## FIRST READING—Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven staying in Jerusalem. At this sound, they gathered in a large crowd, but they were confused because each one heard them speaking in his own language. They were astounded, and in amazement they asked, "Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language? We are Parthians, Medes, and Elamites, inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the districts of Libya near Cyrene, as well as travelers from Rome, both Jews and converts to Judaism, Cretans and Arabs, yet we hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God."

## SECOND READING—Romans 8:8-17

Brothers and sisters:

Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh; on the contrary, you are in the spirit, if only the Spirit of God dwells in you. Whoever does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the spirit is alive because of righteousness. If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, the one who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also, through his Spirit that dwells in you. Consequently, brothers and sisters, we are not debtors to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh, you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live.





## SECOND READING—Romans 8:8-17

For those who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you received a Spirit of adoption, through whom we cry, "Abba, Father!" The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

## GOSPEL-John 14:15-16, 23b-26

Jesus said to his disciples:

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always.

"Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him. Those who do not love me do not keep my words; yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me.

"I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you."

## THE NICENE CREED

On Saturday, May 28, 2022 Bishop Zubik issued a decree, effective July 1, 2022, declaring the *Extinctive Union* of the parishes of Good Samaritan, Saint John the Baptist, Saints John & Paul, and Our Lady of Peace, into the parish of *SAINT LUKE the EVANGELIST!* 

What a blessing to finally know our new parish name, and to be able to move forward united under the banner of the author of the *Gospel of Luke* and *Acts of the Apostles*. The Bishop's letter reads:

"This has not been a simple task. Jesus never promised that it would be easy to carry his message of love and mercy to others. He was clear that sacrifice would be necessary. However, you are positioning your new parish for more effective ministry by tending to evangelization and mission, sharing resources, and allowing your clergy to focus on the spiritual work for which they were ordained. With your faith in Jesus and empowered by the Holy Spirit, I invite you to warmly welcome and serve each other as you become one parish family."

As we move closer to July 1, there will be much more information and many opportunities to learn about our new parish community and our patron saint. For now, see below a brief explanation of our parish logo and the meanings behind it.

The four Gospel authors are traditionally represented by a different winged figure each: Matthew by a man, Mark by a lion, John by an eagle, and Luke by an ox. In addition to its inherent strength, nobility, and heart, THE OX was the apex sacrifice offered to God in the Old Testament. Luke's Gospel begins with the duties of Zechariah in the temple... representing Christ's sacrifice as well as his priesthood. The ox signifies that Christians should be prepared to sacrifice themselves in following Jesus. The ox is WINGED because Christ commanded us to spread the Good News of the Gospel to the ends of the earth. Since Luke's strength, courage, and power come from Jesus, He is here in the CIRCLE that represents the Eucharist, as well as Luke's saintly halo. Finally, the SHIELD of Faith represents the Armor of God, our protection.

## IFEINTHE SPIRIT

In this Pentecost Sunday, the Spirit is contrasting life lived in the Spirit with life lived in the flesh. To be fair, living in the Spirit cannot mean giving up your bodily life just like living according the flesh cannot mean giving up your spirit. Rather, this dynamic speaks to where our priorities are and what results from those priorities.

Life in the Spirit is a life that embraces God's Spirit living within. The Spirit dwells in you, and Christ dwells in you, by virtue of the sacraments. This indwelling of divinity is what led St. Catherine of Sienna to claim that you can draw closer to the Lord through introspection. For a believer, God is not something out there to be found. Rather, he is someone to be discovered living within me. Recognizing this should change the way I live because whatever I do, God does with me, and wherever I go, God goes with me. It should also change my prayer because I am not trying to get God's attention or trick him into hearing me. Rather, prayer becomes the realization that the Lord lives within and is always paying attention to me even when I forget about him.

Life in the Spirit is a life that is not enslaved to bodily passions and desires. If the Spirit of the one who raised Jesus from the dead lives in you, then your body already contains resurrection power! You have the seed of the resurrection within you already.

We are not debtors to the flesh. We do not owe our allegiance or indulgence to any of our bodily desires and urges. Instead, we owe our allegiance to the Lord and Giver of Life who lives within us and will also give life to our mortal bodies after they have died.

Life in the Spirit is a life lived as children of God. Notice that the Spirit does not simply call us metaphorical children of an impersonal god. We can call God "Abba, Father," an intimate term of endearment. The eternal Creator of all that exists is my Daddy. God the Father is my Father. God the Son is my brother, which is a simpler way of saying we are "joint heirs with Christ." When my earthly dad eventually dies, I will be a joint heir of his estate along with my older sister and my younger brother. "Joint heirs" is a legal term for siblings. Jesus Christ is legally my brother. God the Holy Spirit is the one who leads us, bears witness to our divine adoption, and in fact brings about that adoption. He is the "Spirit of adoption" that makes it official, and living by the Spirit means embracing that reality.

This week, the Spirit is inspiring us—filling us with spirit—with some bold truths. He lives inside of us. He can transform our hearts as well as our physical bodies. He makes us actual, legal children of God. Is it any wonder the Apostles were so excited to share this good news? The wonder instead is why we often do not share it ourselves.

ow many times have you heard something like this: If you want to hear God's voice, you have to find silence in your life.

I've heard that phrase in homilies since I was a grade school student, but it was never really explained. Only recently in adulthood have I found a practical way to sit in silent prayer. What works best for me is a type of prayer called *Lectio Divina*.

The process is simple: Open your Bible to a small section of text—four or five sentences or so. Read the scripture two times to see what word or phrase stands out to you.

Once you pick a word or phrase that stands out to you, take a few minutes to ponder what that word or phrase means to you. Exhaust your mind of any thought that might be associated with what stands out to you.

Then, clear your mind with some deep breathing. Ask the Holy Spirit to enter your mind and heart. Listen for any thoughts that come to mind which sound peaceful, encouraging, or challenging. If a thought comes to mind that is not from you, that might be God.


