Jesus said to his disciples:

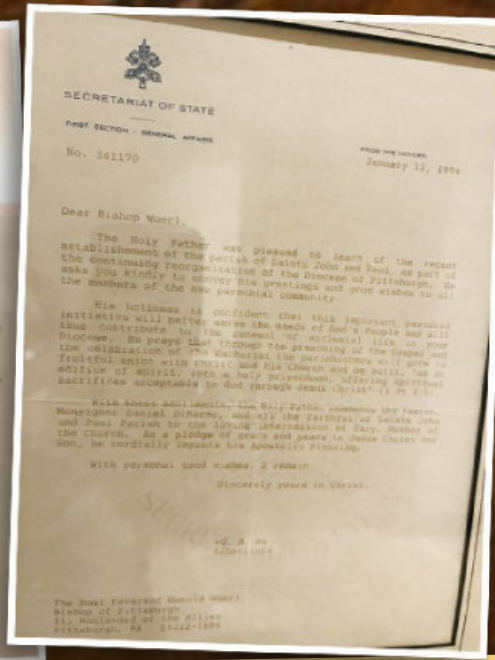

A MESSAGE
FROM FATHER JAY



The next two weekends (June 18/19 and June 25/26), we will be hosting Celebration Masses to thank the Lord for memories He has given us to cherish in each of our grouping's four parishes. For me, it is always a challenge to receive and appreciate compliments personally, but when it is for someone else or the work of Jesus, a lot comes to mind. Maybe you are the same way...

In 1994, both **Good Samaritan** and **Saints John & Paul** were formed as official parishes. I am blown away by the enthusiasm of the stories of our people who remember those days! I hear of the Spectra Office Building and turning work space into worship space, turning a breakout room into a sacristy, and the leadership of Father Dan (now Cardinal Daniel DiNardo). I hear of the heart-wrenching challenges of Father Sam Esposito in Ambridge to bring together five neighboring ethnic Catholic churches. What I hear as I celebrate the Sacred Liturgy is a strong response of, "And with your Spirit." I am inspired by our communities being willing to take on the risk of starting a new parish. Perhaps these steps were not planned by our people but rather by the Church leadership, but looking back I am grateful to our clergy team and parishioners for carrying on the Catholic way.

The worship of God in Jesus is the center and wellspring of our life! Traditions like the breaking of the Paschal candle at Good Friday Tenebrae Mass at Saints John & Paul, or 90 years of the Saint Anthony Novena in Ambridge, show the personal way that the Holy Spirit is inspiring us to proceed forward.

When you add up what Our Lord did in just these two communities over the years, it would take an eternity to relish them, though heaven really sees their ultimate effects in salvation history. Saints John & Paul, pray for us! Saint Luke the Evangelist, pray for us!

UNFATHOMABLE LOVE

This is sort of an odd reading for Trinity Sunday. Besides the perfunctory observation that each of the three Persons of the Trinity is mentioned, there is not much about it that is obviously trinitarian. Perhaps, though, it is better to say that it is not obviously trinitarian *on the surface*. Once we dig a bit below the surface, we can see that the Spirit presents us with a rather profound reflection on the Holy Trinity.

The Spirit begins by reminding us that we are at peace with God who is Trinity thanks to Jesus. That is "this grace in which we stand." It is the grace, the freely-given and unearned fact that God has overcome and continues to overcome the rebellion within my own heart. God has every right to demand our submission by the very fact that he is God, and yet he does not force himself upon us. Rather, as St. Paul says, "we have been justified by faith." By its very nature, faith is a free act. Faith is always proposed but never imposed. It invites but never demands. Faith in Jesus Christ, which is at once personal acceptance of him and actively living as he commands, makes us right with God. It justifies us. Justification is not just a legal acquittal from our sins. It is also the grace of God renewing our inner selves, "this grace in which we stand."

This grace of justification, the gift of redemption, is a pure act of love.

Nothing compelled God to redeem us or even to keep us in existence after we rebelled (over, and over, and over...), other than the fact that God loves us and wants us. God is love (see *1 John 4:8*). Love is the inner dynamic of the Trinity, where the Father loves the Son perfectly, and the Son loves the Father perfectly, and that love itself is an actual Person, the Holy Spirit. But love is also the outer dynamic of the Trinity. God loves his creation, especially the crown of his creation: you and me. Even when we deny him, defame him, or fail to defend him, he will not stop loving us. His is not a fair-weather love; it is a long suffering love that boasts of afflictions which produce endurance and proven character and hope that does not disappoint. The Trinity's proven character is love, and today he spells out the pathway for a mere human such as myself to hope to achieve the proven character of God, if I am willing to follow it.

The Holy Trinity is not just an interesting theological concept. The nature of the Godhead, the heart of who he is, is intimately related to our own redeemed natures and identities. We are children of this God, tabernacles in which he dwells. When we are at our best by responding to his grace, we are living embodiments of divine love. Through our own longsuffering we can participate in that unfathomable love that is the Holy Trinity.

FELLOWSHIP MINISTRY

About the same time Our Lady of Peace was founded in Conway, an organization called the *Apostolate Committee* was also established there, along with many other groups and ministries that helped give Our Lady of Peace a beautiful and welcoming atmosphere that continued throughout the life of this church. I'm very saddened by the closing of this great church but also excited to share with you information about a ministry we hope to bring forward and expand to our new church community of Saint Luke the Evangelist.

The *Apostolate Committee* brought friendship, fellowship, and community to our parish. Over the years we worked together and formed friendships that still exist to this day. Since we are now a new church family with a new name, we wanted to change the name of our committee to fit with the many ideas and new growth we hope to bring to Saint Luke's. After careful thought from all the members of this committee, we decided to call this new endeavor the *Fellowship Ministry*. It wasn't hard finding a new name to describe exactly what we are about, but I would like to share with you what being a member of this ministry means.

The *Fellowship Ministry* is dedicated to promoting the principals of friendship, compassion, understanding, and unconditional acceptance, fulfilling this by means of humanitarian, spiritual, and social needs working together to build a stronger community. In short, some of the things we do and are doing are: we sponsor a dinner/show that brings the community together; we sponsor bus trips and international trips so people can travel to places without feeling alone or wishing they could see places that they don't want to travel alone to; we ask for, then donate homemade lap afghans/afghans to give to shut-ins, the very sick, and people in nursing homes, the Veteran's Home, and to people who live alone to let them know they are thought of and prayed for; we sponsor the traveling Madonna and Child statue that visits homes and allows people to welcome into their home a blessed representation of Mary with her son Jesus, gathering intentions left in the baskets by the statue when she is returned to the church so we can bring these intentions to Holy Shrines throughout the world to place them on the altars there.

We are not a structured group in that our meetings always include wine and snacks, and we informally talk about plans and how we can serve the Church by bringing together people who serve God by serving one another. Our main mission is not to raise a lot of money, but to bring the love of Jesus to all by thoughtful deeds and actions.

If you would like to see what this ministry is all about, we will have a **potluck snacks and wine picnic** on **Wednesday, August 3 at the Saints John & Paul pavilion starting at 6:00 PM**. My daughters and I have been benefitting from the Saints John & Paul nursery since we moved to Pittsburgh in 2018. Back then I was a new mom with a one-year-old, and I was excited and grateful to discover that the nursery was open during the *SSJP MOMS Group* meetings that I was planning to attend on Wednesday mornings. Although I was a little nervous to leave her for the first time, I was immediately comfortable with and reassured by the wonderful women working in the nursery (truly, over the years, they have all been so amazing and kind). With my daughter in the nursery, I found that I was able to better focus on meaningful, enriching and deep discussions with other Catholic moms, all while knowing that my daughter was being well taken care of in a warm, Catholic environment just a few doors away. Not to mention I grew to greatly appreciate those few moments each week that I would have my hands free to drink a rare hot cup of coffee!

Since then, I have been blessed with another daughter, and as my older one moved from the nursery to preschool, my younger daughter has also benefitted from the nursery. As I stay at home full-time with my girls, I was slightly unsure how each one would handle being in the nursery away from me. I grew to realize, though, that another one of the many blessings of the nursery is that it gives them an opportunity to be independent and to become comfortable with other care-takers, while socializing with other sweet children for just a couple hours each week. We like to call it the little one's "nursery school" (she brings her backpack and everything in an attempt to be just like her older sister!).

Although I am not the official representative of the *MOMS Group*, I can confidently say that all the moms in my group are incredibly grateful for the presence of the nursery at Saints John & Paul, and for the incredible ladies who work there. Yes, they nurture our children, but they also help to give us adults an opportunity to nurture our faith, and that is a priceless gift.
