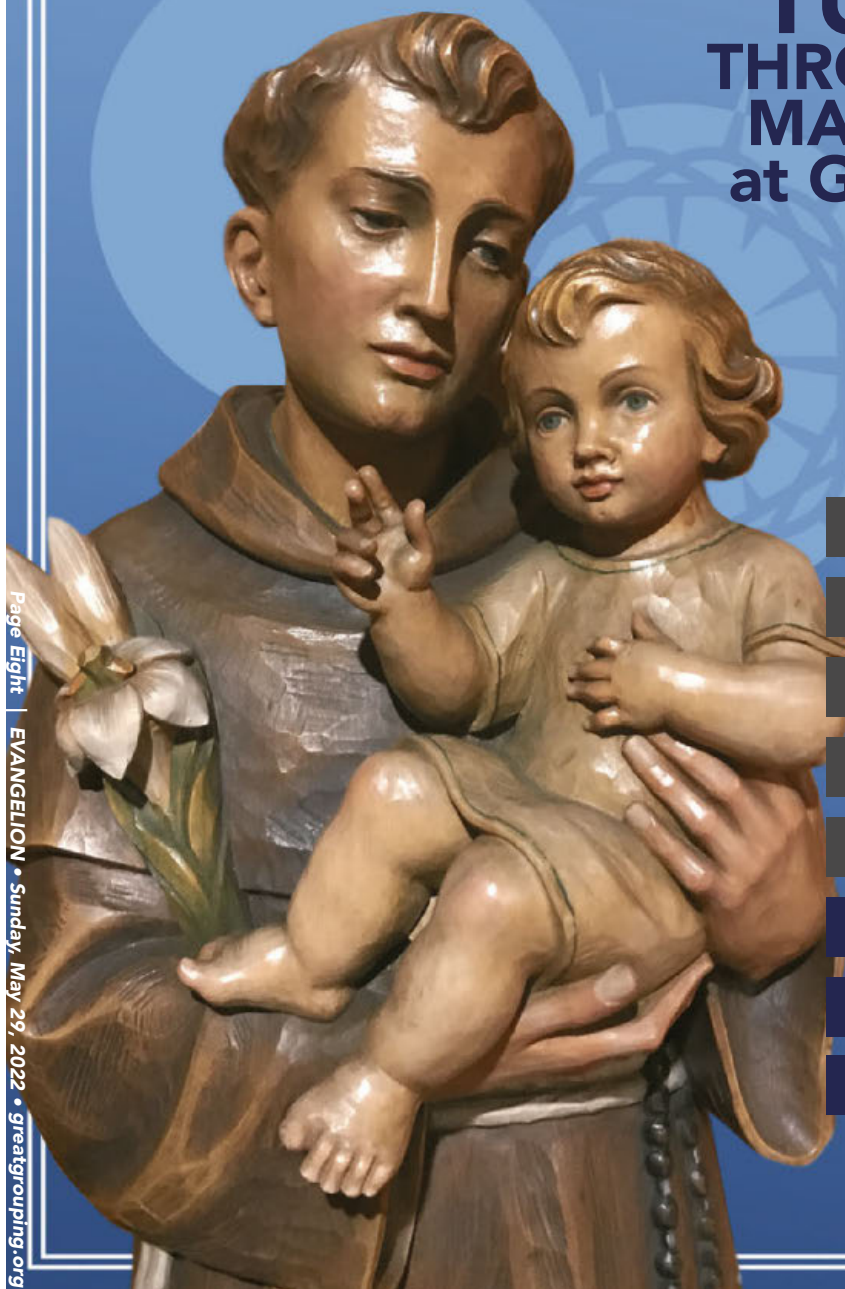

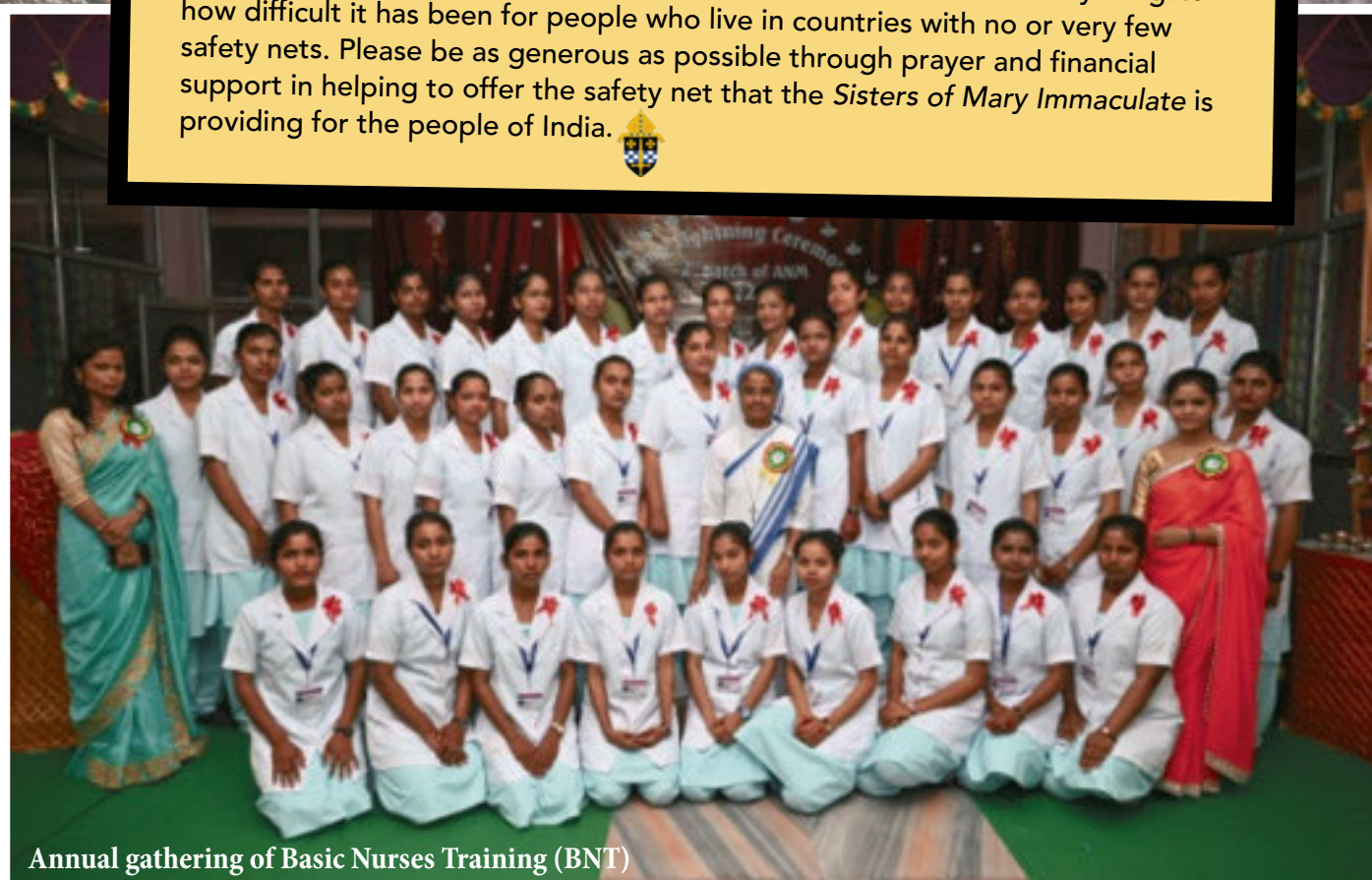
MISSIONARY COOPERATION SUNDAY—JUNE 4-5

One of the ways the Roman Catholic Church is deeply inspirational is through her missionary work. For millennia, the Church has sent forth innumerable Catholic missionaries to bring relief to the poor. We serve women, children, and men of all races and religions. The Church pursues the poor and serves them because poverty is painful. There is no other litmus test.

This year, **Missionary Cooperation Sunday is the weekend of June 4-5.** As with the past couple of years, because of restrictions we will not host a missionary but instead will hear a homily letter written by a missionary.

Our parish this year is supporting the *Sisters of Mary Immaculate* for their mission in India. The aim of their community is the holistic development of family, the spiritual, moral, social, and material welfare. They do this mainly through their village apostolate and home visitation programs. They go into the villages, stay with the people, visit their homes, and meet them in their own life situations. They are consequently then able to help transform these families through, for example, *Basic Nursing Training* program. Their sisters are engaged in the ministry of fighting against the modern slavery of human trafficking. They are constantly on the move, visiting villages, schools, and parishes; organizing awareness programs; and finding ways to keep the women and girls safe.

Realizing that it has been a difficult few years for all of us, we can only imagine how difficult it has been for people who live in countries with no or very few safety nets. Please be as generous as possible through prayer and financial support in helping to offer the safety net that the *Sisters of Mary Immaculate* is providing for the people of India.

As Catholics, we believe that Christ becomes truly present within the Blessed Sacrament. As promised by Him, His Presence is abiding, not something that vanishes at the conclusion of Mass. During Eucharistic Adoration, we can sit silently in His Presence and open ourselves to His Graces. Adoration available at Our Lady of Peace, Monday-Thursday 8AM-8PM and perpetually at Saints John & Paul, Sunday-Friday.
