Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

FIRST READING—Genesis 18:1-10a

The LORD appeared to Abraham by the terebinth of Mamre, as he sat in the entrance of his tent, while the day was growing hot. Looking up, Abraham saw three men standing nearby. When he saw them, he ran from the entrance of the tent to greet them; and bowing to the ground, he said: "Sir, if I may ask you this favor, please do not go on past your servant. Let some water be brought, that you may bathe your feet, and then rest yourselves under the tree. Now that you have come this close to your servant, let me bring you a little food, that you may refresh yourselves; and afterward you may go on your way." The men replied, "Very well, do as you have said."

Abraham hastened into the tent and told Sarah, "Quick, three measures of fine flour! Knead it and make rolls." He ran to the herd, picked out a tender, choice steer, and gave it to a servant, who quickly prepared it. Then Abraham got some curds and milk, as well as the steer that had been prepared, and set these before the three men; and he waited on them under the tree while they ate.

They asked Abraham, "Where is your wife Sarah?" He replied, "There in the tent."

It is he whom we proclaim, admonishing everyone and teaching everyone with all wisdom, that we may present everyone perfect in Christ.

RECIPROCAL INCIDING

his week, we linger a bit longer in the rich opening verse of St. Paul's Letter to the Colossians. Here the Spirit whispers to us about the sufferings in our lives, our union with Jesus, and our ultimate growth in holiness.

Our reading begins with a very strange statement: "In my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the affiliations of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church." What could possibly be lacking in Jesus' Passion that made salvation available to every person who has and ever will live? The only thing lacking is my willful union with it. The Catechism refers to this verse when it speaks of how we can deliberately enter into the divine plan (CCC 307), that Jesus desires to associate us with his redeeming sacrifice (CCC 618), and that our own sufferings can take on a redemptive quality in union with Jesus (CCC 1508). No wonder Paul rejoices in his sufferings! It is not a masochistic joy but an altruistic and a spiritual rejoicing at being more closely united with Jesus for the spiritual benefit of others. That same experience is available to each one of us.

Paul speaks of the "mystery hidden from ages and from generations past" that now "has been manifested to his holy ones." So what is the mystery? "It is Christ in you, the hope for glory." Why can we hope for glory in heaven? Because Christ, the risen and glorified one, already lives within us. We are living tabernacles.




It is Jesus living within us that gives redemptive value to our sufferings. Throughout many of his letters, Paul describes what can be called a reciprocal indwelling. We are in Christ as members of his Body who have been incorporated (literally "made part of a body") by Baptism, and Christ is in us through the sacraments, most especially the Eucharist, as the animating and spiritualizing principle that is our hope for glory.

This reading contains a feeling of a spiritual manifest destiny, a spiritual growth and maturity that simply must happen in each of us. Paul speaks of his God-given task to "bring to completion for you the word of God" so "that we may present everyone perfect in Christ." This week, the Spirit seems to be showing us that part of that completion and perfection is to embrace the sufferings that come our way, both large and small, and to unite those with Jesus' Cross. A wise priest once told me, "To every cross that comes your way, press your lips." Offering it up gives meaning to an experience that is otherwise meaningless and turns what may appear to be an unanswered prayer into intimate union with the Lord.

What crosses are you carrying now? And are you willing to fill up what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ?



looked in my sideview mirror to notice my left rear tire backing into a creek. Just before I put my car into drive, I saw the bank of the stone road collapse into the creek... along with my car. Uh oh. I was stuck.

I was supposed to be getting more supplies for the client we were serving in Appalachia during our mission trip. But suddenly, I was not in the position to assist others. I needed assistance.

The teens rushed to my car to help out in any way they could. Kelsey, Kenzie, and Evee offered moral support while Drew, Johnathan and Javier got to work jacking up the car, building ramps and digging out the wheels. The client we were serving got on her landline to call the neighbors for help. The car had to get out if we were going to have enough spots for the teens to make it back to Pittsburgh from Kentucky.

In what seemed to be an isolated place, neighbors appeared out of nowhere to offer ideas, a tractor for towing, and able-bodied people to push or pull the car out of the creek.

As the small community gathered to help me, I felt a great deal of unworthiness. I felt as though this was MY mistake, and the only person who should be inconvenienced was ME. But everyone who helped me had a different perspective. For them, it was an opportunity to love me with their talents, sweat and effort. They showed me the love of God—a love that is sacrificial, selfless, and awarded despite any feeling of unworthiness.

Eventually, Javier found some nearby pallets I could drive over to get to a clearing. My car had some considerable damage, but was able to make it back home safely.

Next year, when this publication advertises mission trips, consider joining us. You won't regret it. And I might need more help.

CLUB 2022 SCHOLARSHIP

The Saints John & Paul Men's Club started awarding scholarships to graduating high school seniors almost 20 years ago. The first year we awarded two \$500 scholarships, and through the generous support of Parish Fish Frys and Men's Club Raffles, we have grown to over \$10,000 in annual awards. Over the years the recipients of the scholarships have dedicated over 40,000 hours of volunteer service to the parish and the community. We are all grateful for their service, and the Men's Club is pleased to recognize their achievements. This year, in preparation for the merger into Saint Luke the Evangelist Parish, we opened up the applications to all seniors within the four parishes that comprised our grouping.

The Scholarship is based on a number of factors, but first and foremost is the candidates' volunteer activities in the parish and the community. WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF A MASS INTENTION?

Many people schedule Masses to honor the memory of a loved one who has passed away to remember them on a day such as their birthday, anniversary, or other special days. Praying for those deceased is a great act of mercy. Masses can also be offered for the spiritual and physical well-being of individuals. Remembering the Souls in Purgatory with a Mass is a beautiful gift of prayer.

Rarely do we think of having a Mass offered for a celebration! Is there a better way to show our gratitude to God? Masses can be said for birthdays, anniversaries, in celebration of the reception of sacraments, or for prayers that have been answered.

SCHEDULING MASS INTENTIONS

Beginning August 1, due to the overwhelming response of parishioners requesting Mass intentions, we are initiating the following guidelines for Masses scheduled at both Saints John & Paul Church and Good Samaritan Church:

- Parishioners may schedule one weekend Mass (Saturday or Sunday) per quarter (4 per year)
- Parishioners may schedule two weekday Masses per month

On the first of every month, the Mass intention book will be opened for the same month in 2023. For example, on August 1, 2022 the Mass intentions will be available for August 2023. All prior months can be scheduled based on availability.

Please note: All masses scheduled online are pending and will be approved by the Parish office. Once the requests are approved, you will receive a confirmation email. We regret that we may need to decline requests that do not meet the above criteria. Any questions, please contact the office. You are always welcome to call or stop in the office and request a Mass. 
